On this day the Texas Board of Nursing, hereinafter referred to as the Board, considered the matter of AMITH VARGHESE ALIAS, Registered Nurse License Number 933071, hereinafter referred to as Respondent.

Information received by the Board produced evidence that Respondent may be subject to discipline pursuant to Section 301.452(b)(10)&(13), Texas Occupations Code.

Respondent waived notice and hearing and agreed to the entry of this Agreed Order for KSTAR Program approved by Katherine A. Thomas, MN, RN, FAAN, Executive Director, on May 11, 2020.

#### FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Prior to the institution of Agency proceedings, notice of the matters specified below in these Findings of Fact was served on Respondent and Respondent was given an opportunity to show compliance with all requirements of the law for retention of the license(s).
- 2. Respondent waived notice and hearing, and agreed to the entry of this Agreed Order for KSTAR Program.
- 3. Respondent's license to practice as a professional nurse in the State of Texas is in current status.
- 4. Respondent received a Baccalaureate Degree in Nursing from Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karavali College of Nursing, Mangalore, India, on March 1, 2009. Respondent was licensed to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas on October 26, 2017.

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5. Respondent's nursing employment history includes:

10/2017 – 12/2017 Registered Nurse UT Southwestern Medical Center Dallas, Texas

1/2018 – 5/2019 Registered Nurse First Texas Hospital of Carrollton Carrollton, Texas

6/2019 - Present Unknown

- 6. At the time of the incident, Respondent was employed as a Registered Nurse with First Texas Hospital of Carrollton, Carrollton, Texas, and had been in that position for one (1) year and four (4) months.
- 7. On or about May 23, 2019, through May 24, 2019, while employed as a Registered Nurse at First Texas Hospital of Carrollton, Carrollton, Texas, Respondent failed to check the blood glucose levels for Patient Visit Number 0263356 at midnight and 06:00, as ordered. Subsequently, the patient's early morning laboratory results indicated that the blood glucose level for the patient was 361, which Respondent failed to treat despite physician orders to administer insulin per Sliding Scale Diabetic Protocol. Respondent's conduct was likely to injure the patient in that the failure to follow physician orders resulted in non-efficacious treatment and placed the patient at risk from untreated hyperglycemia.
- 8. In response to the incident in Finding of Fact Number Seven (7), Respondent states that the patient arrived to his unit from the Emergency Department with hypertension and intractable vomiting, which he treated with medication. Respondent states that the patient's orders for blood sugar level monitoring were with meals, at bedtime, and as needed. Respondent states that the patient's blood sugar levels were normal before dinner and before bedtime. Respondent states he skipped the midnight blood sugar level because the patient was sleeping. Respondent states that the patient had blood drawn for ordered laboratory tests around 05:00, and he went to check her blood sugar level around 06:00, but the patient was sleeping again. Respondent states that the laboratory values were available and he requested the oncoming shift's nurse to check the 06:00 blood sugar level and cover with insulin per sliding scale orders since the patient was sleeping.

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. Pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Sections 301.451-301.555, the Board has jurisdiction over this matter.
- 2. Notice was served in accordance with law.
- 3. The evidence received is sufficient to prove violation(s) of 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.11(1)(A),(1)(B),(1)(C)&(1)(M) and 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(1)(B)&(4).

- 4. The evidence received is sufficient cause pursuant to Section 301.452(b)(10)&(13), Texas Occupations Code, to take disciplinary action against Registered Nurse License Number 933071, heretofore issued to AMITH VARGHESE ALIAS.
- 5. Pursuant to Section 301.463(d), Texas Occupations Code, this Agreed Order is a settlement agreement under Rule 408, Texas Rules of Evidence, in civil or criminal litigation.

## **TERMS OF ORDER**

## I. SANCTION AND APPLICABILITY

IT IS THEREFORE AGREED and ORDERED that RESPONDENT SHALL receive the sanction of WARNING WITH STIPULATIONS in accordance with the terms of this Order.

- A. This Order SHALL apply to any and all future licenses issued to RESPONDENT to practice nursing in the State of Texas.
- B. This Order SHALL be applicable to RESPONDENT'S nurse licensure compact privileges, if any, to practice nursing in the State of Texas.
- C. As a result of this Order, RESPONDENT'S license(s) will be designated "single state" as applicable and RESPONDENT may not work outside the State of Texas in another nurse licensure compact party state using a Texas compact license.

## II. COMPLIANCE WITH LAW

While under the terms of this Order, RESPONDENT agrees to comply in all respects with the Nursing Practice Act, Texas Occupations Code, §§301.001 *et seq.*, the Rules and Regulations Relating to Nursing Education, Licensure and Practice, 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §§211.1 *et seq.*, and this Agreed Order for KSTAR Program.

# III. KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, TRAINING, ASSESSMENT AND RESEARCH (KSTAR) PROGRAM

IT IS AGREED and ORDERED that RESPONDENT SHALL, within one (1) year of the effective date of this Order, successfully complete the Knowledge, Skills,

Training, Assessment and Research (KSTAR) Program and RESPONDENT SHALL:

- A. Within forty-five (45) days following the effective date of this Order, apply to and enroll in the KSTAR Program, including payment of any fees and costs, unless otherwise agreed in writing;
- B. Submit to an individualized assessment designed to evaluate RESPONDENT'S nursing practice competency and to support a targeted remediation plan;
- C. Follow all requirements within the remediation plan, if any;
- D. Successfully complete a Board-approved course in Texas nursing jurisprudence and ethics as part of the KSTAR Program; and
- E. Provide written documentation of successful completion of the KSTAR Program to the attention of Monitoring at the Board's office.

## IV. FURTHER COMPETENCY ISSUES AND VIOLATIONS

IT IS FURTHER AGREED, SHOULD RESPONDENT'S individualized KSTAR Program assessment identify further competency issues and violations of the Nursing Practice Act, including inability to practice nursing safely, further disciplinary action, up to and including revocation of RESPONDENT'S license(s) to practice nursing in the State of Texas, may be taken based on such results in the assessments.

## V. RESTORATION OF UNENCUMBERED LICENSE(S)

Upon full compliance with the terms of this Agreed Order for KSTAR Program, all encumbrances will be removed from RESPONDENT'S license(s) and/or privilege(s) to practice nursing in the State of Texas and, subject to meeting all existing eligibility requirements in Texas Occupations Code Chapter 304, Article III, RESPONDENT may be eligible for nurse licensure compact privileges, if any.

## RESPONDENT'S CERTIFICATION

I understand that I have the right to legal counsel prior to signing this Order. I waive representation by counsel. I have reviewed this Order. I neither admit nor deny the violation(s) alleged herein. By my signature on this Order, I agree to the entry of this Order, and any conditions of said Order, to avoid further disciplinary action in this matter. I waive judicial review of this Order. I understand that this Order is subject to ratification by the Texas Board of Nursing and a copy of this Order will be mailed to me once the Order becomes effective. I understand that if I fail to comply with all terms and conditions of this Order, I will be subject to investigation and disciplinary sanction, including possible revocation of my license(s) and/or privileges to practice nursing in the State of Texas, as a consequence of my noncompliance.


