During open meeting held in Austin, Texas, on February 14, 2012, the Eligibility and Disciplinary Committee (hereinafter "Committee") heard the above-styled case, based on the failure of the Respondent to appear as required by 22 Tex. ADMIN. CODE Ch. 213.

The Committee of the Texas Board of Nursing finds that notice of the facts or conduct alleged to warrant disciplinary action has been provided to Respondent in accordance with Texas Government Code § 2001.054(c) and Respondent has been given an opportunity to show compliance with all the requirements of the Nursing Practice Act, Chapter 301 of the Texas Occupations Code, for retention of Respondent's license to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas.

The Committee finds that the Formal Charges were properly initiated and filed in accordance with section 301.458, Texas Occupations Code.

The Committee finds that after proper and timely Notice regarding the violations alleged in the Formal Charges was given to Respondent in this matter, Respondent has failed to appear in accordance with 22 Tex. ADMIN. CODE Ch. 213.

The Committee finds that the Board is authorized to enter a default order pursuant to Texas Government Code § 2001.056.

The Eligibility and Disciplinary Committee, after review and due consideration, adopts the

proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law as stated in the Formal Charges which are attached hereto and incorporated by reference for all purposes and the Staff's recommended sanction of revocation by default. This Order will be properly served on all parties and all parties will be given an opportunity to file a motion for rehearing [22 Tex. Admin.Code § 213.16(j)]. All parties have a right to judicial review of this Order.

All proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law filed by any party not specifically adopted herein are hereby denied.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Permanent Certificate Number 636044, previously issued to BRENDA YVONNE BALLARD, to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas be, and the same is hereby, REVOKED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Order SHALL be applicable to Respondent's nurse licensure compact privileges, if any, to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas.

FORMAL CHARGES

This is a disciplinary proceeding under Section 301.452(b), Texas Occupations Code. Respondent, BRENDAY YVONNE BALLARD, is a Registered Nurse holding license number 636044, which is in Current status at the time of this pleading.

Written notice of the facts and conduct alleged to warrant adverse licensure action was sent to Respondent at Respondent's address of record and Respondent was given opportunity to show compliance with all requirements of the law for retention of the license prior to commencement of this proceeding.

CHARGE I.

During November 13, 2009 through November 24, 2009, while employed as a Registered Nurse with Icon Hospital, Humble, Texas, Respondent withdrew Hydromorphone from the Medication Dispensing System (Med-Dispense) at 7:30 and 9:03 for Patient Medical Record Number 516, which was in excess frequency/dosage of the physician's order. The physician ordered Hydromorphone every three (3) to four (4) hours as needed. Respondent's conduct was likely to injure the patient in that the administration of Hydromorphone in excess frequency and/or dosage of the physician's order could result in the patient suffering from adverse reactions.

The above action constitutes grounds for disciplinary action in accordance with Section 301.452(b)(10)&(13), Texas Occupations Code, and is a violation of 22 Tex. ADMIN. CODE §217.11(1)(C), and 22 Tex. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(1)(A),(1)(B)&(4).

CHARGE II

During November 13, 2009 through November 24, 2009, while employed as a Registered Nurse with Icon Hospital, Humble, Texas, Respondent withdrew Lorazepam, Tussionex, Hydrocodone, Hydromorphone, Morphine, and Haloperidol from the Medication Dispensing System (Med-Dispense) for Patient Medical Record Numbers 513, 516, 518, 525, 530 554, and 564, but failed to document or accurately document the administration of the medication in the patients' Medication Administration Record, and/or Nurse's Notes as follows:

Respondent's conduct was likely to injure the patients in that subsequent care givers would rely on her documentation to further medicate the patient which could result in an overdose.

The above action constitutes grounds for disciplinary action in accordance with Section 301.452(b)(10)&(13), Texas Occupations Code, and is a violation of 22 Tex. ADMIN. CODE \$217.11(1)(A),(1)(B)&(1)(D) and 22 Tex. ADMIN. CODE \$217.12(1)(A),(1)(B)&(4).

CHARGE III

During November 13, 2009 through November 24, 2009, while employed as a Registered Nurse with Icon Hospital, Humble, Texas, Respondent withdrew Lorazepam, Tussionex, Hydrocodone, Hydromorphone, Morphine, and Haloperidol from the Medication Dispensing System (Med-Dispense) for Patient Medical Record Numbers 513, 516, 518, 525, 530 554, and 564, but failed to follow the facility's policy and procedure regarding wastage of any of the unused portions of the medications, as follows:

Respondent's conduct was likely to deceive the hospital pharmacy and place them in violation of Chapter 481 of the Texas Health and Safety Code (Controlled Substances Act).

The above action constitutes grounds for disciplinary action in accordance with Section 301.452(b)(10)&(13), Texas Occupations Code, and is a violation of 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.11(1)(A)&(1)(B)and 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(1)(A),(1)(B),(4),(10)(C)&(11)(B).

CHARGE IV

During November 13, 2009 through November 24, 2009, while employed as a Registered Nurse with Icon Hospital, Humble, Texas, Respondent misappropriated Lorazepam, Tussionex, Hydrocodone, Hydromorphone, Morphine, and Haloperidol belonging to Patient Medical Record Numbers 513, 516, 518, 525, 530 554, and 564, or failed to take precautions to prevent the misappropriation of the medications belonging to the facility and/or the patients. Respondent's conduct was likely to defraud the facility and patients of the cost of the medications.

The above action constitutes grounds for disciplinary action in accordance with Section 301.452(b)(10), Texas Occupations Code, and is a violation of 22 Tex. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(1)(A),(1)(B),(6)(G)&(8).

NOTICE IS GIVEN that staff will present evidence in support of the recommended disposition of up to, and including, revocation of Respondent's license/s to practice nursing in the State of Texas pursuant to the Nursing Practice Act, Chapter 301, Texas Occupations Code and the Board's rules, 22 Tex. Admin. Code §§ 213.27 - 213.33. Additionally, staff will seek to impose on Respondent the administrative costs of the proceeding pursuant to Section 301.461, Texas Occupations Code. The cost of proceedings shall include, but is not limited to, the cost paid by the Board to the State Office of Administrative Hearings and the Office of the Attorney General or other Board counsel for legal and investigative services, the cost of a court reporter and witnesses, reproduction of records, Board staff time, travel, and expenses. These shall be in an amount of at least one thousand two hundred dollars (\$1200.00).

NOTICE IS GIVEN that all statutes and rules cited in these Charges are incorporated as part of this pleading and can be found at the Board's website, www.bon.texas.gov.

NOTICE IS GIVEN that to the extent applicable, based on the Formal Charges, the Board will rely on Adopted Disciplinary Sanction Policies for Nurses with Substance Abuse, Misuse, Substance Dependency, or other Substance Use Disorder, for Lying and Falsification, and for Fraud, Theft and Deception, which can be found at the Board's website, www.bon.texas.gov.
