

ORDER GRANTING MODIFICATION

On this day, the Executive Director, on behalf of the Texas Board of Nursing, hereinafter referred to as the Board, considered the Petition for Exception and supporting documents filed by DONIELLE RHIANNON PEREZ, Vocational Nurse License Number 314144, hereinafter referred to as PETITIONER. An Agreed Order of the Board was entered on December 13, 2016. Petitioner filed a Request for Exception to the Agreed Order on August 7, 2018.

After review and due consideration of Petitioner's request, pursuant to 22 Tex. Admin. Code §211.7(h), the Executive Director of the Board **GRANTS MODIFICATION** of the December 13, 2016, Agreed Order.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Petitioner is required to comply with and complete all of the requirements of the December 13, 2016, Agreed Order, except that Stipulation(s) Number Five (5), Subsection C is/are modified as follows:

C. Indirect Supervision: While under the remaining terms of this Order, RESPONDENT SHALL be supervised by a physician or Registered Nurse, if licensed and practicing as a Registered Nurse, or by a physician, Licensed Vocational Nurse, or Registered Nurse, if licensed and practicing as a Licensed Vocational Nurse, who is on the premises. The supervising physician or nurse is not required to be on the same unit or ward as RESPONDENT, but should be on the facility grounds and readily available to provide assistance and intervention

if necessary. The supervising physician or nurse shall have a minimum of two (2) years

experience in the same or similar setting to which the RESPONDENT is currently working.

RESPONDENT SHALL work only regularly assigned, identified and predetermined units(s).

RESPONDENT SHALL NOT be employed by a nurse registry, temporary nurse employment

agency, hospice, or home health agency. RESPONDENT SHALL NOT be self-employed or

contract for services. Multiple employers are prohibited.

D. Nursing Performance Evaluations: While under the remaining terms of this

Order, RESPONDENT SHALL CAUSE each employer to submit, on forms provided to the

RESPONDENT by the Board, periodic reports as to RESPONDENT'S capability to practice

nursing. These reports shall be completed by the physician or nurse who supervises the

RESPONDENT. These reports shall be submitted by the supervising physician or nurse to the

office of the Board at the end of each three (3) month quarterly period for two (2) quarters [six

(6) months] of employment as a nurse.

All other terms and conditions of the December 13, 2016, Agreed Order remain

unchanged and Petitioner is responsible for complying with those terms as written.
