On this day the Texas Board of Nursing, hereinafter referred to as the Board, considered the matter of GREGORY P. GOLDSMITH, Advanced Practice Registered Nurse License Number AP113683 and Registered Nurse License Number 616326, hereinafter referred to as Respondent.

This action was taken in accordance with Section 301.453(c), Texas Occupations

Respondent waived notice and hearing and agreed to the entry of this Order.

The Board makes the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Prior to the institution of Agency proceedings, notice of the matters specified below in these Findings of Fact was served on Respondent and Respondent was given an opportunity to show compliance with all requirements of the law for retention of the license(s).
- 2. Respondent waived notice and hearing and agreed to the entry of this Order.
- Respondent's license to practice as a professional nurse in the State of Texas is in current 3. status. Respondent's license to practice as an advanced practice registered nurse in the State of Texas is in current status.
- Respondent received a Baccalaureate Degree in Nursing from University of Texas-Med BR, 4. Galveston, Texas, on April 1, 1995, and received a Masters Degree in Nursing from Texas Wesleyan University on December 3, 2004. Respondent was licensed to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas on June 6, 1995, and was licensed to practice advanced practice registered nursing in the role of Nurse Anesthetist in the State of Texas on January 3, 2005.

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5. Respondent's nursing employment history includes:

- 6. At the time of the incident in Finding of Fact Number Seven (7), Respondent was employed as a Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist with NorthStar Anesthesia, Arlington, Texas, and had been in that position for approximately six (6) months.
- 7. On or about March 2014, while employed as a Nurse Anesthetist with NorthStar Anesthesia, Arlington, Texas, and on assignment at St. Joseph Medical Center, Houston, Texas, Respondent lacked fitness to practice nursing in that he exhibited signs of impairment, including a change in physical appearance, sweating profusely, and poor skin color. Additionally, Respondent admitted to his employer that he abuses Fentanyl. Respondent's condition could have affected his ability to recognize subtle signs, symptoms or changes in the patient's condition, and could have affected his ability to make rational, accurate, and appropriate assessments, judgments, and decision regarding patient care, thereby placing the patient in potential danger.
- 8. In response to Finding of Fact Number Seven (7), Respondent states that he has professionally resigned from practicing nursing, effective March 2014, and he is currently pursuing a career in a non-healthcare related field.
- 9. Respondent, by his signature to this Order, expresses his desire to voluntarily surrender his license(s) to practice nursing in the State of Texas.
- 10. The Board policy implementing Rule 213.29 in effect on the date of this Agreed Order provides discretion by the Executive Director for consideration of conditional reinstatement after proof of twelve (12) consecutive months of abstinence from alcohol and drugs followed by licensure limitations/stipulations and/or peer assistance program participation.

11. The Board finds that there exists serious risks to public health and safety as a result of impaired nursing care due to intemperate use of controlled substances or chemical dependency.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. Pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Sections 301.451-301.555, the Board has jurisdiction over this matter.
- 2. Notice was served in accordance with law.
- 3. The evidence received is sufficient to prove violation(s) of 22 Tex. ADMIN. CODE §217.11(1)(A),(1)(B)&(1)(T) and 22 Tex. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(1)(A),(1)(B),(1)(E), (4)&(5).
- 4. The evidence received is sufficient cause pursuant to Section 301.452(b)(10),(12)&(13), Texas Occupations Code, to take disciplinary action against Advanced Practice Registered Nurse License Number AP113683 and Registered Nurse License Number 616326, heretofore issued to GREGORY P. GOLDSMITH, including revocation of Respondent's license(s) to practice nursing in the State of Texas.
- 5. Under Section 301.453(c), Texas Occupations Code, the Board has the authority to accept the voluntary surrender of a license.
- 6. Under Section 301.453(d), Texas Occupations Code, as amended, the Board may impose conditions for reinstatement of licensure.
- 7. Any subsequent reinstatement of this license will be controlled by Section 301.453(d), Texas Occupations Code, and 22 Tex. ADMIN. CODE §213.26-.29, and any amendments thereof in effect at the time of the reinstatement.

TERMS OF ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED and ORDERED that the **VOLUNTARY SURRENDER** of Advanced Practice Registered Nurse License Number AP113683 and Registered
Nurse License Number 616326, heretofore issued to GREGORY P. GOLDSMITH, to practice
nursing in the State of Texas, is accepted by the Texas Board of Nursing. In connection with this
acceptance, the Board imposes the following conditions:

- 1. RESPONDENT SHALL NOT practice advanced practice registered nursing, use the title "advanced practice registered nurse" or the abbreviation "APRN" or wear any insignia identifying herself/himself as an advanced practice registered nurse or use any designation which, directly or indirectly, would lead any person to believe that RESPONDENT is an advanced practice registered nurse during the period in which the license is surrendered.
- 2. RESPONDENT SHALL NOT practice professional/registered nursing, use the title "registered nurse" or the abbreviation "RN" or wear any insignia identifying herself/himself as a registered nurse or use any designation which, directly or indirectly, would lead any person to believe that RESPONDENT is a registered nurse during the period in which the license is surrendered.
- 3. RESPONDENT SHALL NOT petition for reinstatement of licensure until:
 - A. One (1) year has elapsed from the date of this Order; and
 - B. RESPONDENT has obtained objective, verifiable proof of twelve (12) consecutive months of sobriety immediately preceding the petition for reinstatement.
- 4. Upon petitioning for reinstatement, RESPONDENT SHALL satisfy all then existing requirements for relicensure.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that this Order SHALL be applicable

to Respondent's nurse licensure compact privileges, if any, to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

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RESPONDENT'S CERTIFICATION

I understand that I have the right to legal counsel prior to signing this Agreed Order. I waive representation by counsel. I have reviewed this Order. I neither admit nor deny the violation(s) alleged herein. By my signature on this Order, I agree to the entry of this Order, and any conditions of said Order, to avoid further disciplinary action in this matter. I waive judicial review of this Order. I understand that this Order becomes final when accepted by the Executive Director at which time the terms of this Order become effective and a copy will be mailed to me.
