On this day the Texas Board of Nursing, hereinafter referred to as the Board, considered the matter of CALLEN MORAA JAMES, Vocational Nurse License Number 340075, hereinafter referred to as Respondent.

Information received by the Board produced evidence that Respondent may be subject to discipline pursuant to Section 301.452(b)(5)&(10), Texas Occupations Code.

Respondent waived notice and hearing and agreed to the entry of this Agreed Order approved by Katherine A. Thomas, MN, RN, FAAN, Executive Director, on September 29, 2020.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Prior to the institution of Agency proceedings, notice of the matters specified below in these Findings of Fact was served on Respondent and Respondent was given an opportunity to show compliance with all requirements of the law for retention of the license(s).
2. Respondent waived notice and hearing, and agreed to the entry of this Agreed Order.
3. Respondent's license to practice as a vocational nurse in the State of Texas is in current status.
4. Respondent received a Certificate in Vocational Nursing from Rakai Community School of Nursing, Kyotera, Uganda on May 1, 2013. Respondent was licensed to practice vocational nursing in the State of Texas on October 10, 2017.
5. Respondent's nursing employment history includes:

10/2017 – 2/2019 Unknown

2/2019 – 3/2020 Licensed Vocational Nurse Piney Forest Health & Rehab Center
Danville, Virginia

Respondent's nursing employment history continued:

3/2020 - Present Unknown

6. On or about November 1, 2010, Respondent submitted an application for enrollment in which she provided falsified, forged or otherwise mutilated documents in order to be admitted to the nursing program at Rakai Community School of Nursing, Kyotera, Uganda. On or about October 10, 2017, Respondent became licensed to practice vocational nursing in the State of Texas. Subsequently, on or about September 9, 2019, Respondent's nursing certificate from Rakai Community School of Nursing, Kyotera, Uganda, became invalid and is no longer recognized by the nursing school. Respondent's conduct misled patients, their families, fellow care givers, and the public into believing Respondent's nursing practice was in compliance with all Board Rules and Regulations.
7. On or about February 19, 2020, through March 5, 2020, while employed as a Licensed Vocational Nurse (LVN) with Piney Forest Health and Rehabilitation Center, Danville, Virginia, Respondent was practicing vocational nursing without a multi-state privilege from Texas. Respondent's conduct was likely to deceive her employer regarding Respondent's compliance with nurse licensure compact requirements and provisions, in that they relied on the Multistate Licensure Compact Privilege associated with Respondent's Texas license to continue her employment as a Licensed Vocational Nurse.
8. In response to Findings of Fact Numbers Six (6) through Seven (7), Respondent states all documents she attained are true. Respondent states she has never falsified any document. Respondent states she apologizes for practicing at Piney Forest Health and Rehabilitation Center as a Licensed Vocational Nurse without a multi-state privilege. Respondent states she did not know that when she changed her residential address from Harlingen, TX to Danville, VA, was going to affect her compact license
9. Formal Charges were filed on January 9, 2020.
10. First Amended Formal Charges were filed September 29, 2020.
11. Respondent by her signature expresses her desire to voluntary surrender the licenses.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Sections 301.451-301.555, the Board has jurisdiction over this matter.
2. Notice was served in accordance with law.

3. The evidence received is sufficient to prove violation(s) of 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(6)(H),(6)(I)&(11)(B) and 220.1.
4. The evidence received is sufficient cause pursuant to Section 301.452(b)(5)&(10), Texas Occupations Code, to take disciplinary action against Vocational Nurse License Number 340075, heretofore issued to CALLEN MORAA JAMES.
5. Pursuant to Section 301.463(d), Texas Occupations Code, this Agreed Order is a settlement agreement under Rule 408, Texas Rules of Evidence, in civil or criminal litigation.

TERMS OF ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED and ORDERED that the VOLUNTARY SURRENDER of Vocational Nurse License Number 340075 is accepted by the Texas Board of Nursing. In connection with this acceptance, the Board imposes the following conditions:

1. RESPONDENT SHALL NOT practice vocational nursing, use the title "vocational nurse" or the abbreviation "LVN" or wear any insignia identifying herself as a vocational nurse or use any designation which, directly or indirectly, would lead any person to believe that RESPONDENT is a vocational nurse during the period in which the license is surrendered.
2. RESPONDENT SHALL NOT petition for reinstatement of licensure until at least one (1) year has elapsed from the date of this Order.
3. Upon petitioning for reinstatement, RESPONDENT SHALL satisfy all then existing requirements for relicensure.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that this Order SHALL be applicable to Respondent's nurse licensure compact privileges, if any, to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

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RESPONDENT'S CERTIFICATION

I understand that I have the right to legal counsel prior to signing this Order. I waive representation by counsel. I have reviewed this Order. I neither admit nor deny the violation(s) alleged herein. By my signature on this Order, I agree to the entry of this Order, and any conditions of said Order, to avoid further disciplinary action in this matter. I waive judicial review of this Order. I understand that this Order becomes effective upon acceptance by the Executive Director on behalf of the Texas Board of Nursing and a copy will be mailed to me. I understand that if I fail to comply with all terms and conditions of this Order, I will be subject to investigation and disciplinary sanction, including possible revocation of my license(s) and/or privileges to practice nursing in the State of Texas, as a consequence of my noncompliance.

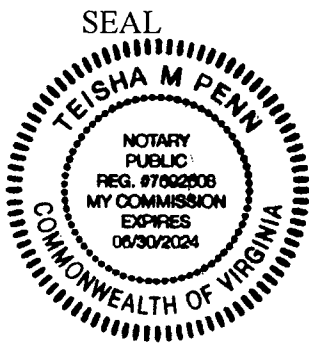


