On this day the Texas Board of Nursing, hereinafter referred to as the Board, considered the matter of SHANIQUA TENNILLE THOMPSON, Vocational Nurse License Number 187419, hereinafter referred to as Respondent.

Information received by the Board produced evidence that Respondent may be subject to discipline pursuant to Sections 301.452(b)(3) & 301.4535(a)(7), Texas Occupations Code.

Respondent waived notice and hearing and agreed to the entry of this Agreed Order approved by Katherine A. Thomas, MN, RN, FAAN, Executive Director, on June 8, 2021.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Prior to the institution of Agency proceedings, notice of the matters specified below in these Findings of Fact was served on Respondent and Respondent was given an opportunity to show compliance with all requirements of the law for retention of the license(s).
- 2. Respondent waived notice and hearing, and agreed to the entry of this Agreed Order.
- 3. Respondent's license to practice as a vocational nurse in the State of Texas is in current status.
- 4. Respondent received a Certificate in Vocational Nursing from McLennan Community College, Waco, Texas, on August 16, 2002. Respondent was licensed to practice vocational nursing in the State of Texas on December 19, 2002.
- 5. Respondent's nursing employment history includes:

12/2002 - 7/2020

Unknown

8/2020 - Present

Nurse

St. Anthony's Care Center Woodway, Texas

- 6. On or about December 3, 2020, Respondent plead guilty to INJURY TO AN ELDERLY INDIVIDUAL, a 3rd Degree Felony offense under Section 22.04, Penal Code, in the 54th District Court, McLennan County, Texas, Case No. 2020-970-C2. As a result of Respondent's plea, Respondent was placed on deferred adjudication probation for a period of three (3) years.
- 7. Respondent by her signature expresses her desire to voluntary surrender the licenses.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. Pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Sections 301.451-301.555, the Board has jurisdiction over this matter.
- 2. Notice was served in accordance with law.
- 3. The evidence received is sufficient cause pursuant to Sections 301.452(b)(3) & 301.4535(a)(7), Texas Occupations Code, to take disciplinary action against Vocational Nurse License Number 187419, heretofore issued to SHANIQUA TENNILLE THOMPSON.
- 4. Pursuant to Section 301.463(d), Texas Occupations Code, this Agreed Order is a settlement agreement under Rule 408, Texas Rules of Evidence, in civil or criminal litigation.

TERMS OF ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED and ORDERED that the VOLUNTARY SURRENDER of Vocational Nurse License Number 187419 is accepted by the Texas Board of Nursing. In connection with this acceptance, the Board imposes the following conditions:

- 1. RESPONDENT SHALL NOT practice vocational nursing, use the title "vocational nurse" or the abbreviation "LVN" or wear any insignia identifying herself/himself as a vocational nurse or use any designation which, directly or indirectly, would lead any person to believe that RESPONDENT is a vocational nurse during the period in which the license is surrendered.
- 2. Pursuant to Tex. Occ. Code section 301.4535(c), RESPONDENT SHALL NOT petition for reinstatement of licensure until at least five (5) years from the date the Respondent successfully completes and is dismissed from community supervision or parole has elapsed.

3. Upon petitioning for reinstatement, RESPONDENT SHALL satisfy all then existing requirements for relicensure.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that this Order SHALL be applicable to Respondent's nurse licensure compact privileges, if any, to practice nursing in the State of Texas.
