ORDER OF THE BOARD

TO: Aaron Andreas Hunter 1035 Clinton Rd. Sacramento, CA 95825

During open meeting held in Austin, Texas, on Tuesday, May 8, 2012, the Eligibility and Disciplinary Committee (hereinafter "Committee") heard the above-styled case, based on the failure of the Respondent to appear as required by 22 Tex. ADMIN. CODE Ch. 213.

The Committee of the Texas Board of Nursing finds that notice of the facts or conduct alleged to warrant disciplinary action has been provided to Respondent in accordance with Texas Government Code § 2001.054(c) and Respondent has been given an opportunity to show compliance with all the requirements of the Nursing Practice Act, Chapter 301 of the Texas Occupations Code, for retention of Respondent's license to practice vocational nursing in the State of Texas.

The Committee finds that the Formal Charges were properly initiated and filed in accordance with section 301.458, Texas Occupations Code.

The Committee finds that after proper and timely Notice regarding the violations alleged in the Formal Charges was given to Respondent in this matter, Respondent has failed to appear in accordance with 22 Tex. ADMIN. CODE Ch. 213.

The Committee finds that the Board is authorized to enter a default order pursuant to Texas Government Code § 2001.056.

The Eligibility and Disciplinary Committee, after review and due consideration, adopts the



proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law as stated in the Formal Charges which are attached hereto and incorporated by reference for all purposes and the Staff's recommended sanction of revocation by default. This Order will be properly served on all parties and all parties will be given an opportunity to file a motion for rehearing [22 Tex. ADMIN.CODE § 213.16(j)]. All parties have a right to judicial review of this Order.

All proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law filed by any party not specifically adopted herein are hereby denied.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Permanent Certificate Number 187807, previously issued to AARON ANDREAS HUNTER, to practice vocational nursing in the State of Texas be, and the same is hereby, REVOKED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Order SHALL be applicable to Respondent's nurse licensure compact privileges, if any, to practice vocational nursing in the State of Texas.

Said license expired on December 31, 2007 and has not been renewed. 26 Pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 2875, the Board may 3. 2.7 discipline any licensed vocational nurse for any reason provided in Article 3 of the Vocational

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Nursing Practice Act.

- 4. Pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 118(b), the expiration of a license shall not deprive the Board of jurisdiction to proceed with a disciplinary action during the period within which the license may be renewed, restored, reissued, or reinstated. Under Business and Professions Code section 2892.1, the Board may renew an expired license at any time within four years after the expiration.
- 5. Respondent has subjected his license to discipline under Business and Professions Code section 2878(f), in that Respondent was convicted of crimes substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a vocational nurse, as described in Accusation No. VN-2005-2488, a copy of which is attached as Exhibit "1" and incorporated by reference.
- 6. Respondent has subjected his license to discipline under Business and Professions Code section 2878(j), in that Respondent committed acts involving dishonesty, which are substantially related to the duties and functions of the licensee, as described in Accusation No. VN-2005-2488.

DETERMINATION OF ISSUES

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact, Respondent has subjected his license to discipline under Business and Professions Code sections 2878(f) and 2878(j).

LOCATION OF RECORD

The record on which this Default Decision is based is located at the Sacramento office of the Board of Vocational Nursing and Psychiatric Technicians.

ORDER

WHEREFORE, the Board of Vocational Nursing and Psychiatric Technicians makes the following order:

Vocational Nurse License Number VN 219130 authorizing Respondent to act as a vocational nurse is hereby revoked.

Respondent shall have the right to petition for reinstatement of the aforesaid license pursuant to the provision of section 2878.7(a)(1) of the Business and Professions Code.

Respondent shall not be deprived of making any further showing by way of mitigation; however, such showing must be made directly to the Board of Vocational Nursing and

Psychiatric Technicians, 2535 Capitol Oaks Drive, Suite 205, Sacramento, California, 95833 prior to the effective date of this Decision. This Default Decision shall become effective on June 3, 2010. 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Complainant alleges:

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1. Teresa Bello-Jones, J.D., M.S.N., R.N. ("Complainant") brings this Accusation solely in her official capacity as the Executive Officer of the Board of Vocational Nursing and Psychiatric Technicians, Department of Consumer Affairs.

PARTIES

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License History

2. On or about February 9, 2006, the Board of Vocational Nursing and Psychiatric Technicians issued Vocational Nurse License Number VN 219130 to Aaron Andreas Hunter ("Respondent"). The license expired on December 31, 2007.

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JURISDICTION

- Technicians ("Board"), Department of Consumer Affairs, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code ("Code"), unless otherwise indicated.
- 4. Code section 2875 states, in pertinent part, that the Board may discipline the holder of a vocational nurse license for any reason provided in Article 3 (commencing with Code section 2875) of the Vocational Nursing Practice Act.
- 5. Code section 118, subdivision (b), states, in pertinent part, that the expiration of a license shall not deprive the Board of jurisdiction to proceed with a disciplinary action during the period within which the license may be renewed, restored, reissued or reinstated.

STATUTORY PROVISIONS

6. Code section 2878 states, in pertinent part:

The Board may suspend or revoke a license issued under this chapter [the Vocational Nursing Practice Act (Bus. & Prof. Code, § 2840, et seq.)] for any of the following:

- (a) Unprofessional conduct, ...
- (f) Conviction of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties of a licensed vocational nurse, in which event the record of the conviction shall be conclusive evidence of the conviction.
- (k) The commission of any act involving dishonesty, when that action is related to the duties and functions of the licensee.
- 7. Code section 2878.6 states, in pertinent part:

A plea or verdict of guilty or a conviction following a plea of nolo contendere made to a charge substantially related to the qualifications, functions and duties of a licensed vocational nurse is deemed to be a conviction within the meaning of this article. . . irrespective of a subsequent order under the provisions of Section 1203.4 of the Penal Code allowing such person to withdraw his plea of guilty . . . , or setting aside the verdict of guilty, or dismissing the accusation, information or indictment.

COST RECOVERY

8. Code section 125.3 provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the committee of the commit

the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Criminal Convictions)

- 9. Respondent has subjected his license to disciplinary action under Code section 2878, subdivision (f), in that Respondent was convicted of crimes substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a vocational nurse, as follows:
- a. On or about July 10, 2008, in the Superior Court of California, County of Sacramento, in the case entitled, *People of the State of California v. Aaron Andreas Hunter* (Super. Ct. Sacramento County, 2008, Case No. 08F03737), Respondent was convicted on his plea of nolo contendere of violating Penal Code section 459 (2nd Degree Burglary), a felony.

The circumstances of the crime are that on or about May 10, 2008, at 5:00 a.m., Respondent did unlawfully enter a commercial building occupied by B&W Liquors, with the intent to commit larceny and any felony.

b. On or about November 14, 2007, in the Superior Court of California, County of Sacramento, in the case entitled, *People of the State of California v. Aaron Andreas Hunter* (Super. Ct. Sacramento County, 2007, Case No. 07M12302), Respondent was convicted on his plea of nolo contendere of violating Penal Code section 242 (Battery), a misdemeanor.

The circumstances of the crime are that on or about November 10, 2007, Respondent did willfully and unlawfully use force and violence upon R. G.

c. On or about November 14, 2006, in the Superior Court of California, County of Sacramento, in the case entitled, *People of the State of California v. Aaron Andreas Hunter* (Super. Ct. Sacramento County, 2006, Case No. 06F07718), Respondent was convicted on his plea of nolo contendere of violating Health and Safety Code section 11352, subdivision (a) (Self-Controlled Substance, to wit: Cocaine), a misdemeanor.

The circumstances of the crime are that on or about August 30, 2006, while conducting undercover operations, Sacramento Police Department officers were contacted by Respondent at

a liquor store and Respondent approached the officers asking them if they wanted to buy \$20.00 worth of Cocaine Base.

d. On or about November 14, 2006, in the Superior Court of California, County of Sacramento, in the case entitled, People of the State of California v. Aaron Andreas Hunter (Super. Ct. Sacramento County, 2006, Case No. 06M10566), Respondent was convicted on his plea of noto contendere of violating Penal Code section 148, subdivision (a) (Resisting, Delaying, or Obstructing an Officer), a misdemeanor.

SECOND CAUSE OF DISCIPLINE

(Dishonesty)

10. Respondent has subjected his license to disciplinary action under Code section 2878, subdivision (f), in that Respondent committed acts involving dishonesty, which are substantially related to the duties and functions of the licensee, as set forth in paragraph 9, subparagraph a, above.

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Board of Vocational Nursing and Psychiatric Technicians issue a decision:

- 1. Revoking or suspending Vocational Nurse License Number VN 219130 issued to Aaron Andreas Hunter;
- 2. Ordering Aaron Andreas Hunter to pay the Board the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Code section 125.3; and,
 - 3. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
