6. At the time of the incident, Respondent was employed as a LVN with Cardiovascular Provider Resources, Dallas, Texas, and had been in that position for four (4) years and eight (8) months.
7. On or about August 20, 2013, October 26, 2013, and November 1, 2013, while employed with Cardiovascular Provider Resources, Dallas, Texas, Respondent telephonically communicated three (3) prescriptions to Kroger Pharmacy, Fort Worth, Texas, without the physician's authorization or knowledge. The prescriptions were for a family member (Patient EG) and an acquaintance (Patient CB), who were not established patients of the clinic. The prescriptions included the following:

Respondent's conduct was likely to injure the patients in that the administration of medications without a valid physician's order could result in the patients suffering from adverse reactions. In addition, Respondent's conduct was likely to deceive the pharmacy regarding the unauthorized, telephonically communicated prescription in violation of Chapter 483 of the Texas Health and Safety Code (Dangerous Drug Act).

8. Respondent, by her signature to this Order, expresses her desire to voluntarily surrender her license(s) to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Sections 301.451-301.555 , the Board has jurisdiction over this matter.
2. Notice was served in accordance with law.
3. The evidence received is sufficient to prove violation(s) of 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.11(1)(A)&(1)(P), and 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(1)(A),(4)&(10)(E).
4. The evidence received is sufficient cause pursuant to Section 301.452(b)(10)&(13), Texas Occupations Code, to take disciplinary action against Vocational Nurse License Number 194040, heretofore issued to LORA JO GOLLAHON, including revocation of Respondent's license(s) to practice nursing in the State of Texas.
5. Pursuant to Section 301.463(d), Texas Occupations Code, this Agreed Order is a settlement agreement under Rule 408, Texas Rules of Evidence, in civil or criminal litigation.
6. Under Section 301.453(c), Texas Occupations Code, the Board has the authority to accept the voluntary surrender of a license.
7. Under Section 301.453(d), Texas Occupations Code, as amended, the Board may impose conditions for reinstatement of licensure.
8. Any subsequent reinstatement of this license will be controlled by Section 301.453(d), Texas Occupations Code, and 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §213.26-.29, and any amendments thereof in effect at the time of the reinstatement.

TERMS OF ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED and ORDERED that the **VOLUNTARY SURRENDER** of Vocational Nurse License Number 194040, heretofore issued to LORA JO GOLLAHON, to practice nursing in the State of Texas, is accepted by the Texas Board of Nursing.

In connection with this acceptance, the Board imposes the following conditions:

1. RESPONDENT SHALL NOT practice vocational nursing, use the title "vocational nurse" or the abbreviation "LVN" or wear any insignia identifying herself/himself as a vocational nurse, or use any designation which, directly or indirectly, would lead any person to believe that RESPONDENT is a vocational nurse during the period in which the license is surrendered.

2. RESPONDENT SHALL NOT petition for reinstatement of licensure until one (1) year has elapsed from the date of this Order.
3. Upon petitioning for reinstatement, RESPONDENT SHALL satisfy all then existing requirements for relicensure.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that this Order SHALL be applicable to Respondent's nurse licensure compact privileges, if any, to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

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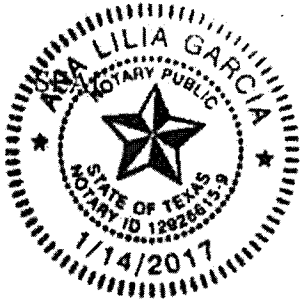
RESPONDENT'S CERTIFICATION
