On this day the Texas Board of Nursing, hereinafter referred to as the Board, considered the matter of DIANNA KRODELL, Registered Nurse License Number 655991, and Vocational Nurse License Number 145516, hereinafter referred to as Respondent.

Information received by the Board produced evidence that Respondent may be subject to discipline pursuant to Section 301.452(b)(10)&(13), Texas Occupations Code.

Respondent waived notice and hearing and agreed to the entry of this Agreed Order approved by Katherine A. Thomas, MN, RN, FAAN, Executive Director, on November 30, 2020.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Prior to the institution of Agency proceedings, notice of the matters specified below in these Findings of Fact was served on Respondent and Respondent was given an opportunity to show compliance with all requirements of the law for retention of the license(s).
2. Respondent waived notice and hearing, and agreed to the entry of this Agreed Order.
3. Respondent's license to practice as a vocational nurse in the State of Texas is in delinquent status. Respondent's license to practice as a professional nurse in the State of Texas is in current status.
4. Respondent received a Certificate in Vocational Nursing from Grayson County College, Denison, Texas, on August 20, 1993. Respondent received an Associate Degree in Nursing from Grayson County College, Denison, Texas, on May 1, 1998. Respondent was licensed to practice vocational nursing in the State of Texas on December 1, 1993. Respondent was licensed to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas on October 27, 1998.

6. On or about September 12, 1995, Respondent was issued the sanction of Probation through an Order of the Board. On or about September 13, 1996, Respondent successfully completed the terms of the Order. A copy of the September 12, 1995, Order is attached and incorporated herein by reference as part of this Agreed Order.
7. On or about December 9, 1997, Respondent was issued the sanction of Stipulations through an Order of the Board. On or about June 30, 2000, Respondent successfully completed the terms of the Order. A copy of the December 9, 1997, Order is attached and incorporated herein by reference as part of this Agreed Order.
8. At the time of the incident, Respondent was employed as a Registered Nurse with Texoma Medical Center, Denison, Texas, and had been in that position for three (3) years and ten (10) months.

9. On or about April 4, 2020, while employed as a Registered Nurse (RN) in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU) of Texoma Medical Center, Denison, Texas, Respondent knowingly entered the room of Patient Number 223505, who was under investigation for COVID-19, without wearing an N95 respirator face mask, as mandated during the national pandemic. Respondent's conduct unnecessarily exposed the patients, the patient's families, her co-workers, and herself to a risk of contracting COVID-19.
10. In response to Finding of Fact Number Nine (9), Respondent states this was her first COVID patient, and the patient was very anxious and requested something to help her sleep. Respondent states she administered Restoril but the patient suddenly raised out of bed, threw her legs over the bed between the side rails and mattress, and began waving her arms above her head. Respondent states she responded rapidly with PPE consisting of a bonnet, goggles, surgical mask, gown, and 2 pairs of gloves, and rushed to the patient's bedside because she feared the patient would climb out of bed or fall.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Sections 301.451-301.555, the Board has jurisdiction over this matter.
2. Notice was served in accordance with law.
3. The evidence received is sufficient to prove violation(s) of 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.11(1)(A),(1)(B)&(1)(O) and 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(1)(A),(1)(B)&(4).
4. The evidence received is sufficient cause pursuant to Section 301.452(b)(10)&(13), Texas Occupations Code, to take disciplinary action against Registered Nurse License Number 655991, and Vocational Nurse License Number 145516, heretofore issued to DIANNA KRODELL.
5. Pursuant to Section 301.463(d), Texas Occupations Code, this Agreed Order is a settlement agreement under Rule 408, Texas Rules of Evidence, in civil or criminal litigation.

TERMS OF ORDER

I. SANCTION AND APPLICABILITY

IT IS THEREFORE AGREED and ORDERED that RESPONDENT SHALL receive the sanction of **WARNING WITH STIPULATIONS** in accordance with the terms of this Order.

- A. This Order SHALL apply to any and all future licenses issued to RESPONDENT to practice nursing in the State of Texas.
- B. This Order SHALL be applicable to RESPONDENT'S nurse licensure compact privileges, if any, to practice nursing in the State of Texas.
- C. As a result of this Order, RESPONDENT'S license(s) will be designated "single state" as applicable and RESPONDENT may not work outside the State of Texas in another nurse licensure compact party state using a Texas compact license.

II. COMPLIANCE WITH LAW

While under the terms of this Order, RESPONDENT agrees to comply in all respects with the Nursing Practice Act, Texas Occupations Code, §§301.001 *et seq.*, the Rules and Regulations Relating to Nursing Education, Licensure and Practice, 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §§211.1 *et seq.*, and this Agreed Order.

III. UNDERSTANDING BOARD ORDERS

Within thirty (30) days of entry of this Order, RESPONDENT must successfully complete the Board's online course, "Understanding Board Orders", which can be accessed on the Board's website from the "Discipline & Complaints" drop-down menu or directly at: <http://www.bon.texas.gov/UnderstandingBoardOrders/index.asp>. Upon successful completion, RESPONDENT must submit the course verification at the conclusion of the course, which automatically transmits the verification to the Board.

IV. REMEDIAL EDUCATION COURSE(S)

In addition to any continuing education requirements the Board may require for licensure renewal, RESPONDENT SHALL successfully complete the following remedial education course(s) within one (1) year of the effective date of this Order, unless otherwise specifically indicated:

- A. **A Board-approved course in Texas nursing jurisprudence and ethics** that shall be a minimum of six (6) hours in length. The course's content shall include the Nursing Practice Act, standards of practice, documentation of care, principles of nursing ethics, confidentiality, professional boundaries, and the Board's Disciplinary Sanction Policies regarding: Sexual Misconduct; Fraud, Theft, and Deception; Nurses with Substance Abuse, Misuse, Substance Dependency, or other Substance Use Disorder; and Lying and Falsification. Courses focusing on malpractice issues will not be accepted. Home study and video programs will not be approved.

- B. **The course "Sharpening Critical Thinking Skills,"** a 3.6 contact hour online program provided by the National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) Learning Extension.

In order to receive credit for completion of this/these course(s), RESPONDENT SHALL CAUSE the instructor to submit a Verification of Course Completion form or SHALL submit the continuing education certificate, as applicable, to the attention of Monitoring at the Board's office. RESPONDENT SHALL first obtain Board approval of any course prior to enrollment if the course is not being offered by a pre-approved provider. *Information about Board-approved courses and Verification of Course Completion forms are available from the Board at www.bon.texas.gov/compliance.*

V. **EMPLOYMENT REQUIREMENTS**

In order to complete the terms of this Order, RESPONDENT must work as a nurse in the State of Texas, providing direct patient care in a clinical healthcare setting, for a minimum of sixty-four (64) hours per month for four (4) quarterly periods [one (1) year] of employment. This requirement will not be satisfied until four (4) quarterly periods of employment as a nurse have elapsed. Periods of unemployment or of employment that do not require the use of a registered nurse (RN) or a vocational nurse (LVN) license, as appropriate, will not apply to this period and will not count towards completion of this requirement.

- A. **Notifying Present and Future Employers:** RESPONDENT SHALL notify each present employer in nursing and present each with a complete copy of this Order, including all attachments, if any, within five (5) days of receipt of this Order. While under the terms of this Order, RESPONDENT SHALL notify all future

employers in nursing and present each with a complete copy of this Order, including all attachments, if any, prior to accepting an offer of employment.

- B. **Notification of Employment Forms:** RESPONDENT SHALL CAUSE each present employer in nursing to submit the Board's "Notification of Employment" form to the Board's office within ten (10) days of receipt of this Order. RESPONDENT SHALL CAUSE each future employer to submit the Board's "Notification of Employment form" to the Board's office within five (5) days of employment as a nurse.
- C. **Incident Reporting:** RESPONDENT SHALL CAUSE each employer to immediately submit any and all incident, counseling, variance, unusual occurrence, and medication or other error reports involving RESPONDENT, as well as documentation of any internal investigations regarding action by RESPONDENT, to the attention of Monitoring at the Board's office.
- D. **Nursing Performance Evaluations:** RESPONDENT SHALL CAUSE each employer to submit, on forms provided to the RESPONDENT by the Board, periodic reports as to RESPONDENT'S capability to practice nursing. These reports shall be completed by the individual who supervises the RESPONDENT and these reports shall be submitted by the supervising individual to the office of the Board at the end of each three (3) month quarterly period for four (4) quarters [one (1) year] of employment as a nurse.

VI. RESTORATION OF UNENCUMBERED LICENSE(S)

Upon full compliance with the terms of this Agreed Order, all encumbrances will be removed from RESPONDENT'S license(s) and/or privilege(s) to practice nursing in the State of Texas and, subject to meeting all existing eligibility requirements in Texas Occupations Code Chapter 304, Article III, RESPONDENT may be eligible for nurse licensure compact privileges, if any.

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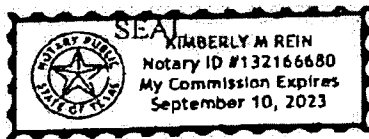

ORDER
OF ELIGIBILITY

CONDITIONAL ELIGIBILITY ORDER

On the date entered below, the Executive Director of the Board of Nurse Examiners, Katherine A. Thomas, MN, RN, considered the Petition for Declaratory Order and supporting documents filed by DIANNA ANN SMITH together with any documents and information gathered by staff, the staff summary and Petitioner's certificate contained herein, and makes the following findings of fact and conclusions of law.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. On or about September 5, 1996, Petitioner submitted a Petition for Declaratory Order in compliance with Article 4519a(a), Texas Revised Civil Statutes, Annotated, as amended.
2. Petitioner is currently enrolled in an educational program that prepares her for initial licensure as a professional nurse in the State of Texas. Petitioner expected date of graduation is May of 1997.
3. Petitioner waived notice and hearing.
4. On or about February 26, 1991, in the County Court at Law Number 3, Collin County, Texas, in Cause Number 3-1211-90, Petitioner was convicted of Driving While Intoxicated (DWI). DWI is not a crime of moral turpitude and is not a ground for denial under Article 4525 (b), Tex. Rev. Civ. Stat. Ann. Petitioner met the conditions of the Court on or about January 4, 1993.
5. Petitioner is a licensed vocational nurse in the State of Texas and her license is current until October 31, 1997.
6. Petitioner disclosed that she had disciplinary action taken against her license by the Board of Vocational Nurse Examiners for the State of Texas.

7. On or about September 12, 1995, Petitioner's license to practice vocational nursing was suspended for unprofessional conduct. The suspension was stayed and Petitioner's license was placed on probation with stipulations for one year.
8. The unprofessional conduct which led to the discipline by the Board of Vocational Nurse Examiners is as follows:

In a smoke-free facility, on or about September 13, 1994, Petitioner had given a nursing home resident a cigarette and lighter. Said resident returned to his room where he was found to have set himself on fire. Subsequently, the resident was transferred to the hospital where he expired.
9. On or about September 13, 1996, Petitioner successfully completed the terms of her probation with the Board of Vocational Nurse Examiners.
10. The Executive Director considered the evidence of Petitioner's behavior since September 13, 1994, as submitted by Petitioner. In light of Petitioner's successful completion of the terms of her probation with the Board of Vocational Nurse Examiners and the character factors set out in 22 Texas Administrative Code, § 213.27(b), the Executive Director has determined that Petitioner has exhibited an ability to conform her behavior to the requirements the Nursing Practice Act and general nursing standards.
11. Petitioner has been advised by the Board that any information found to be incomplete, incorrect or misleading, will be considered and may result in an ultimate determination of ineligibility prior to licensure or the later revocation of a license deemed to have been obtained through fraud or deceit.
12. The Executive Director finds that Petitioner should be declared conditionally eligible to take the NCLEX-RN.
13. In consideration of the past adverse action by the Board of Vocational Nurse Examiners, the Executive Director further finds that the stipulations hereinafter set forth are necessary to assure that the public will be protected and that Petitioner will continue to conform her conduct to the requirements of the Board's nursing practice standards.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Board of Nurse Examiners has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to Texas Revised Civil Statutes, Annotated, as amended, Article 4525(a).
2. Petitioner has submitted a petition in compliance with TEX. REV. CIV. STAT. ANN., as amended, Article 4519a(a).
3. The Board may license an individual who has been previously convicted of a crime upon consideration of the factors set out in 22 Texas Administrative Code, §213.28 and evaluating the direct relationship to nursing according to Article 6252-13c(b) TEX. REV. CIV. STAT. ANN., as amended.
4. The action taken by the Board of Vocational Nurse Examiners against Petitioner's license to practice vocational nursing is a potential ground for denial of a license under Article 4525(b)(7), TEX. REV. CIV. STAT. ANN., as amended. If the Board is satisfied that Petitioner is able to meet the requirements of the Nursing Practice Act, the Board's Rules and Regulations, and generally accepted standards of nursing practice, the Board may license an individual who has had disciplinary action taken against her by another licensing agency.
5. The Board may license an individual with prior behaviors inconsistent with the Board's character requirements if, upon evaluation of the factors in 22 Texas Administrative Code, §213.27, the Board is satisfied that the individual is able to consistently conform her conduct to the requirements of the Nursing Practice Act, the Board's Rules and Regulations, and generally accepted standards of nursing practice including, but not limited to, behaviors indicating: honesty, accountability, trustworthiness, reliability and integrity.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that upon meeting the requirements for graduation and payment of necessary fees, DIANNA ANN SMITH is declared conditionally eligible to sit for the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses subject to the reservations set out above.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that upon attaining a passing grade on the NCLEX-RN, Petitioner shall be issued a CODED LICENSE to practice nursing in the State of Texas which is also subject to the reservations set out above and subject to the following STIPULATIONS:

1. Within one year of Petitioner's initial licensure date, Petitioner shall successfully complete a Board approved course in Nursing Jurisprudence.

Petitioner's license shall be subject to the following stipulations for TWO (2) years. These remaining stipulations [(2) through (5c)] may only be satisfied while Petitioner is employed as a registered nurse in a clinical practice setting.

2. Petitioner SHALL notify each present employer in professional nursing of this Order of the Board and the stipulations on Petitioner's license. Petitioner SHALL present a copy of this order to each present employer within five (5) days of notification of this Order. Petitioner SHALL notify all potential employers in professional nursing of this Order of the Board and the stipulations on Petitioner's license. Petitioner SHALL present a copy of this Order to each potential employer prior to employment.
3. Petitioner SHALL CAUSE each present employer in professional nursing to submit the Notification of Employment form to the Board's office within ten (10) days of notification of this Order. Petitioner SHALL CAUSE each potential employer to submit the Notification of Employment form to the Board's office within five (5) days of employment as a professional nurse.
4. Petitioner SHALL CAUSE each employer to submit, on forms provided by the Board, periodic reports as to Petitioner's capability to practice professional nursing. These reports shall be completed by the registered nurse who supervises the Petitioner. These reports shall be submitted to the office of the Board at the end of each three (3) months for one (1) year of employment as a professional nurse. For the remaining year of the stipulation period, the reports shall submitted to the office of the Board at the end of each six (6) months.
- 5a. Petitioner SHALL work only regularly assigned, identified and predetermined unit(s). Petitioner SHALL NOT be employed by a nurse registry, temporary nurse employment agency or home health agency. Petitioner SHALL NOT be self employed or contract for services. Multiple employers are prohibited.
- 5b. For the first year under the Eligibility Order, Petitioner must have the direct supervision of an experienced registered nurse. Direct supervision means an RN is readily available for consultation and assistance.
- 5c. For the remaining year of Petitioner's Board Order, Petitioner SHALL be supervised by a registered nurse who is on the premises.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that Petitioner SHALL comply in all respects with the Nursing Practice Act, Revised Civil Statutes of Texas, as amended, Article 4513 et seq., the Rules and Regulations Relating to Professional Nurse Education, Licensure and Practice, 22 Texas Administrative Code, §211.01 et seq.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that upon full compliance with the terms of this Order, Petitioner may be issued an unencumbered license to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas.

PETITIONER'S CERTIFICATE

I am the Petitioner in this matter. I have fully and truthfully disclosed all of my past convictions and I have caused a complete and accurate criminal history to be submitted to the Board of Nurse Examiners from each jurisdiction in which I have been convicted. I certify that my past behavior, except as disclosed in my Petition for Declaratory Order has been in conformity with the Board's professional character rule. I have provided the Board with complete and accurate documentation of my past behavior in violation of the penal law of any jurisdiction which was disposed of through any procedure short of conviction such as conditional discharge, deferred adjudication or dismissal. I have no criminal prosecution pending in any jurisdiction.

In connection with my petition, I acknowledge that I have read and I understand Article 4525(a) and (b), Texas Revised Civil Statutes, Annotated, as amended, and Board Rules at 213.27 and 213.28, 22 Texas Administrative Code which are incorporated by reference as a part of this Order. I agree with all terms of this Order including the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and any stipulations. I agree to inform the Board of any other grounds for denial of licensure prior to registering for the NCLEX-RN or accepting any permit or license from the Board of Nurse Examiners.

I understand that I can be represented by an attorney in this matter. I waive representation, notice and hearing and request that the Executive Director of the Board of Nurse Examiners enter this Order.

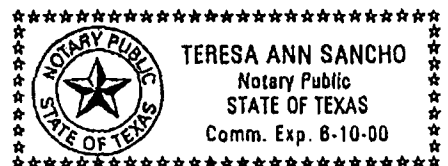



AGREED BOARD ORDER

On this day came to be considered by the Board of Vocational Nurse Examiners the matter of vocational nurse license number 145516, held by DIANNA ANN SMITH, hereinafter called Respondent.

By letter, the Board of Vocational Nurse Examiners sent preliminary notice to Respondent of its intent to take disciplinary action with respect to said license held by Respondent, as a result of a complaint and subsequent investigation. Said investigation produced evidence indicating that Respondent has engaged in unprofessional or dishonorable conduct that, in the opinion of the Board, is likely to deceive, defraud, or injure the public, in violation of Article 4528c, Section 10 (a) (9), Revised Civil Statutes of Texas in the following manner:

- a. Respondent was employed as a Licensed Vocational Nurse at Integrated Health Systems of Texoma in Sherman, Texas, from about March 2, 1994 through about September 19, 1994.
- b. While so employed with Integrated Health Systems of Texoma said facility had a Smoking Policy. Said policy stated in part, Shady Oaks is a smoke-free facility.
- c. On or about March 23, 1994, Respondent endorsed her Orientation Training Inventory Said Orientation Training Inventory, included, in part orientation as to "Safety & Fire". Furthermore, said Inventory stated in part, that major causes of nursing home fires were caused by unsupervised patient smoking.

By Respondent's signature on this Order, Respondent acknowledges that they have read and understood this Order and have approved it for consideration by the Board.

By their notarized signature on this Order, Respondent does hereby waive the right to a formal Complaint, Notice of Hearing and a Public Hearing held before an Administrative Law Judge with the State Office of Administrative Hearings, and to judicial review of this disciplinary action. Notice of this disciplinary action will appear in the Board's newsletter sent to Texas employers.

ORDER OF THE BOARD

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that license number 145516, heretofore issued to DIANNA ANN SMITH, to practice vocational nursing in the State of Texas be, and the same is hereby suspended, with said suspension stayed and placed on probation for a period one (1) year.

The probation of said license is subject to the following stipulations, to wit:

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
1. That if Respondent's place of employment, name, address or telephone number changes, Respondent is to notify the Board office immediately, or no later than ten (10) days after said change has occurred. Said notification shall be in the form of a written letter or report.
2. That Respondent shall comply with Federal, State, and local laws, and all the provisions of the Vocational Nurse Act and Rules and Regulations of the Board.
3. That by copy of this Board Order, Respondent shall provide notice of Board disciplinary action to her nursing employer(s) throughout the term of probation.
4. That Respondent shall cause her nursing employer(s) to submit satisfactory reports directly to the Board office on a monthly basis for the first six (6) months of probation. Thereafter, and throughout the remainder of said probation, Respondent shall cause her nursing employer(s) to submit satisfactory reports directly to the Board office on a quarterly basis.
5. That any period(s) of unemployment must be documented in writing by Respondent and submitted to the Board office, as provided in Stipulation No. 4.
6. That Respondent shall not be employed by a nurse registry/temporary nurse agency or as a private duty nurse throughout the term of probation.
7. That Respondent shall successfully complete nursing program course(s) encompassing the following areas of study: Legal Aspects of Nursing (to include Charting, & Patient Confidentiality), and submit documentation of successful course completion to the Board office prior to the end of probation. Respondent shall be responsible for locating said course(s) and obtaining approval of Board staff prior to committing to said course(s). Said course(s) shall be correspondence (through a recognized provider), in-house at a community college, university or nursing program, and/or tutored by a state approved, licensed nursing program faculty member. The expense of said course(s) shall be borne by Respondent.


