ORDER OF TEMPORARY SUSPENSION

**TO: CHRISTOPHER ADAM VARIN
4549 JERICHO
CORPUS CHRISTI, TX 78413**

A public meeting of the Texas Board of Nursing was held on November 18, 2014 at 333 Guadalupe, Room 3-460, Austin, Texas, in which the Temporary Suspension of Permanent Registered Nurse License Number 782418, issued to CHRISTOPHER ADAM VARIN was considered pursuant to Section 301.4551, TEXAS OCCUPATIONS CODE. Staff of the Texas Board of Nursing appeared and presented evidence and information concerning the conduct of CHRISTOPHER ADAM VARIN and whether his continued practice as a nurse would constitute a continuing and imminent threat to the public welfare.

After review and due consideration of the evidence and information presented, the Board finds that the following charge is substantiated:

On or about October 6, 2014, Respondent became noncompliant with the Agreed Order issued to him by the Texas Board of Nursing on April 11, 2014, which required Respondent to successfully complete the Texas Peer Assistance Program for Nurses (TPAPN). Noncompliance is the result of Respondent contacting TPAPN and withdrawing from the program. The Order, dated April 11, 2014, states:

"IT IS THEREFORE AGREED and ORDERED that RESPONDENT SHALL comply with the following conditions for such a time as is required for RESPONDENT to successfully complete the Texas Peer Assistance Program for Nurses (TPAPN)."

On or about October 13, 2014, Respondent's case was closed with TPAPN and referred back to the Board for further disposition.

The Texas Board of Nursing further finds that, given the nature of the charge concerning his fitness to practice, the continued practice of nursing by CHRISTOPHER ADAM VARIN constitutes a continuing and imminent threat to public welfare and that the temporary suspension of Permanent Registered Nurse License Number 782418, is justified pursuant to Section 301.4551, TEXAS OCCUPATIONS CODE.


NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that, Permanent Registered Nurse License Number 782418, issued to CHRISTOPHER ADAM VARIN, to practice nursing in the State of Texas be, and the same is/are, hereby SUSPENDED IMMEDIATELY in accordance with Section 301.4551, TEXAS OCCUPATIONS CODE.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that a probable cause hearing be conducted in accordance with Section 301.455(c) not later than seventeen (17) days following the date of the entry of this order, and a final hearing on the matter be conducted in accordance with 301.455(d) not later than the 61st day following the date of the entry of this order.

FORMAL CHARGES

This is a disciplinary proceeding under Section 301.452(b), Texas Occupations Code. Respondent, CHRISTOPHER ADAM VARIN, is a Registered Nurse holding License Number 782418, which is in current status at the time of this pleading.

Written notice of the facts and conduct alleged to warrant adverse licensure action was sent to Respondent at Respondent's address of record and Respondent was given opportunity to show compliance with all requirements of the law for retention of the license prior to commencement of this proceeding.

CHARGE I.

On or about October 6, 2014, Respondent became noncompliant with the Agreed Order issued to him by the Texas Board of Nursing on April 11, 2014, which required Respondent to successfully complete the Texas Peer Assistance Program for Nurses (TPAPN). Noncompliance is the result of Respondent contacting TPAPN and withdrawing from the program. The Order, dated April 11, 2014, states:

"IT IS THEREFORE AGREED and ORDERED that RESPONDENT SHALL comply with the following conditions for such a time as is required for RESPONDENT to successfully complete the Texas Peer Assistance Program for Nurses (TPAPN)."

On or about October 13, 2014, Respondent's case was closed with TPAPN and referred back to the Board for further disposition.

The above action constitutes grounds for disciplinary action in accordance with Section 301.452(b)(1)&(10), Texas Occupations Code, and is a violation of 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(3)&(11)(B).

NOTICE IS GIVEN that staff will present evidence in support of the recommended disposition of up to, and including, revocation of Respondent's license/s to practice nursing in the State of Texas pursuant to the Nursing Practice Act, Chapter 301, Texas Occupations Code and the Board's rules, 22 Tex. Admin. Code §§ 213.27 - 213.33. Additionally, staff will seek to impose on Respondent the administrative costs of the proceeding pursuant to Section 301.461, Texas Occupations Code. The cost of proceedings shall include, but is not limited to, the cost paid by the Board to the State Office of Administrative Hearings and the Office of the Attorney General or other Board counsel for legal and investigative services, the cost of a court reporter and witnesses, reproduction of records, Board staff time, travel, and expenses. These shall be in an amount of at least one thousand two hundred dollars (\$1200.00).

NOTICE IS GIVEN that all statutes and rules cited in these Charges are incorporated as part of this pleading and can be found at the Board's website, www.bon.texas.gov.



On this day the Texas Board of Nursing, hereinafter referred to as the Board, considered the matter of CHRISTOPHER ADAM VARIN, Registered Nurse License Number 782418, hereinafter referred to as Respondent.

Information received by the Board produced evidence that Respondent may be subject to discipline pursuant to Section 301.452(b)(10),(12)&(13) and 301.453, Texas Occupations Code. Respondent waived informal proceedings, notice and hearing, and agreed to the entry of this Order offered under the authority of Section 301.466(d), Texas Occupations Code, and approved by Katherine A. Thomas, MN, RN, FAAN, Executive Director, on February 26, 2014.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Prior to the institution of Agency proceedings, notice of the matters specified below in these Findings of Fact was served on Respondent and Respondent was given an opportunity to show compliance with all requirements of the law for retention of the license(s).
2. Respondent waived informal proceedings, notice and hearing, and agreed to the entry of this Order.
3. Respondent is currently licensed to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas.
4. Respondent received an Associate Degree in Nursing from Excelsior College, Albany, New York, on February 1, 1996. Respondent was licensed to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas on July 2, 1996.
5. Respondent's nursing employment history includes:

07/1996 - 08/2009

Unknown

Respondent's nursing employment history continued:

09/2009 - 06/2013	RN	Christus Spohn Health System Corpus Christi, Texas
01/2011 - 06/2011	RN	Northeast Methodists San Antonio, Texas
06/2013 - Present	RN	Fresenius Medica Care Corpus Christi, Texas

6. At the time of the incident, Respondent was employed as a Registered Nurse with Christus Spohn Health System, Corpus Christi, Texas, and had been in this position for approximately three (3) years and nine (9) months.
7. On or about May 26, 2013 through May 30, 2013, while employed as a Registered Nurse with Christus Spohn Health System, Corpus Christi, Texas, Respondent misappropriated Dilaudid belonging to the facility and patients thereof in that he admitted to taking the Dilaudid for his personal use. Respondent's conduct was likely to defraud the facility and patients thereof of the cost of the medications.
8. On or about May 26, 2013 through May 30, 2013, while employed as a Registered Nurse with Christus Spohn Health System, Corpus Christi, Texas, Respondent lacked fitness to practice nursing in that he admitted to taking Dilaudid from the facility for his personal use and that he needed help. Respondent's condition could have affected his ability to recognize subtle signs, symptoms or changes in patients' conditions, and could have affected his ability to make rational, accurate, and appropriate assessments, judgments, and decisions regarding patient care, thereby placing the patients in potential danger.
9. In response to Findings of Fact Numbers Seven (7) and Eight (8), Respondent states his personnel record has a hand written note that indicates that no patient received any medication that was not ordered. Respondent states the note reflects an admission of misappropriation, but the note was not signed.
10. The Respondent's conduct as described in the preceding Finding(s) of Fact was reportable under the provisions of Sections 301.401-301.419, Texas Occupations Code.
11. The Board finds that there exists serious risks to public health and safety as a result of impaired nursing care due to intemperate use of controlled substances or chemical dependency.
12. Respondent's conduct as described in the preceding Finding(s) of Fact resulted from or was significantly influenced by Respondent's substance use disorder.
13. Respondent's compliance with the terms of a Board approved peer assistance program should be sufficient to protect patients and the public.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Sections 301.451-301.455, the Board has jurisdiction over this matter.
2. Notice was served in accordance with law.
3. The evidence received is sufficient to prove violation(s) of 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.11(1)(A)&(1)(B) and 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(1)(A),(1)(B),(4),(5),(6)(G),(8),(10)(E).
4. The evidence received is sufficient cause pursuant to Section 301.452(b)(10), (12) &(13), Texas Occupations Code, to take disciplinary action against Registered Nurse License Number 782418, heretofore issued to CHRISTOPHER ADAM VARIN, up to, and including, revocation of Respondent's license(s) to practice nursing in the State of Texas.
5. The Board may, in its discretion, order a nurse to participate in a peer assistance program approved by the Board if the nurse would otherwise have been eligible for referral to peer assistance pursuant to Section 301.410, Texas Occupations Code.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE AGREED and ORDERED that RESPONDENT SHALL comply with the following conditions for such a time as is required for RESPONDENT to successfully complete the Texas Peer Assistance Program for Nurses (TPAPN):

(1) RESPONDENT SHALL, within forty-five (45) days following the date of entry of this final Order, apply to TPAPN and SHALL, within ninety (90) days following the date of entry of this final Order, sign and execute the TPAPN participation agreement and complete the enrollment process, which SHALL include payment of a non-refundable participation fee in the amount of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) payable to TPAPN.

(2) Upon acceptance into the TPAPN, RESPONDENT SHALL waive confidentiality and provide a copy of the executed TPAPN participation agreement to the Texas Board of Nursing.

(3) RESPONDENT SHALL comply with all requirements of the TPAPN

participation agreement during its term and SHALL keep all applicable license(s) to practice nursing in the State of Texas current.

(4) RESPONDENT SHALL CAUSE the TPAPN to notify the Texas Board of Nursing of any violation of the TPAPN participation agreement.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED, RESPONDENT SHALL comply in all respects with the Nursing Practice Act, Texas Occupations Code, Section §§301.001 *et seq.*, the Rules and Regulations Relating to Nurse Education, Licensure and Practice, 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §211.1 *et seq.* and this Order.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that this Order SHALL be applicable to Respondent's nurse licensure compact privileges, if any, to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that while Respondent's license(s) is/are encumbered by this Order, Respondent may not work outside the State of Texas pursuant to a multistate licensure privilege without the written permission of the Texas Board of Nursing and the Board of Nursing in the party state where Respondent wishes to work.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED that, while RESPONDENT remains in compliance with the terms of this Order, this Order shall remain confidential in accordance with the authority outlined in Section 301.466(d), Texas Occupations Code. However, should Respondent fail to successfully complete the terms of this Order or should Respondent commit a subsequent violation of the Nursing Practice Act or Board Rules, this Order shall be treated as prior disciplinary action and will become public information.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED, SHOULD RESPONDENT fail to comply with this Order or the terms of the participation agreement with the TPAPN, such noncompliance will result in further disciplinary action including EMERGENCY SUSPENSION pursuant to Section 301.4551,

Texas Occupations Code, or REVOCATION of Respondent's license(s) and nurse licensure compact privileges, if any, to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

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RESPONDENT'S CERTIFICATION

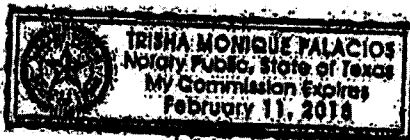
