§ ORDER

On this day the Texas Board of Nursing, hereinafter referred to as the Board, considered the matter of KAL BRADLEY MCMANUS, Registered Nurse License Number 749849, hereinafter referred to as Respondent.

Information received by the Board produced evidence that Respondent may be subject to discipline pursuant to Section 301.452(b)(10)&(13), Texas Occupations Code. Respondent waived notice and hearing and agreed to the entry of this Order approved by Katherine A. Thomas, MN, RN, FAAN, Executive Director, on March 22, 2017.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Prior to the institution of Agency proceedings, notice of the matters specified below in these Findings of Fact was served on Respondent and Respondent was given an opportunity to show compliance with all requirements of the law for retention of the license(s).
- 2. Respondent waived notice and hearing, and agreed to the entry of this Order.
- 3. Respondent's license to practice as a professional nurse in the State of Texas is in current status.
- 4. Respondent received a Baccalaureate Degree in Nursing from Baylor University, Dallas, Texas, on December 15, 2007. Respondent was licensed to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas on January 22, 2008, was licensed to practice professional nursing in the State of Florida August 6, 2009, and was licensed to practice professional nursing in the State of California in October 29, 2009.

5. Respondent's nursing employment history includes:

- 6. On or about December 12, 2014, Respondent's license to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas was issued the sanction of a REMEDIAL EDUCATION by the Board. Respondent has successfully completed the terms of the order. A copy of the Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order, dated December 12, 2014, is attached and incorporated herein by reference as part of this Order.
- 7. At the time of the incidents, Respondent was employed as a Registered Nurse with Texas Health Resource Central Staffing, Arlington, Texas, and had been in that position for four (4) years.
- 8. On or about February 20, 2016, through February 22, 2016, while employed as a Registered Nurse with Texas Health Resources Central Staffing, Arlington, Texas, Respondent withdrew and administered Morphine to Patient Number 3740336716 and Patient Number 3740336968 in excess frequency and/or dosage of a physician's order. Respondent's conduct was likely to injure the patients in that the administration of medication in excess frequency and/or dosage of the physicians' orders could result in the patient suffering from adverse reactions. Additionally, Respondent's conduct placed the hospital in violation of Chapter 481 (Controlled Substances Act) of the Texas Health and Safety Code.
- 9. On or about February 20, 2016, through February 22, 2016, while employed as a Registered Nurse with Texas Health Resources Central Staffing, Arlington, Texas, Respondent withdrew Morphine from the Pyxis Medication Dispensing System for Patient Number 3740336716 and Patient Number 3740336968, but failed to follow the facility's policy and procedure for wastage of the unused portions of the medication. Respondent's conduct left medications unaccounted for, was likely to deceive the hospital pharmacy, and placed the pharmacy in violation of Chapter 481 (Controlled Substances Act) of the Texas Health and Safety Code.

- 10. On or about February 21, 2016, while employed as a Registered Nurse with Texas Health Resources Central Staffing, Arlington, Texas, Respondent falsely documented the administration of Morphine in the Medication Administration Record (MAR) for Patient Number 3740336968, when there were no corresponding pulls from the Pyxis Medication Dispensing System. Respondent's conduct created an inaccurate medical record, and the failure to administer medication as ordered by the physician could have resulted in non-efficacious treatment.
- 11. In response to the incidents in Findings of Fact Numbers Eight (8), through Ten (10), Respondent states that he remembers a couple of shifts that were chaotic, or he had an exceeding high number of patients or patient turnover rate. Respondent states that he has a strong inclination that these errors occurred on theses dates in question.
- 12. On or about September 21, 2016, Respondent presented for a Chemical Dependency evaluation that was conducted by Marta E. Otero, Psy. D. Dr. Otero states that results of various drug and alcohol instruments showed that Respondent has a low probability for having a substance dependence disorder, is not at risk for alcohol related problems, and endorsed no signs of alcoholism. Dr. Otero opines that the results of the evaluation are more similar to an individual who suffers from an Adjustment Disorder. Dr. Otero recommends that Respondent meet with a mental health provider to discuss coping skills to help him make better choices moving forward in all areas of life.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. Pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Sections 301.451-301.555, the Board has jurisdiction over this matter.
- 2. Notice was served in accordance with law.
- 3. The evidence received is sufficient to prove violation(s) of 22 Tex. ADMIN. CODE \$217.11(1)(A),(1)(B),(1)(C),(1)(D)&(3) and 22 Tex. ADMIN. CODE \$217.12(1)(A),(1)(B),(1)(C),(4),(6)(A),(6)(H),(10)(B),(10)(C)&(11)(B).
- 4. The evidence received is sufficient cause pursuant to Section 301.452(b)(10)&(13), Texas Occupations Code, to take disciplinary action against Registered Nurse License Number 749849, heretofore issued to KAL BRADLEY MCMANUS.
- 5. Pursuant to Section 301.463(d), Texas Occupations Code, this Agreed Order is a settlement agreement under Rule 408, Texas Rules of Evidence, in civil or criminal litigation.

TERMS OF ORDER

I. SANCTION AND APPLICABILITY

IT IS THEREFORE AGREED and ORDERED that RESPONDENT SHALL receive the sanction of WARNING WITH STIPULATIONS in accordance with the terms of this Order.

- A. This Order SHALL apply to any and all future licenses issued to Respondent to practice nursing in the State of Texas.
- B. This Order SHALL be applicable to Respondent's nurse licensure compact privileges, if any, to practice nursing in the State of Texas.
- C. Respondent may not work outside the State of Texas in another nurse licensure compact party state without first obtaining the written permission of the Texas Board of Nursing and the Board of Nursing in the nurse licensure compact party state where Respondent wishes to work.

II. COMPLIANCE WITH LAW

While under the terms of this Order, RESPONDENT agrees to comply in all respects with the Nursing Practice Act, Texas Occupations Code, §§301.001 *et seq.*, the Rules and Regulations Relating to Nurse Education, Licensure and Practice, 22 Tex. ADMIN. Code §§211.1 *et seq.*, and this Order.

III. REMEDIAL EDUCATION COURSE(S)

In addition to any continuing education requirements the Board may require for licensure renewal, RESPONDENT SHALL successfully complete the following remedial education course(s) within one (1) year of the effective date of this Order, unless otherwise specifically indicated:

A. ABoard-approved course in Texas nursing jurisprudence and ethics that shall be a minimum of six (6) hours in length. The course's content shall include the Nursing Practice Act, standards of practice, documentation of care, principles of nursing ethics, confidentiality, professional boundaries, and the Board's Disciplinary Sanction Policies regarding: Sexual Misconduct;

Fraud, Theft and Deception; Nurses with Substance Abuse, Misuse, Substance Dependency, or other Substance Use Disorder; and Lying and Falsification. Courses focusing on malpractice issues will not be accepted. Home study courses and video programs will not be approved.

B. The course <u>"Sharpening Critical Thinking Skills,"</u> a 3.6 contact hour online program provided by the National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) Learning Extension.

In order to receive credit for completion of this/these course(s), RESPONDENT SHALL CAUSE the instructor to submit a Verification of Course Completion form or SHALL submit the continuing education certificate, as applicable, to the attention of Monitoring at the Board's office. RESPONDENT SHALL first obtain Board approval of any course prior to enrollment if the course is not being offered by a preapproved provider. Information about Board-approved courses and Verification of Course Completion forms are available from the Board at www.bon.texas.gov/compliance.

IV. EMPLOYMENT REQUIREMENTS

In order to complete the terms of this Order, RESPONDENT must work as a nurse in the State of Texas, providing direct patient care in a clinical healthcare setting, for a minimum of sixty-four (64) hours per month for four (4) quarterly periods [one (1) year] of employment. This requirement will not be satisfied until four (4) quarterly periods of employment as a nurse have elapsed. Any quarterly period without continuous employment with the same employer for all three (3) months will not count towards completion of this requirement. Periods of unemployment or of employment that do not require the use of a registered nurse (RN) or a vocational nurse (LVN) license, as appropriate, will not apply to this period and will not count towards completion of this requirement.

A. Notifying Present and Future Employers: RESPONDENT SHALL notify each present employer in nursing and present each with a complete copy of this Order, including all attachments, if any, within five (5) days of receipt of this Order. While under the terms of this Order, RESPONDENT SHALL notify all future employers in nursing and present each with a complete copy of this Order, including all attachments, if any, prior to accepting an offer of employment.

- B. Notification of Employment Forms: RESPONDENT SHALL CAUSE each present employer in nursing to submit the Board's "Notification of Employment" form to the Board's office within ten (10) days of receipt of this Order. RESPONDENT SHALL CAUSE each future employer to submit the Board's "Notification of Employment form" to the Board's office within five (5) days of employment as a nurse.
- C. Indirect Supervision: RESPONDENT SHALL be supervised by a Registered Nurse, if licensed as a Registered Nurse, or by a Licensed Vocational Nurse or a Registered Nurse, if licensed as a Licensed Vocational Nurse, who is on the premises. The supervising nurse is not required to be on the same unit or ward as RESPONDENT, but should be on the facility grounds and readily available to provide assistance and intervention if necessary. The supervising nurse shall have a minimum of two (2) years experience in the same or similar practice setting to which the Respondent is currently working. RESPONDENT SHALL work only regularly assigned, identified and predetermined unit(s). RESPONDENT SHALL NOT be employed by a nurse registry, temporary nurse employment agency, hospice, or home health agency. RESPONDENT SHALL NOT be self-employed or contract for services. Multiple employers are prohibited.
- D. Nursing Performance Evaluations: RESPONDENT SHALL CAUSE each employer to submit, on forms provided to the Respondent by the Board, periodic reports as to RESPONDENT'S capability to practice nursing. These reports shall be completed by the individual who supervises the RESPONDENT and these reports shall be submitted by the supervising individual to the office of the Board at the end of each three (3) month quarterly period for four (4) quarters [one (1) year] of employment as a nurse.

V. THERAPY

While working as a nurse under the terms of this Order, RESPONDENT SHALL participate in therapy with a professional counselor with credentials approved by the Board. RESPONDENT SHALL CAUSE the therapist to submit written reports, on forms provided by the Board, as to the RESPONDENT'S progress in therapy, rehabilitation and capability to safely practice nursing. The report must indicate whether or not the RESPONDENT'S stability is sufficient to provide direct

patient care safely. For the first three (3) month quarterly period RESPONDENT works as a nurse under the terms of this Order, reports are to be submitted to the Board each and every month. If therapy is recommended by the counselor for an additional period of time, the reports shall then be submitted to the Board at the end of each three (3) month quarterly period in which the RESPONDENT is working as a nurse under the terms of this Order, for the remainder of the term of the Order, or until RESPONDENT is dismissed from therapy, whichever is earlier.

VI. RESTORATION OF UNENCUMBERED LICENSE(S)

Upon full compliance with the terms of this Order, all encumbrances will be removed from RESPONDENT'S license(s) to practice nursing in the State of Texas and RESPONDENT may be eligible for nurse licensure compact privileges, if any.

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RESPONDENT'S CERTIFICATION

I understand that I have the right to legal counsel prior to signing this Agreed Order. I have reviewed this Order. I neither admit nor deny the violation(s) alleged herein. By my signature on this Order, I agree to the entry of this Order, and any conditions of said Order, to avoid fairther disciplinary action in this matter. I waive judicial review of this Order. I understand that when this Order becomes final and the terms of this Order become effective, a copy will be mailed to me I understand that if I fail to comply with all terms and conditions of this Order, I will be subject to investigation and disciplinary sanction, including possible revocation of my license(s) to practice nursing in the State of Texas, as a consequence of my noncompliance.

- 6. On or about April 11, 2013, Respondent was issued a Final Order by the State of Florida Board of Nursing, Tallahassee, Florida. A copy of the Stipulation, Settlement and Order dated April 11, 2013, is attached and incorporated by reference as part of this Order.
- 7. In response to Finding of Fact Number Six (6), Respondent states upon returning to work after being off for several weeks, he was met with a newly implemented computerized charting system. Respondent states the process became increasingly hard to manage due to the use of verbal, computer and traditional handwritten methods for implementing changes to the orders. Respondent states he voiced his concern and kept track via his paper charting; however, upon addressing the issue with the night supervisor, the conversation became overheated with Respondent stating he would not schedule himself again unless changes or assistance was provided to remedy the situation.

SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

Pursuant to Section 120.57(4), Florida Statutes, the above named parties hereby offer this Agreement to the Board of Nursing as disposition of the Administrative Complaint, attached hereto as Exhibit "A", in lieu of any other administrative proceedings. The terms herein become effective only if and when a Final Order accepting this Agreement is issued by the Board and filed. In considering this Agreement, the Board may review all investigative materials regarding this case. If this Agreement is rejected, it, and its presentation to the Board, shall not be used against either party.

STIPULATED FACTS

 Respondent is a Registered Nurse in the State of Florida holding license number 9296900.

- 2. The Respondent is charged by an Administrative Complaint filed by the Department and properly served upon Respondent with violations of Chapters 456 and/or 464, Florida Statutes. A true and correct copy of the Administrative Complaint is attached hereto and incorporated by reference as Exhibit A.
- Respondent neither admits nor denies the factual allegations contained in the Administrative Complaint.

STIPULATED LAW

- Respondent admits that he is subject to the provisions of Chapters 456 and 464, Florida Statutes, and the jurisdiction of the Department and the Board.
- 2. Respondent admits that the stipulated facts, if proven true, constitute violations of jaws as alleged in the Administrative Complaint.
- 3. Respondent admits that the Agreement is a fair, appropriate and reasonable resolution to this pending matter.

PROPOSED DISPOSITION

- 1. The Respondent must pay investigative costs not to exceed SIX THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED NINETY-SIX DOLLARS AND FORTY-SEVEN CENTS (\$6,596.47) within seven (7) years from the date of entry of the Final Order. Payment shall be made to the Board of Nursing and mailed to, DOH-Compliance Management Unit, 4052 Baid Cypress Way, Taliahassee, Florida 32399-3276, Attention: Nursing Compliance Officer.

 Payment must be made by cashier's check or money order ONLY.

 Personal Checks shall NOT be accepted.
- 2. The Respondent shall enroll in and successfully complete courses in Medication Administration (16 hours) and Documentation, to be completed before he appears before the Board. This shall be in addition to other normally required continuing education courses. Verification of course content and course completion must be submitted to the Nursing Compliance Officer within six (6) months from the date of this Order. The Board will retain jurisdiction for the purpose of enforcing continuing education requirements.

- 3. The license of **KAL BRADLEY MCMANUS**, **R.N.**, is suspended until Respondent personally appears before the Board and can demonstrate the present ability to engage in the safe practice of nursing. Within 30 days Respondent shall return the license to DOH-Compliance Management Unit, 4052 Bald Cypress Way, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-3276, Attention: Nursing Compliance Officer, or shall surrender the license to an investigator of the Department of Health. The Respondent shall immediately inform the employer in writing regarding the suspension with a copy to DOH-Compliance Management Unit, 4052 Bald Cypress Way, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-3276, Attention: Nursing Compliance Officer. The Board reserves the right to impose reasonable conditions of reinstatement at the time the Respondent appears before the Board to demonstrate her present ability to engage in the safe practice of nursing.
- 4. The Respondent shall not violate Chapter 456 or 464, Florida Statutes, the rules promulgated pursuant thereto, any other state or federal law, rule, or regulation relating to the practice or the ability to practice nursing. Violation of an order from another state/jurisdiction shall constitute grounds for violation of the Board Order adopting this Agreement.

- 5. It is expressly understood that this Agreement is subject to the approval of the Board and Department and has no force and effect until an Order is entered adopting the Agreement.
- 6. This Agreement is executed by the Respondent for the purpose of avoiding further administrative action by the Board of Nursing regarding the acts or omissions specifically set forth in the Administrative Complaint attached hereto. In this regard, Respondent authorizes the Board to review and examine all investigative file materials concerning Respondent prior to, or in conjunction with, consideration of the Agreement. Furthermore, should this joint Agreement not be accepted by the Board, it is agreed that presentation to, and consideration of, this Agreement and other documents and matters by the Board shall not unfairly or illegally prejudice the Board or any of its members from further participation, consideration or resolution of these proceedings. Respondent shall offer no evidence, testimony or argument that disputes or contravenes any stipulated fact or conclusion of law.
- 7. Respondent and the Department fully understand that this joint.

 Agreement and subsequent Final Order incorporating same will in no way

preclude additional proceedings by the Board and/or Department against the Respondent for acts or omissions not specifically set forth in the Administrative Complaint attached hereto. This Agreement relates solely to the current disciplinary proceedings arising from the above-mentioned Administrative Complaint and does not preclude further action by other divisions, departments, and/or sections of the Department, including but not limited to the Agency for Health Care Administration's Medicald Program Integrity Office.

- 8. The Respondent waives the right to seek any attorney's fees or costs from the Department In connection with this disciplinary proceeding.
- Respondent waives all rights to appeal and further review of this
 Agreement and these proceedings.


