We have received information you were physically incarcerated in the Institutional Division of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice beginning approximately April 4, 2019, based on your conviction of 3 counts of HEALTH CARE FRAUD, AIDING AND ABETTING and CONSPIRACY TO COMMIT HEALTH CARE FRAUD, both Felony offense, in the U.S. District Court Southern District of Texas, under Cause No. 4:16CR00254-001.

Therefore, pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Chapter 53.021(b), Permanent Registered Nurse License Number 735635, and Permanent Vocational Nurse License Number 173954 were revoked, by operation of law, on April 4, 2019, the date that your incarceration commenced.

You are entitled to a formal Complaint, Notice of Hearing, and a hearing in which you may present evidence to show that you are not physically incarcerated or have not been physically incarcerated due to your felony conviction(s) or felony probation revocation. You are also entitled to representation by an attorney if you desire. In the event you are not physically incarcerated or have not been physically incarcerated, your written request for a hearing before the State Office of Administrative Hearings must be received in this office within twenty (20) days of receipt of this letter.

Please be advised that you may not practice as a nurse or engage in any activities that require a license issued by this Board. Should you desire to return to the practice of nursing in Texas, you may contact our office to request a reinstatement petition. However, you will not be eligible for reinstatement until: at least one (1) year has elapsed from the effective date of your revocation, and you are released from imprisonment. Any reinstatement will then be subject to the regulations in effect at that time.
