During open meeting held in Austin, Texas, on Tuesday, February 12, 2013, the Texas Board of Nursing Eligibility and Disciplinary Committee (hereinafter "Committee") heard the above-styled case, based on the failure of the Respondent to appear as required by 22 Tex. ADMIN. CODE Ch. 213.

The Committee finds that notice of the facts or conduct alleged to warrant disciplinary action has been provided to Respondent in accordance with Texas Government Code § 2001.054(c) and Respondent has been given an opportunity to show compliance with all the requirements of the Nursing Practice Act, Chapter 301 of the Texas Occupations Code, for retention of Respondent's license(s) to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

The Committee finds that the Formal Charges were properly initiated and filed in accordance with section 301.458, Texas Occupations Code.

The Committee finds that after proper and timely Notice regarding the violations alleged in the Formal Charges was given to Respondent in this matter, Respondent has failed to appear in accordance with 22 Tex. ADMIN. CODE Ch. 213.

The Committee finds that the Board is authorized to enter a default order pursuant to Texas Government Code § 2001.056.

The Committee, after review and due consideration, adopts the proposed findings of fact and

conclusions of law as stated in the Formal Charges which are attached hereto and incorporated by

reference for all purposes and the Staff's recommended sanction of revocation by default. This Order

will be properly served on all parties and all parties will be given an opportunity to file a motion for

rehearing [22 TEX. ADMIN.CODE § 213.16(j)]. All parties have a right to judicial review of this

Order.

All proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law filed by any party not specifically

adopted herein are hereby denied.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that ,Permanent Vocational Nurse License Number

229144, previously issued to HEATH PATRICK OBRIEN, to practice nursing in the State of Texas

be, and the same is/are hereby, REVOKED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Order SHALL be applicable to Respondent's nurse

licensure compact privileges, if any, to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

This is a disciplinary proceeding under Section 301.452(b), Texas Occupations Code. Respondent, HEATH PATRICK OBRIEN, is a Vocational Nurse holding License Number 229144, which is in current status at the time of this pleading.

Written notice of the facts and conduct alleged to warrant adverse licensure action was sent to Respondent at Respondent's address of record and Respondent was given opportunity to show compliance with all requirements of the law for retention of the license prior to commencement of this proceeding.

CHARGE I.

On or about January 20, 2012, while employed as a Licensed Vocational Nurse with Texas PRN Staffing, Odessa, Texas, and assigned to Odessa Regional Medical Center, Odessa, Texas, Respondent withdrew Morphine from the medication dispensing system for patients without a valid physicians' order, as follows:

Respondent's conduct was likely to deceive the hospital pharmacy and placed them in violation of Chapter 481 of the Texas Health and Safety Code (Controlled Substances Act).

The above action constitutes grounds for disciplinary action in accordance with Section 301.452(b)(10)&(13), Texas Occupations Code, and is a violation of 22 Tex. ADMIN. CODE §217.11(1)(A),(B)&(D), and 22 Tex. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(1)(A)&(B),(4),(10)(C)&(11)(B).

CHARGE IV.

On or about January 20, 2012, through February 3, 2012, while employed as a Licensed Vocational Nurse with Texas PRN Staffing, Odessa, Texas, and assigned to Odessa Regional Medical Center, Odessa, Texas, Respondent misappropriated Morphine, Lorazepam, Meperidine, and Hydromorphone belonging to the facility or patients thereof or failed to take precautions to prevent such misappropriation. Respondent's conduct was likely to defraud the facility and patients of the cost of the medications.

The above action constitutes grounds for disciplinary action in accordance with Section 301.452(b)(10), Texas Occupations Code, and is a violation of 22 Tex. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(1)(B),(6)(G),(8) and (11)(B).

CHARGE V.

On or about January 20, 2012, through February 3, 2012, while employed as a Licensed Vocational Nurse with Texas PRN Staffing, Odessa, Texas, and assigned to Odessa Regional Medical Center, Odessa, Texas, Respondent engaged in the intemperate use of Opiates in that he submitted a specimen for a drug screen that produced a positive result for Opiates. Unlawful possession of Opiates is prohibited by Chapter 481 of the Texas Health and Safety Code (Controlled Substances Act). The use of Opiates by a Licensed Vocational Nurse, while subject to call or duty, could impair the nurse's ability to recognize subtle signs, symptoms or changes in the patients condition, and could impair the nurse's ability to make rational, accurate, and appropriate assessments, judgments, and decisions regarding patient care, thereby placing the patient in potential danger.

The above action constitutes grounds for disciplinary action in accordance with Section 301.452(b)(9)&(10), Texas Occupations Code, and is a violation of 22 Tex. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(1)(A)&(B),(4),(5),(10)(A)&(11)(B).

CHARGE VI.

On or about February 23, 2012, through February 24, 2012, while employed as a Licensed Vocational Nurse with Texas Rag Doll Nursing Agency, Big Spring, Texas, and assigned to Seminole Memorial Hospital, Seminole, Texas, Respondent withdrew Demerol from the medication dispensing system for Patient Medical Record Number 006853 without valid physicians' orders, as follows:

Respondent's conduct was likely to defraud the facility and patients of the cost of the medications.

The above action constitutes grounds for disciplinary action in accordance with Section 301.452(b)(10), Texas Occupations Code, and is a violation of 22 Tex. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(1)(B),(6)(G),(8) and (11)(B).

CHARGE X.

On or about February 23, 2012, while employed as a Licensed Vocational Nurse with Texas Rag Doll Nursing Agency, Big Spring, Texas, and assigned to Seminole Memorial Hospital, Seminole, Texas, Respondent falsified a verbal order for Demerol for Patient Medical Record Number 006853. Respondent's conduct was likely to injure the patient in that the administration of Demerol without a valid physician's order could result in the patient suffering from adverse reactions.

The above action constitutes grounds for disciplinary action in accordance with Section 301.452(b)(10)&(13), Texas Occupations Code, and is a violation of 22 Tex. ADMIN. CODE §217.11(1)(A)&(B), and 22 Tex. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(1)(A),(B)&(C),(4),(6)(A)&(10)(B).

CHARGE XI.

On or about February 23, 2012, through February 24, 2012, while employed as a Licensed Vocational Nurse with Texas Rag Doll Nursing Agency, Big Spring, Texas, and assigned to Seminole Memorial Hospital, Seminole, Texas, Respondent made unintelligible entries on patients' the Medication Dispensing Record regarding the administration of controlled substances. Respondent's conduct created an inaccurate medical record on which subsequent care givers would rely on to provide ongoing medical care.

The above action constitutes grounds for disciplinary action in accordance with Section 301.452(b)(10)&(13), Texas Occupations Code, and is a violation of 22 Tex. ADMIN. CODE §217.11(1)(A)&(B), and 22 Tex. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(1)(A),(B)&(C),(4)&(10)(B).

CHARGE XII.

On or about February 24, 2012, while employed as a Licensed Vocational Nurse with Texas Rag Doll Nursing Agency, Big Spring, Texas, and assigned to Seminole Memorial Hospital, Seminole, Texas, Respondent lacked fitness to practice nursing in that he showed signs of impaired behavior to include: sluggish and slow movements, very red in the face, and he was found sleeping in a vacant patient room while on duty. Respondent's condition could have affected her ability to recognize subtle signs, symptoms or changes in patients' conditions, and could have affected her ability to make rational, accurate, and appropriate assessments, judgments, and decisions regarding patient care, thereby placing the patients in potential danger.

The above action constitutes grounds for disciplinary action in accordance with Section •301.452(b)(10)&(12), Texas Occupations Code, and is a violation of 22 Tex. ADMIN. CODE §§217.11(1)(B)&(1)(T) and 217.12(1)(A),(B)&(E),(4)&(5).

CHARGE XIII.

On or about February 24, 2012, while employed as a Licensed Vocational Nurse with Texas Rag Doll Nursing Agency, Big Spring, Texas, and assigned to Seminole Memorial Hospital, Seminole, Texas, Respondent engaged in the intemperate use of Meperidine in that he submitted a specimen for a drug screen that produced a positive result for Meperidine (>30000 ng/mL). Unlawful possession of Meperidine is prohibited by Chapter 481 of the Texas Health and Safety Code (Controlled Substances Act). The use of Meperidine by a Licensed Vocational Nurse, while subject to call or duty, could impair the nurse's ability to recognize subtle signs, symptoms or changes in the patients condition, and could impair the nurse's ability to make rational, accurate, and appropriate assessments, judgments, and decisions regarding patient care, thereby placing the patient in potential danger.

The above action constitutes grounds for disciplinary action in accordance with Section 301.452(b)(9)&(10), Texas Occupations Code, and is a violation of 22 Tex. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(1)(A)&(B),(4),(5),(10)(A)&(11)(B).

NOTICE IS GIVEN that staff will present evidence in support of the recommended disposition of up to, and including, revocation of Respondent's license/s to practice nursing in the State of Texas pursuant to the Nursing Practice Act, Chapter 301, Texas Occupations Code and the Board's rules, 22 Tex. Admin. Code §§ 213.27 - 213.33. Additionally, staff will seek to impose on Respondent the administrative costs of the proceeding pursuant to Section 301.461, Texas Occupations Code. The cost of proceedings shall include, but is not limited to, the cost paid by the Board to the State Office of Administrative Hearings and the Office of the Attorney General or other Board counsel for legal and investigative services, the cost of a court reporter and witnesses, reproduction of records, Board staff time, travel, and expenses. These shall be in an amount of at least one thousand two hundred dollars (\$1200.00).

NOTICE IS GIVEN that to the extent applicable, based on the Formal Charges, the Board will rely on Adopted Disciplinary Sanction PoliciesNurses with Substance Abuse, Misuse, Substance Dependency, or other Substance Use Disorder, for Lying and Falsification, for Fraud, Theft and Deception, which can be found at the Board's website, www.bon.texas.gov.

NOTICE IS GIVEN that, based on the Formal Charges, the Board will rely on the Disciplinary Matrix, which can be found at www.bon.texas.gov/disciplinaryaction/discp-matrix.html.
