- 3. Petitioner received a Baccalaureate Degree in Nursing from University of Texas Health Science Center, Houston, Texas on October 30, 2007. Petitioner was originally licensed to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas on November 1, 2007.
- 4. Petitioner's nursing employment history includes:

- 5. On August 12, 2012, Petitioner was issued the sanction of Remedial Education and a Fine by the Texas Board of Nursing. A copy of the August 12, 2012, Agreed Order, Findings of Fact, and Conclusions of Law is attached and incorporated, by reference, as part of this Order.
- 6. On August 19, 2014 Petitioner's license(s) to practice professional, nursing in the State of Texas was revoked by the Texas Board of Nursing. A copy of the August 19, 2014 Order, Findings of Fact, and Conclusions of Law, is attached and incorporated, by reference, as a part of this Order.
- 7. On or about December 17, 2015, Petitioner submitted a Petition for Reinstatement of License to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas.
- 8. Petitioner presented the following in support of petition:
  - 8.1. Letter of Support dated September 29, 2015, from Dr. Alfonso E. Aldama, Houston, Texas in which he states Petitioner has excellent moral character and has always shown excellent professionalism. Dr. Aldama states his letter is to endorse Petitioner's application for reinstatement of his license with the Texas Board of Nurses.
  - 8.2 Letter of Support dated October 1, 2015, from Alex Svetlitski, Senior Sales Representative, Nuvasive, Inc. Mr. Svetlitski states he has worked with Petitioner for 3 years. Mr. Svetlitski states Petitioner's position has entailed working with Neuro and Orthopedic surgeons which requires tremendous technical abilities, the ability to stay on task, and create good working relationships with the surgeons. Mr. Svetlitski states Petitioner is extremely reliable, motivated, and hard-working. Mr. Svetlitski also states Petitioner is intelligent, detailed-oriented, extremely professional, and has a great personality. Mr. Svetlitski states the Petitioner communicates easily with customers and creates close working relationships with both his co-workers and customers. Mr. Svetlitski states it is his great pleasure to offer his highest recommendation of Petitioner's skills.
  - 8.3 Letter of Support dated October 22, 2015, from Dr. Andrew C. Roeser, Houston, Texas. Dr. Roeser states he has the privilege of working with and knowing the Petitioner extensively while Petitioner has served as a surgical spine representative over the last 3 years. Dr. Roeser states Petitioner is known by all in an out of the operating room for his excellent character, knowledge, professional demeanor, skill and discernment. Dr. Roeser highly recommends Petitioner without any reservations.
  - 8.4 Documentation of the required 20 continuing education contact hours.
  - 8.5 Verification of successful completion of Community Supervision.

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. Pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Sections 301.451-301.555, the Board has jurisdiction over this matter.
- 2. Pursuant to Section 301.467, Texas Occupations Code, the Board may refuse to issue or renew a license, and may set a reasonable period that must lapse before reapplication. Pursuant to 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §213.26, the Board may impose reasonable conditions that a Petitioner must satisfy before reissuance of an unrestricted license.

### **ORDER**

IT IS THEREFORE AGREED, subject to ratification by the Texas Board of Nursing, that the petition of PRESTON ZACHARY GREEN, Registered Nurse License Number 748183, to practice nursing in the state of Texas, be and the same is hereby GRANTED, AND SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING STIPULATIONS SO LONG AS THE PETITIONER complies in all respects with the Nursing Practice Act, Texas Occupations Code, §301.001 et seq., the Rules and Regulations Relating to Nurse Education, Licensure and Practice, 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §211.1 et. seq. and the stipulations contained in this Order:

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that, while under the terms of this Order, this Order SHALL apply to any and all future licenses issued to Petitioner to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that this Order SHALL be applicable to Petitioner's nurse licensure compact privileges, if any, to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that while Petitioner's license(s) is/are encumbered by this Order, Petitioner may not work outside the State of Texas pursuant to a nurse licensure compact privilege without the written permission of the State of Texas and the Board of Nursing in the party state where Petitioner wishes to work.

- (1) PETITIONER SHALL pay all re-registration fees and be issued a license to practice nursing in the State of Texas, which shall bear the appropriate notation. Said license issued to PRESTON ZACHARY GREEN shall be subject to the following agreed post-licensure probation conditions:
- (2) PETITIONER SHALL, within one (1) year of relicensure, successfully complete a course in Texas nursing jurisprudence and ethics. PETITIONER SHALL obtain Board approval of the course prior to enrollment only if the course is <u>not</u> being offered by a pre-approved provider. Home study courses and video programs will not be approved. In order for the course to be approved, the target audience shall include nurses. It shall be a minimum of six (6) hours in length. The course's content shall include the Nursing Practice Act, standards of practice, documentation of care, principles of nursing ethics, confidentiality, professional boundaries, and the Board's Disciplinary Sanction Policies regarding: Sexual Misconduct; Fraud, Theft and Deception; Nurses with Substance Abuse, Misuse, Substance Dependency, or other Substance Use Disorder; and Lying and Falsification. Courses focusing on malpractice issues will not be accepted. PETITIONER SHALL CAUSE the sponsoring institution to submit a Verification of Course Completion form, provided by the Board, to the Office of the Board to verify PETITIONER's successful completion of the course. This course shall be taken in addition to any other courses stipulated in this Order, if any, and in addition to any continuing education requirements the Board has for relicensure. Board-approved courses may be found at the following Board website address: http://www.bon.texas.gov/disciplinaryaction/stipscourses.html.

(3) PETITIONER SHALL, within one (1) year of relicensure, successfully complete the course "Sharpening Critical Thinking Skills," a 3.6 contact hour online program provided by the National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) Learning Extension. In order to receive credit for completion of this program, PETITIONER SHALL SUBMIT the continuing education certificate of completion for this program to the Board's office, to attention Compliance. This course is to be taken in addition to any continuing education requirements the Board may have for relicensure. Board-approved courses may be found at the following Board website address: <a href="http://www.bon.texas.gov/compliance">http://www.bon.texas.gov/compliance</a>.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED, that upon full compliance with the terms of this Order, all encumbrances will be removed from PETITIONER'S license(s) to practice nursing in the State of Texas and PETITIONER may be eligible for nurse licensure compact privileges, if any.

I understand that I have the right to legal counsel prior to signing this Reinstatement Agreed Order. I waive representation by counsel. I certify that my past behavior, except as disclosed in my Petition for Reinstatement of Licensure, has been in conformity with the Board's professional character rule. I have no criminal prosecution pending in any jurisdiction.

The Committee finds that notice of the facts or conduct alleged to warrant disciplinary action has been provided to Respondent in accordance with Texas Government Code § 2001.054(c) and Respondent has been given an opportunity to show compliance with all the requirements of the Nursing Practice Act, Chapter 301 of the Texas Occupations Code, for retention of Respondent's license(s) to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

All parties have a right to judicial review of this Order.

All proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law filed by any party not specifically adopted herein are hereby denied.

On this day the Texas Board of Nursing, hereinafter referred to as the Board, considered the matter of PRESTON ZACHARY GREEN, Registered Nurse License Number 748183, hereinafter referred to as Respondent.

Information received by the Board produced evidence that Respondent may be subject to discipline pursuant to Section 301.452(b)(2)&(10), Texas Occupations Code. Respondent waived representation by counsel, informal proceedings, notice and hearing, and agreed to the entry of this Order offered on July 24, 2012, by Katherine A. Thomas, MN, RN, FAAN, Executive Director.

### **FINDINGS OF FACT**

- 1. Prior to the institution of Agency proceedings, notice of the matters specified below in these Findings of Fact was served on Respondent and Respondent was given an opportunity to show compliance with all requirements of the law for retention of the license(s).
- 2. Respondent waived representation by counsel, informal proceedings, notice and hearing, and agreed to the entry of this Order.
- 3. Respondent is currently licensed to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas.
- 4. Respondent received a Baccalaureate Degree in Nursing from University of Texas Health Science Center, Houston, Texas, on October 30, 2007. Respondent was licensed to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas on November 1, 2007.
- Respondent's professional nursing employment history is unknown.
- On or about August 24, 2008, Respondent submitted an Online Renewal Document to the Texas Board of Nursing, in which he provided false, deceptive, and/ or misleading information in that he answered "No" to the question: "Have you, within the past 24 months or since your last renewal, for any criminal offense, including those pending appeal:

- A. been convicted of a misdemeanor?
- B. been convicted of a felony?
- C. pled nolo contendere, no contest, or guilty?
- D. received deferred adjudication?
- E. been placed on community supervision or court-ordered probation, whether or not adjudicated guilty?
- F. been sentenced to serve jail or prison time? court-ordered confinement?
- G: been granted pre-trial diversion?
- H. been arrested or any pending criminal charges?
- I. been cited or charged with any violation of the law?
- J. been subject of a court-martial; Article 15 violation, or received any form of military judgment/punishment/action?"

Respondent failed to disclose that, on or about January 30, 2008, the probation Respondent was granted in Cause No. 1444780 was Revoked in the County Criminal Court at Law No. 8 of Harris County, Texas. As a result, Respondent was adjudged Guilty of the Class B misdemeanor offense of CRIMINAL TRESPASS, committed on April 1, 2007.

Respondent also failed to disclose that, on or about April 25, 2008, Respondent entered a plea of Guilty and was convicted of RECKLESS DRIVING, a Class C misdemeanor offense committed on July 21, 2007, in the County Court at Law No. 1 of Fort Bend County, Texas, under Cause No. 133329.

- 7. In response to Finding of Fact Number Six (6), Respondent states he had his nursing license for three years prior to when he was asked about any new convictions and answered truthfully to "No". He assumed at the time, that the criminal trespass was an issue prior to taking the Boards that it had already been considered. He answered "No" to the reckless driving because he was advised that it was a traffic violation similar to excessive speeding. He understands now that these offense should have been disclosed and deeply apologizes for the misunderstanding.
- 8. Formal Charges were filed on June 22, 2012.
- 9. Formal Charges were mailed to Respondent on June 22, 2012.

# **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

- 1. Pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Sections 301.451-301.555, the Board has jurisdiction over this matter.
- 2. Notice was served in accordance with law.
- 3. The evidence received is sufficient to prove violation(s) of 22 Tex. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(6)(1).

4. The evidence received is sufficient cause pursuant to Section 301.452(b)(2)&(10), Texas Occupations Code, to take disciplinary action against, Registered Nurse License Number 748183, heretofore issued to PRESTON ZACHARY GREEN, including revocation of Respondent's license(s) to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

### ORDER -
