

ORDER

On this day the Texas Board of Nursing, hereinafter referred to as the Board, considered the matter of THERESA LYNN MATSON, Registered Nurse License Number 551102, hereinafter referred to as Respondent.

Information received by the Board produced evidence that Respondent may have violated Tex. Rev. Civ. Sta. ARt. 4525(a)(2)&(9)(effective 9/01/1987); Section 301.452(b)(2)&(10), Texas Occupations Code. Respondent waived representation by counsel, informal proceedings, notice and hearing, and agreed to the entry of this Order offered on May 29, 2012, by Katherine A. Thomas, MN, RN, FAAN, Executive Director.

### **FINDINGS OF FACT**

- 1. Prior to the institution of Agency proceedings, notice of the matters specified below in these Findings of Fact was served on Respondent and Respondent was given an opportunity to show compliance with all requirements of the law for retention of the license(s).
- 2. Respondent waived representation by counsel, informal proceedings, notice and hearing, and agreed to the entry of this Order.
- 3. Respondent is currently licensed to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas.
- 4. Respondent received a Baccalaureate Nursing from University Texas health Science Center, Houston, Texas, on June 20, 1997. Respondent was licensed to practice vocational nursing in the State of Texas on April 4, 1989.
- 5. Respondent's nursing employment history is unknown.

6. On or about August 18, 1988, Respondent submitted a Registration by Examination to the Board of Nurse Examiners for the State of Texas, in which she provided false, deceptive, and/or misleading information, in that she answered "No" to the question:

"Have you ever been convicted of a felony or misdemeanor other than a minor traffic violation?"

Respondent failed to disclose, that on or about June 25, 1985, Respondent pled Guilty and was convicted of DRIVING WHILE INTOXICATED, a misdemeanor offense committed on June 18, 1985, in the County Criminal Court at Law No. 11 of Harris County, under Cause No. 8376081.

- 7. In response to Finding of Fact Number Six (6) Respondent states: It was an oversight on her part for not disclosing the past charge.
- 8. On or about October 13, 2008, Respondent submitted an Online Renewal Document Registered Nurse to the Texas Board of Nursing in which she provided false, deceptive, and/or misleading information, in that she answered "No" to the question:

"Have you, within the past 24 months or since your last renewal, for any criminal offense, including those pending appeal:

- A. been convicted of a misdemeanor?
- B. been convicted of a felony?
- C. pled nolo contendere, no contest, or guilty?
- D. received deferred adjudication?
- E. been placed on community supervision or court-ordered probation, whether or not adjudicated guilty?
- F. been sentenced to serve jail or prison time? court-ordered confinement?
- G. been granted pre-trial diversion?
- H. been arrested or have any pending criminal charges?
- I. been cited or charged with any violation of the law?
- J. been subject of a court-martial; Article 15 violation; or received any form of military judgment/punishment/action?"

Respondent failed to disclose, that on or about November 14, 2007, Respondent pled Guilty and was convicted of DEADLY CONDUCT, a Class A misdemeanor offense, in the County Court of Colorado County, Texas, under Cause No. 20, 299. As a result of the conviction, Respondent was sentenced to confinement for a period of three (3) days.

9. In response to Finding of Fact Number Eight (8), Respondent states: She did renew her license online on or about October 13, 2008. At that time, she was undergoing undue stress following some diagnoses of advanced stage III breast cancer in April 2008. During the span

of treatments and in spite of doubts regarding her final prognosis and future role as a nurse, she renewed her license. She did not intend to omit information, nor make any fraudulent documentation to the Board of Nursing while renewing her license. Respondent deeply regrets any inconvenience as wells as misunderstanding, that her renewal application may have caused.

### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. Pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Sections 301.451-301.555, the Board has jurisdiction over this matter.
- 2. Notice was served in accordance with law.
- 3. The evidence received is sufficient to prove violation of TEX. REV. CIV. STA. ART. 4525(a)(2)&(9)(effective 9/01/1987); Section 301.452(b)(2)&(10), Texas Occupations Code, 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.13(15)(effective 9/01/1987); 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(6)(I).
- 4. The evidence received is sufficient cause pursuant to Section 301.452(b), Texas Occupations Code, to take disciplinary action against Registered Nurse License Number 551102, heretofore issued to THERESA LYNN MATSON, including revocation of Respondent's license(s) to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

## <u>ORDER</u>

IT IS THEREFORE AGREED and ORDERED that RESPONDENT SHALL receive the sanction of REMEDIAL EDUCATION AND A FINE, and RESPONDENT SHALL comply in all respects with the Nursing Practice Act, Texas Occupations Code §§301.001 et seq., the Rules and Regulations Relating to Nurse Education, Licensure and Practice, 22 Tex. ADMIN. CODE §211.1 et seq. and this Order.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that, while under the terms of this Order, this Order SHALL apply to any and all future licenses issued to Respondent to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that this Order SHALL be applicable

to Respondent's nurse licensure compact privileges, if any, to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that while Respondent's license(s) is/are encumbered by this Order, Respondent may not work outside the State of Texas pursuant to a nurse licensure compact privilege without the written permission of the State of Texas and the Board of Nursing in the party state where Respondent wishes to work.

### IT IS FURTHER AGREED that:

- (1) RESPONDENT SHALL pay a monetary fine in the amount of five hundred dollars (\$500.00). RESPONDENT SHALL pay this fine forty-five (45) days of entry of this Order. Payment is to be made directly to the Texas Board of Nursing in the form of cashier's check or U.S. money order. Partial payments will not be accepted.
- (2) RESPONDENT SHALL, within one (1) year of entry of this Order, successfully complete a course in Texas nursing jurisprudence and ethics. RESPONDENT SHALL obtain Board approval of the course prior to enrollment only if the course is not being offered by a pre-approved provider. Home study courses and video programs will not be approved. In order for the course to be approved, the target audience shall include nurses. It shall be a minimum of six (6) hours in length. The course's content shall include the Nursing Practice Act, standards of practice, documentation of care, principles of nursing ethics, confidentiality, professional boundaries, and the Board's Disciplinary Sanction Policies regarding: Sexual Misconduct; Fraud, Theft and Deception; Nurses with Substance Abuse, Misuse, Substance Dependency, or other Substance Use Disorder; and Lying and Falsification. Courses focusing on malpractice issues will not be accepted. RESPONDENT SHALL CAUSE the sponsoring institution to submit a Verification of Course Completion form, provided by the Board, to the Office of the Board to verify RESPONDENT'S

successful completion of the course. This course shall be taken in addition to any other courses stipulated in this Order, if any, and in addition to any continuing education requirements the Board has for relicensure. IT IS FURTHER AGREED, that upon full compliance with the terms of this Order, all encumbrances will be removed from RESPONDENT'S license(s) to practice nursing in the State of Texas and RESPONDENT shall be eligible for nurse licensure compact privileges, if any.
