On this day the Texas Board of Nursing, hereinafter referred to as the Board, considers the matter of KATRINA JO OLIVER, Registered Nurse License Number 917625, hereinafter referred to as Respondent.

Information received by the Board produced evidence that Respondent may be subject to discipline pursuant to Section 301.452(b) (10)&(13), Texas Occupations Code.

Respondent waived notice and hearing and agreed to the entry of this Agreed Order approved by Katherine A. Thomas, MN, RN, FAAN, Executive Director, on July 9, 2021.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Prior to the institution of Agency proceedings, notice of the matters specified below in these Findings of Fact was served on Respondent, and Respondent was given an opportunity to show compliance with all requirements of the law for retention of the license(s).
2. Respondent waived notice and hearing, and agreed to the entry of this Agreed Order.
3. Respondent's license to practice as a professional nurse in the State of Texas is in current status.
4. Respondent received an Associate Degree in Nursing from Midway College, Midway, Kentucky, on May 1, 1978. Respondent was licensed to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas on February 16, 2017.

6. At the time of the initial incident, Respondent was employed as a Registered Nurse with Encompass Health Home Health, Houston, Texas, and had been in that position for three (3) months.
7. On or about February 13, 2019 and April 15, 2019, while employed as a Registered Nurse with Encompass Health Home Health, Houston, Texas Respondent failed to ensure staff she was administratively responsible for performed weekly wound measurements for Patient HOU00011549701 from February 4, 2019 through April 15, 2019. Respondent's conduct resulted in an incomplete medical record with potential to cause harm to patient from clinical decisions based on incomplete assessment information.
8. On or about February 17, 2019, March 17, 2019, and March 27 2019, while employed as Registered Nurse with Encompass Home Health, Houston, Texas, Respondent failed to perform weekly wound measurements for Patient HOU00011549701 during her visits. Respondent's conduct resulted in an incomplete medical record with potential to cause harm to patient from clinical decisions based on incomplete assessment information.
9. On or about January 29, 2019 through March 27, 2019, while employed as a Registered Nurse with Encompass Health Home Health, Houston, Texas, Respondent failed to address a diagnosis of Congestive Heart Failure (CHF) on the initial plan of care, at the resumption of care, and/or the recertification plan of care for Patient HOU00011549701. The omission of CHF in the patient's plan of care put patient at risk for ineffective treatment and complications including of CHF including fluid overload, electrolyte abnormalities and/or respiratory complications.
10. In response to the Findings of Fact Numbers Seven (7) and Eight (8), Respondent states she failed to ensure the LVN staff was performing wound measurements and she failed to measure the leg wounds of Patient HOU00011549701 during her visits. In response to Finding of Fact Number Nine (9), Respondent states the patient only had a single episode of congestive heart failure (CHF) and she does not remember the patient having any symptoms of CHF.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Sections 301.451-301.555, the Board has jurisdiction over this matter.

2. Notice was served in accordance with law.
3. The evidence received is sufficient to prove violation(s) of 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.11 (1)(A),(1)(B),(1)(C),(1)(D),(1)(M)&(1)(U) and 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.12 (1A),(1)(B),(1)(C),(1)(F)&(4).
4. The evidence received is sufficient cause pursuant to Section 301.452(b)(10)&(13), Texas Occupations Code, to take disciplinary action against Registered Nurse License Number 917625, heretofore issued to KATRINA JO OLIVER.
5. Pursuant to Section 301.463(d), Texas Occupations Code, this Agreed Order is a settlement agreement under Rule 408, Texas Rules of Evidence, in civil or criminal litigation.

TERMS OF ORDER

I. SANCTION AND APPLICABILITY

IT IS THEREFORE AGREED and ORDERED that RESPONDENT SHALL receive the sanction of **REPRIMAND WITH STIPULATIONS** and RESPONDENT'S license(s), and any privilege(s) to practice, as applicable, shall be placed in **INACTIVE** status.

Should RESPONDENT decide in the future to reactivate his/her license(s) to practice nursing in the State of Texas, RESPONDENT SHALL be required to petition the Board for reactivation of the license and satisfy all then existing requirements for reactivation. Further, RESPONDENT'S reactivated license(s) SHALL BE subject to, at a minimum, the remedial education courses, work restrictions, supervised practice, and employer reporting which would have been requirements of this Order had RESPONDENT not chosen to inactivate his/her nursing license(s).

Until such time that RESPONDENT'S license(s) to practice nursing in the State of Texas is/are reactivated, RESPONDENT SHALL NOT use a Privilege to Practice Nursing in the State of Texas from any Nurse License Compact member state.

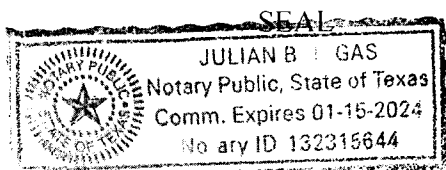
RESPONDENT'S CERTIFICATION
