On this day the Texas Board of Nursing, hereinafter referred to as the Board, considered the Petition for Reinstatement of Registered Nurse License Number 703636, held by MELANIE ELIZABETH GARLINGTON, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner.

An informal conference was conducted on January 10, 2017, in accordance with Section 301.464, Texas Occupations Code. Petitioner appeared in person.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Prior to the institution of Agency proceedings, notice of the matters specified below in these Findings of Fact was served on Petitioner and Petitioner was given an opportunity to show compliance with all requirements of the law for retention of the license(s).
2. Petitioner waived notice and hearing, and agreed to the entry of this Order.
3. Petitioner received an Associate Degree in Nursing from Tarrant County Junior College, Fort Worth, Texas, on December 12, 2003. Petitioner was licensed to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas on March 2, 2004.
4. Petitioner's nursing employment history includes:

5. On December 29, 2009, the Texas Board of Nursing accepted the voluntary surrender of Petitioner's license to practice professional nursing. A copy of the December 29, 2009, Agreed Order, Findings of Fact, and Conclusions of Law is attached and incorporated, by reference, as part of this Order.
6. On or about September 8, 2016, Petitioner submitted a Petition for Reinstatement of License to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas.
7. Petitioner presented the following in support of said petition:
 - 7.1. Order of Deferred Adjudication issued April 29, 2010, by 382nd Judicial District Court in and for Rockwall County, Texas, for the offense of "Possession of a Controlled Substance less than one (1) gram," a State Jail Felony offense committed on May 14, 2009. Petitioner pled Guilty and was sentenced to three (3) years community supervision, a fine of one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1500.00) and court costs.
 - 7.2. Order Terminating Deferred Adjudication Community Supervision issued May 2, 2013, by Judge Brett Hall, 382nd Judicial District Court, Rockwall County, Texas.
 - 7.3. Documentation of Intensive Residential Treatment at MHMR of Tarrant County dating from December 7, 2009, through January 12, 2010.
 - 7.4. Certificate of completion, dated June 20, 2011, of the out-patient treatment program at Community Addiction Treatment Services (CATS), Fort Worth, Texas.
 - 7.5. Letter, dated June 28, 2011, from Katrice Goodman, START Case Manager, stating Petitioner was a resident in the Salvation Army's START Program from January 12, 2010, until September 4, 2010. The START program is a stabilization shelter for single homeless adults that provides case management, resources, and referrals to support its client's goals towards self-sufficiency. While in START, clients establish a service plan and work on their individualized goals. All residents must remain clean and sober and comply with facility rules including chores and curfews. As a resident of START, Petitioner discharged successfully.
 - 7.6. Letter of support from Trudie Hughes, M.ED., LCDC, stating she is writing to verify Petitioner's treatment at the Pine Street Residential Treatment Program. Petitioner also completed her Intensive Out-patient Treatment Program at Community Addiction Treatment Services (CATS) through the MHMR Tarrant County Addiction Services as of June 20, 2011. Ms. Hughes has known Petitioner since 2009 and followed her progress of recovery through the MHMR treatment services. Petitioner has displayed a serious attitude and determination to the changes required for success in recovery and has kept her sobriety date of December 7, 2009.

- 7.7. Letter of support, dated May 29, 2013, from Liz Taylor, LCDC, MHMR Addiction Services, Fort Worth, Texas, stating she has worked with Petitioner for the past two (2) years. She has been a pleasure to work with and her knowledge base is incredible. She has been instrumental in calming conflicts between 20-30 clients she oversees on a daily basis, remaining professional yet caring in every situation. Petitioner has a strong work ethic and uses her nursing knowledge to help clients when they have a medication question or concern.
- 7.8. Letter of support, dated June 1, 2013, from Harold Hackworth, stating he has known Petitioner for approximately four (4) years and has had the privilege of being her immediate supervisor at MHMR of Tarrant County for the last year and a half. Petitioner is an outstanding example of what the program offers and the change it can induce in people's lives. Beyond being an outstanding employee, she is a positive role model, giving hope to the clients who often come in hopeless. Mr. Hackworth looks forward to Petitioner's reinstatement as a nurse.
- 7.9. Letter of support, dated June 5, 2013, from Sheryl Rene Clark, stating she is currently employed as a LVN in the detoxification unit at MHMR Tarrant County. Ms. Clark has known Petitioner for several years and have enjoyed working with her for the last year and a half. With Petitioner's own experiences in addiction and her background in nursing, she has proven to be an asset in the field of mental health and substance abuse. Ms. Clark looks forward to Petitioner's reinstatement and the possibility of working side by side with her as a nurse.
- 7.10. Letter of support, dated June 1, 2013, from Deirdre Browne, stating she has had the privilege of working with Petitioner for the last several years at the MHMR Recovery Center, a 62-bed residential detoxification and substance abuse treatment center. Ms. Browne is very impressed with Petitioner's work ethic, her ability to build client rapport, and her knowledge of chemical dependency. Petitioner works as a Residential Technician and has never over-reached the limitations of her job and has held to the scope of her job description. Petitioner is one of the most dedicated and thorough members of the staff. She is passionate about recovery and about the care of her clients. Ms. Browne has high hopes that Petitioner's license will be reinstated soon.
- 7.11. Letter of support, dated April 3, 2014, from Meri Rule, MS, LPC, LCDC, stating she has known Petitioner for about a year and worked closely with her for about six (6) months. Petitioner has many excellent qualities that are necessary to obtain her RN licensure. Not only does Petitioner have the education and experience to become re-licensed, but she is also caring, empathetic and eager to learn. She possesses a strong work ethic, has attention to detail and is sensitive to each unique patient need. Ms. Rule highly recommends Petitioner for any position or endeavor that she may seek to pursue.

- 7.12. Letter of support, dated October 12, 2014, from Jessica Alexander, EMT-P, MSCRM, PA-C, Director of Detox Services, MHMR Tarrant County, stating she has worked closely with Petitioner for one (1) year and have had the opportunity to observe her with patients and as a supervisor for other employees. On many occasions, Ms. Alexander has encouraged Petitioner to pursue reinstatement of her license and his thrilled to have the chance to stand in support of that now. As a supervisor, Petitioner is fair and consistent, level-headed and calm. In stressful situations and times of confrontation, she has handled the employees very professionally and with great maturity. She is organized and reliable. In terms of sobriety, Petitioner has achieved many years of sobriety and is very dedicated to helping other people do the same. She has surrounded herself with a strong network of sober friends, co-workers and supporters, and helps other people to understand the importance of doing the same. Ms. Alexander stands firm in her conviction that Petitioner be allowed to practice as a registered nurse and would be more than willing to hire her to work in the facility if she were given that chance.
- 7.13. Documentation of the required continuing education contact hours.
8. The Executive Director considered evidence of Petitioner's past behavior in light of the character factors set out in 22 Tex. Admin. Code §213.27 and determined that Petitioner currently demonstrates the criteria required for good professional character and relicensure.
9. Relicensure of Petitioner poses no direct threat to the health and safety of patients or the public provided Petitioner complies with the stipulations outlined in this Order.
10. The Executive Director's review of Petitioner's eligibility for relicensure has been made on the basis of Petitioner's disclosures.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Sections 301.451-301.555, the Board has jurisdiction over this matter.
2. Pursuant to Section 301.467, Texas Occupations Code, the Board may refuse to issue or renew a license, and may set a reasonable period that must lapse before reapplication. Pursuant to 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §213.26, the Board may impose reasonable conditions that a Petitioner must satisfy before reissuance of an unrestricted license.
3. The Board may license an individual with prior behaviors inconsistent with the Board's character requirements if, upon evaluation of the factors in 22 Tex. Admin. Code §213.27, and pursuant to 22 Tex. Admin. Code §213.33, the Board is satisfied that the individual is able to consistently conform her conduct to the requirements of the Nursing Practice Act, the Board's Rules and Regulations, and generally accepted standards of nursing practice.

4. This Order is conditioned upon the accuracy and completeness of Petitioner's disclosures. Any subsequently discovered discrepancies will result in investigation and possible disciplinary action, up to revocation of Petitioner's license(s).

TERMS OF ORDER

I. REINSTATEMENT OF LICENSURE

IT IS THEREFORE AGREED and ORDERED, subject to ratification by the Texas Board of Nursing, that the petition of MELANIE ELIZABETH CAMPBELL for reinstatement of license to practice nursing in the state of Texas be **GRANTED** and Registered Nurse License Number 703636 is hereby **REINSTATED** in accordance with the terms of this Order.

II. COMPLIANCE WITH LAW AND APPLICABILITY

While under the terms of this Order, PETITIONER agrees to obtain, read, and comply in all respects with the Nursing Practice Act, Texas Occupations Code, §§301.001 *et seq.*, the Rules and Regulations Relating to Nurse Education, Licensure and Practice, 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §§211.1 *et seq.*, and this Order.

- A. This Order SHALL be applicable to PETITIONER's nurse licensure compact privileges, if any, to practice nursing in the State of Texas.
- B. PETITIONER may not work outside the State of Texas in another nurse licensure compact party state without first obtaining the written permission of the Texas Board of Nursing and the Board of Nursing in the nurse licensure compact party state where PETITIONER wishes to work.

III. REQUIREMENTS FOR REFRESHER COURSE, EXTENSIVE ORIENTATION, OR NURSING PROGRAM OF STUDY IN PROFESSIONAL REGISTERED NURSING

Prior to practicing as an registered nurse in the State of Texas, PETITIONER

SHALL:

- A. Apply for a Six Month Temporary Permit to Complete Refresher Course, Extensive Orientation, or Nursing Program of Study in

Professional Registered Nursing for the limited purpose of completing a refresher course, extensive orientation, or nursing program of study in professional registered nursing. The application for the Six Month Temporary Permit is available on the Board's website (www.bon.texas.gov) under Forms / Applications / Six Month Permits. PETITIONER SHALL NOT, in any way, attempt to use the temporary permit for any purpose other than completing the refresher course, extensive orientation, or nursing program of study in professional registered nursing.

- B. **Successfully complete a Board approved refresher course, extensive orientation, or nursing program of study for professional registered nursing.** Petitioner MUST obtain Board approval of the nursing refresher course, extensive orientation, or nursing program, as applicable, prior to enrollment. In order for the course to be approved, the target audience shall include registered nurses and the course's content shall, at a minimum, include: 1) Review of NPA, Rules, Position Statements; 2) Determination of Individual Scope of Practice and role in patient safety; 3) Review of the nursing process to include assessment, planning, implementation, and evaluation; 4) Pharmacology review; 5) Medication administration; 6) Documentation, quality assurance, and legal implication for nursing practice; and, 7) Documentation of current CPR certification prior to beginning precepted clinical learning experience. The course must contain no less than a total of 80 hours of clinical practice providing direct patient care supervised by a qualified registered nurse instructor who meets or exceeds the Board's minimum criteria for eligibility as an instructor. Home study courses and video programs will not be approved.
- C. **Upon completion of the refresher course, extensive orientation, or nursing program of study for professional registered nursing,** PETITIONER SHALL return the temporary permit to the Board's office and PETITIONER SHALL CAUSE the sponsoring institution to notify the Board, on a form provided by the Board, of Petitioner's successful completion of the refresher course, including the required 80 hours of supervised practice.
- D. **Upon verification of successful completion of the conditions** as set out in Paragraphs A through C of this Section, PETITIONER SHALL submit a completed License Reactivation Form for Registered Nurses, which is available on the Board's website (www.bon.texas.gov) under Forms / Applications / Renewals / Reactivation Renewal. PETITIONER shall pay all re-registration fees and, subject to meeting all other requirements for licensure in Texas, shall be issued the applicable license to practice registered nursing in the State of Texas, which shall be subject to the terms of this Order.

III. REMEDIAL EDUCATION COURSE(S)

In addition to any continuing education requirements the Board may require for licensure renewal, Petitioner SHALL successfully complete the following remedial education course(s) **within one (1) year of relicensure, unless otherwise specifically indicated:**

- A. **A Board-approved course in Texas nursing jurisprudence and ethics** that shall be a minimum of six (6) hours in length. The course's content shall include the Nursing Practice Act, standards of practice, documentation of care, principles of nursing ethics, confidentiality, professional boundaries, and the Board's Disciplinary Sanction Policies regarding: Sexual Misconduct; Fraud, Theft and Deception; Nurses with Substance Abuse, Misuse, Substance Dependency, or other Substance Use Disorder; and Lying and Falsification. Courses focusing on malpractice issues will not be accepted. Home study courses and video programs will not be approved.
- B. The course **"Sharpening Critical Thinking Skills,"** a 3.6 contact hour online program provided by the National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) Learning Extension.

In order to receive credit for completion of this/these course(s), Petitioner SHALL CAUSE the instructor to submit a Verification of Course Completion form or SHALL submit the continuing education certificate, as applicable, to the attention of Monitoring at the Board's office. Petitioner SHALL first obtain Board approval of any course prior to enrollment if the course is not being offered by a pre-approved provider. *Information about Board-approved courses and Verification of Course Completion forms are available from the Board at www.bon.texas.gov/compliance.*

IV. MONITORING FEE

PETITIONER SHALL **pay a monitoring fee in the amount of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) within forty-five (45) days of relicensure.** Payment is to be made directly to the Texas Board of Nursing in the form of cashier's check or U.S. money order. Partial payments will not be accepted.

V. EMPLOYMENT REQUIREMENTS

In order to complete the terms of this Order, PETITIONER must work as a nurse in the State of Texas, providing direct patient care in a clinical healthcare setting, for a minimum of

sixty-four (64) hours per month for twelve (12) quarterly periods [three (3) years] of employment.

This requirement will not be satisfied until twelve (12) quarterly periods of employment as a nurse have elapsed. Any quarterly period without continuous employment with the same employer for all three (3) months will not count towards completion of this requirement. Periods of unemployment or of employment that do not require the use of a registered nurse (RN) or a vocational nurse (LVN) license, as appropriate, will not apply to this period and will not count towards completion of this requirement.

- A. **Notifying Present and Future Employers:** PETITIONER SHALL notify each present employer in nursing and present each with a complete copy of this Order, including all attachments, if any, within five (5) days of receipt of this Order. While under the terms of this Order, PETITIONER SHALL notify all future employers in nursing and present each with a complete copy of this Order, including all attachments, if any, prior to accepting an offer of employment.
- B. **Notification of Employment Forms:** PETITIONER SHALL CAUSE each present employer in nursing to submit the Board's "Notification of Employment" form to the Board's office within ten (10) days of receipt of this Order. PETITIONER SHALL CAUSE each future employer to submit the Board's "Notification of Employment form" to the Board's office within five (5) days of employment as a nurse.
- C. **Direct Supervision:** For the first year [four (4) quarters] of employment as a Nurse under this Order, PETITIONER SHALL be directly supervised by a Registered Nurse, if licensed as a Registered Nurse, or by a Licensed Vocational Nurse or a Registered Nurse, if licensed as a Licensed Vocational Nurse. Direct supervision requires another nurse, as applicable, to be working on the same unit as PETITIONER and immediately available to provide assistance and intervention. PETITIONER SHALL work only on regularly assigned, identified and predetermined unit(s). PETITIONER SHALL NOT be employed by a nurse registry, temporary nurse employment agency, hospice, or home health agency. PETITIONER SHALL NOT be self-employed or contract for services. Multiple employers are prohibited.
- D. **No Night or Rotating Shifts, Overtime, or On-Call:** For the first year [four (4) quarters] of employment as a Nurse under this Order, PETITIONER SHALL NOT practice as a nurse on the night shift, rotate shifts, work overtime, accept on-call assignments, or be used for coverage on any unit other than the identified, predetermined unit(s) to which PETITIONER is regularly assigned.

- E. No Critical Care:** For the first year [four (4) quarters] of employment as a Nurse under this Order, PETITIONER SHALL NOT practice as a nurse in any critical care area. Critical care areas include, but are not limited to, intensive care units, emergency rooms, operating rooms, telemetry units, recovery rooms, and labor and delivery units.
- F. No Administration of Controlled Medications:** For the first year [four (4) quarters] of employment as a Nurse under this Order, PETITIONER SHALL NOT administer or have any contact with controlled substances, Nubain, Stadol, Dalgan, Ultram, Propofol, or other synthetic opiates.
- G. Indirect Supervision:** For the remainder of the probation period, PETITIONER SHALL be supervised by a Registered Nurse, if licensed as a Registered Nurse, or by a Licensed Vocational Nurse or a Registered Nurse, if licensed as a Licensed Vocational Nurse, who is on the premises. The supervising nurse is not required to be on the same unit or ward as PETITIONER, but should be on the facility grounds and readily available to provide assistance and intervention if necessary. The supervising nurse shall have a minimum of two (2) years experience in the same or similar practice setting to which the PETITIONER is currently working. PETITIONER SHALL work only regularly assigned, identified and predetermined unit(s). PETITIONER SHALL NOT be employed by a nurse registry, temporary nurse employment agency, hospice, or home health agency. PETITIONER SHALL NOT be self-employed or contract for services. Multiple employers are prohibited.
- H. Nursing Performance Evaluations:** PETITIONER SHALL CAUSE each employer to submit, on forms provided to the PETITIONER by the Board, periodic reports as to PETITIONER'S capability to practice nursing. These reports shall be completed by the nurse who supervises the PETITIONER and these reports shall be submitted by the supervising nurse to the office of the Board at the end of each three (3) month quarterly period for twelve (12) quarters [three (3) years] of employment as a nurse.

VI. DRUG AND ALCOHOL RELATED REQUIREMENTS

- A.** While under the terms of this Order, PETITIONER SHALL abstain from the use of alcohol, tramadol and all controlled substances, except as prescribed by a licensed practitioner for a legitimate purpose. If prescribed, PETITIONER SHALL CAUSE the licensed practitioner to submit a written report identifying the medication, dosage and the date the medication was prescribed. The report shall be submitted directly to the office of the Board by the prescribing practitioner, within ten (10) days of the date of the prescription. In the event that prescriptions for controlled substances are required for periods of two (2) weeks or longer, the Board may require and PETITIONER SHALL submit to a pain management and/or chemical dependency evaluation by a Board approved evaluator. The performing

evaluator must submit a written report meeting the Board's requirements to the Board's office within thirty (30) days from the Board's request.

B. While working as a nurse under the terms of this Order, PETITIONER SHALL submit to random periodic screens for alcohol, tramadol, and controlled substances. The Board will provide instructions on how to enroll in the Board's drug and alcohol testing program following the entry of this Order and screening will begin when PETITIONER obtains employment and submits the Notification of Employment form to the Board.

- For the first three (3) month [1st quarter] period PETITIONER works as a nurse under the terms of this Order, random screens shall be performed at least once per week.
- For the next three (3) month [2nd quarter] period, random screens shall be performed at least twice per month.
- For the next six (6) month period [3rd & 4th quarters], random screens shall be performed at least once per month.
- For the remainder of the probation period, if any, random screens shall be performed at least once every three (3) month quarterly period.

All random screens SHALL BE conducted through urinalysis. Screens obtained through urinalysis are the sole method accepted by the Board. Any test result for a period of time in which the PETITIONER is not working as a nurse under the terms of this Order will not count towards satisfaction of this requirement. All screens shall be properly monitored and produced in accordance with the Board's policy on Random Drug Testing. A complete chain of custody shall be maintained for each specimen obtained and analyzed. PETITIONER SHALL be responsible for the costs of all random drug screening during the stipulation/probation period.

Specimens shall be screened for at least the following substances and their metabolites:

Amphetamines	Meperidine
Barbiturates	Methadone
Benzodiazepines	Methaqualone
Cannabinoids	Opiates
Cocaine	Phencyclidine
Ethanol	Propoxyphene
tramadol hydrochloride (Ultram)	

A Board representative may appear at the PETITIONER'S place of employment at any time during the probation period and require PETITIONER to produce a specimen for screening.

Consequences of Positive or Missed Screens. Any positive result for which PETITIONER does not have a valid prescription or refusal to submit to a

drug or alcohol screen may subject PETITIONER to further disciplinary action, including TEMPORARY SUSPENSION pursuant to Section 301.4551, Texas Occupations Code, or REVOCATION of PETITIONER's license(s) and nurse licensure compact privileges, if any, to practice nursing in the State of Texas. Further, failure to report for a drug screen, excessive dilute specimens, or failure to call in for a drug screen may be considered the same as a positive result or refusal to submit to a drug or alcohol screen.

- C. While under the terms of this Order, PETITIONER SHALL attend at least two (2) support group meetings each week, one of which must be for substance abuse and provided by Alcoholics Anonymous, Narcotics Anonymous, or another comparable recovery program that has been pre-approved by the Board. PETITIONER SHALL provide acceptable evidence of attendance. Acceptable evidence shall consist of a written record of at least: the date of each meeting; the name of each group attended; and the signature and printed name of the chairperson of each group attended by PETITIONER. PETITIONER SHALL submit the required evidence on the forms provided by the Board at the end of every three (3) month quarterly period. No duplications, copies, third party signatures, or any other substitutions will be accepted as evidence.

VII. RESTORATION OF UNENCUMBERED LICENSE(S)

Upon full compliance with the terms of this Order, all encumbrances will be removed from PETITIONER'S license(s) to practice nursing in the State of Texas and PETITIONER may be eligible for nurse licensure compact privileges, if any.

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
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PETITIONER'S CERTIFICATION

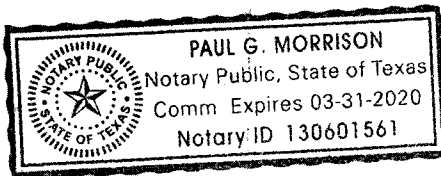





6. On or about May 15, 2009 through July 21, 2009, Respondent lacked fitness to practice professional nursing in that she disclosed to the Texas Board of Nursing that she completed six (6) weeks of inpatient treatment for substance abuse/dependency after she was hospitalized following an overdose. Respondent's conduct could have affected her ability to recognize subtle signs, symptoms or changes in patients' conditions, and could have affected her ability to make rational, accurate, and appropriate assessments, judgments, and decisions regarding patient care, thereby placing the patients in potential danger.
7. On or about July 29, 2009, Respondent was indicted for the offense of "Possession of a Controlled Substance in an amount of less than one (1) gram," a State Jail Felony by the Grand Jury of Rockwall County, Texas.
8. On or about August 31, 2009, Respondent submitted an online renewal application to the Texas Board of Nursing in which she provided false, deceptive, and/or misleading information, in that she answered "no" to the following questions:

"In the past 5 years, have you been addicted or treated for the use of alcohol or any other drug? (You may answer "no" if you have completed and/or are in compliance with TPAPN)."

Respondent failed to disclose that, on or about June 8, 2009 through July 21, 2009 she completed six (6) weeks of inpatient treatment for substance abuse/dependency. Respondent's conduct was likely to deceive the Board and could have affected the decision to issue a license.
9. In response to the incident outlined in Finding of Fact Number Six (6) and Seven (7), Respondent states her arrest in September 2009 was due to her overdose at an acquaintance's house on May 15, 2009. 911 was called and she was transported to the hospital while the police searched some rooms in the house. Illegal substances were confiscated from the house, but it was not determined who they belonged to so no arrests were made and no tickets were given. The Respondent was released from the hospital a few hours later and returned home to her parent's house. Soon after, she admitted herself into an inpatient treatment facility. On September 20, 2009, after treatment and ninety days of sobriety, she was pulled over for a routine traffic stop and notified of a warrant issued for her arrest from Rockwall County on August 8, 2009.
10. Respondent, by her signature to this Order, expresses her desire to voluntarily surrender her license to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

11. The Board policy implementing Rule 213.29 in effect on the date of this Agreed Order provides discretion by the Executive Director for consideration of conditional reinstatement after proof of twelve (12) consecutive months of abstinence from alcohol and drugs followed by licensure limitations/stipulations and/or peer assistance program participation.
12. The Board finds that there exists serious risks to public health and safety as a result of impaired nursing care due to intemperate use of controlled substances or chemical dependency.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Sections 301.451-301.555, the Board has jurisdiction over this matter.
2. Notice was served in accordance with law.
3. The evidence received is sufficient to prove violation of Section 301.452(b)(9)&(10), Texas Occupations Code, and 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(5),(11)(B)&(13).
4. The evidence received is sufficient cause pursuant to Section 301.453(a), Texas Occupations Code, to take disciplinary action against Registered License Number 703636, heretofore issued to MELANIE ELIZABETH CAMPBELL, including revocation of Respondent's license to practice nursing in the State of Texas.
5. Under Section 301.453(c), Texas Occupations Code, the Board has the authority to accept the voluntary surrender of a license.
6. Under Section 301.453(d), Texas Occupations Code, as amended, the Board may impose conditions for reinstatement of licensure.
7. Any subsequent reinstatement of this license will be controlled by Section 301.453(d), Texas Occupations Code, and 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §213.26-.29, and any amendments thereof in effect at the time of the reinstatement.

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ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED and ORDERED that the VOLUNTARY SURRENDER of Registered License Number 703636, heretofore issued to MELANIE ELIZABETH CAMPBELL, to practice nursing in the State of Texas, is accepted by the Texas Board of Nursing.

In connection with this acceptance, the Board imposes the following conditions:

1. RESPONDENT SHALL NOT practice professional nursing, use the title "registered nurse" or the abbreviation "RN" or wear any insignia identifying herself as a registered nurse or use any designation which, directly or indirectly, would lead any person to believe that RESPONDENT is a registered nurse during the period in which the license is surrendered.
2. RESPONDENT SHALL NOT petition for reinstatement of licensure until: one (1) year has elapsed from the date of this Order; and, RESPONDENT has obtained objective, verifiable proof of twelve (12) consecutive months of sobriety immediately preceding the petition.
3. Upon petitioning for reinstatement, RESPONDENT SHALL satisfy all then existing requirements for relicensure.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that this Order SHALL be applicable to Respondent's multistate privilege, if any, to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

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RESPONDENT'S CERTIFICATION

I understand that I have the right to legal counsel prior to signing this Agreed Order. I waive representation by counsel. I have reviewed this Order. I neither admit nor deny the violation alleged herein. By my signature on this Order, I agree to the Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, Order, and any conditions of said Order, to avoid further disciplinary action in this matter. I waive judicial review of this Order. I understand that this Order becomes final when accepted by the Executive Director at which time the terms of this Order become effective and a copy will be mailed to me.

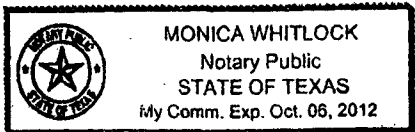
