The Committee finds that after proper and timely Notice regarding the violations alleged in the Formal Charges was given to Respondent in this matter, Respondent has failed to appear in accordance with 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE Ch. 213.

The Committee finds that the Board is authorized to enter a default order pursuant to Texas Government Code § 2001.056.

licensure compact privileges, if any, to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

FORMAL CHARGES

This is a disciplinary proceeding under Section 301.452(b), Texas Occupations Code. Respondent, HALLEY ELIZABETH WALLACE, is a Registered Nurse holding license number 860958, which is in delinquent status at the time of this pleading.

Written notice of the facts and conduct alleged to warrant adverse licensure action was sent to Respondent at Respondent's address of record, and Respondent was given opportunity to show compliance with all requirements of the law for retention of the license prior to commencement of this proceeding.

CHARGE I.

On or about December 23, 2021, Respondent failed to successfully complete a Board-approved course in Texas nursing jurisprudence and ethics, as required by the Confidential Eligibility Agreed Order for Peer Assistance Program issued to Respondent on December 22, 2020.

The above action constitutes grounds for disciplinary action in accordance with Section 301.452(b)(1)&(10), Texas Occupations Code, and is a violation of 22 Tex. ADMIN. CODE \$217.12(11)(B).

CHARGE II.

On January 12, 2023, Respondent pled guilty to POSSESSION OF A CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE, a State Jail Felony offense committed on March 15, 2022, in the 145th Judicial District Court of Nacogdoches County, Texas, under Cause No. F2226446. As a result of the plea the proceedings against Respondent were deferred without entering an adjudication of guilt and Respondent was placed on probation for a period of five (5) years and ordered to pay a fine and court costs.

The above action constitutes grounds for disciplinary action in accordance with Section 301.452(b)(3), Texas Occupations Code.

CHARGE III.

On January 12, 2023, Respondent pled guilty to POSSESSION OF A CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE, a third degree felony offense committed on March 15, 2022, in the 145th Judicial District Court of Nacogdoches County, Texas, under Cause No. F2226447. As a result of the plea the proceedings against Respondent were deferred without entering an adjudication of guilt and Respondent was placed on probation for a period of five (5) years and ordered to pay a fine and court costs.

The above action constitutes grounds for disciplinary action in accordance with Section 301.452(b)(3), Texas Occupations Code.

NOTICE IS GIVEN that staff will present evidence in support of the recommended disposition of up to, and including, revocation of Respondent's license(s) and/or privilege(s) to practice nursing in the State of Texas pursuant to the Nursing Practice Act, Chapter 301, Texas Occupations Code and the Board's rules, 22 Tex. ADMIN. CODE §§ 213.27 - 213.33 and Tex. OCC. CODE Ch. 53.

NOTICE IS GIVEN that all statutes and rules cited in these Charges are incorporated as part of this pleading and can be found at the Board's website, www.bon.texas.gov.

NOTICE IS GIVEN that, based on the Formal Charges, the Board will rely on adopted Disciplinary Guidelines for Criminal Conduct, and on adopted policies related to Substance Use Disorders and Other Alcohol and Drug Related Conduct, which can be found under the "Discipline & Complaints; Board Policies & Guidelines" section of the Board's website, www.bon.texas.gov.

On this day the Texas Board of Nursing, hereinafter referred to as the Board, considered the matter of Registered Nurse License Number 860958 and the Timely RN License Renewal application, hereinafter referred to as the Application, and supporting documents filed by HALLEY ELIZABETH WALLACE, hereinafter referred to as Applicant, requesting a determination of eligibility for licensure renewal in compliance with Sections 301.252, 301.257 and 301.260, Texas Occupations Code, together with any documents and information gathered by staff and Applicant's Certification contained herein.

Information received by the Board produced evidence that Applicant may be ineligible for licensure renewal pursuant to Sections 301.452(b)(12) and 301.453, Texas Occupations Code.

Applicant waived notice and hearing and agreed to the entry of this Agreed Order approved by Katherine A. Thomas, MN, RN, FAAN, Executive Director, on August 18, 2020.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. On or about March 30, 2020, Applicant submitted the Application requesting a determination of eligibility for licensure renewal.
- 2. Prior to the institution of Agency proceedings, notice of the matters specified below in these Findings of Fact was served on Applicant and Applicant was given an opportunity to show compliance with all requirements of the law for retention of the license(s).
- 3. Applicant waived notice and hearing, and agreed to the entry of this Confidential Agreed Order.

- 4. Applicant's license to practice as a professional nurse in the State of Texas is in delinquent status.
- 5. Applicant received a Baccalaureate Degree in Nursing from Stephen F. Austin State University, Nacogdoches, Texas, on May 10, 2014. Applicant was licensed to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas on July 15, 2014.
- 6. Applicant completed the Application and answered Yes to the question which reads as follows: "Within the past five (5) years have you been addicted to and/or treated for the use of alcohol or any other drug?"
 - Applicant disclosed that for over 16 years, Applicant has used Hydrocodone and progressed to also using the following: Xanax, Prozac, Tramadol, Lortab, Oxycodone, and Methamphetamines.
- 7. In response to Findings of Fact Number Six (6) Applicant states since 2002, after she suffered a serious injury to her spine, she had been taking prescription Hydrocodone. During college, she was prescribed large amounts of narcotics (Xanax, Hydrocodone, and Prozac). After moving to Houston, she could not find a doctor that prescribed medications at her previous level and so she began obtaining medications outside the physician-pharmacy system. She continued to use narcotic pain killers for a few years and was able to stop for a couple of years; however, she had reoccurring back pain from the previous back injury and ongoing issues, and soon started back on Hydrocodone. As her life became unmanageable and due to the strain on her family and their finances, she began using Methamphetamine off and on. Applicant states she has tried to quit everything but has relapsed several times.
- 8. The safety of patients and the public requires that all persons licensed to practice nursing be fit, sober, and able to consistently practice nursing in autonomous roles under demanding and stressful conditions.
- 9. The Executive Director considered evidence of Applicant's past behavior in light of the factors set out in 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §213.27 and determined that Applicant currently demonstrates the criteria required for licensure.
- 10. The Executive Director considered evidence of Applicant's substance use disorder, and subsequent rehabilitation as provided in 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §213.29 and in accordance with 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §213.33.
- 11. Applicant's compliance with the terms of a Board approved peer assistance program should be sufficient to protect patients and the public.
- 12. The Executive Director's review of the grounds for potential ineligibility has been made on the basis of Applicant's disclosures.

- 13. Applicant has been advised by the Board that any information found to be incomplete, incorrect or misleading to the Board or a subsequent discovery of a basis of ineligibility will be considered by the Board and may result in an ultimate determination of ineligibility or the later revocation of a license obtained through fraud or deceit.
- 14. Applicant shall immediately notify the Board of any fact or event that could constitute a ground of ineligibility for licensure under Section 301.452(b), Texas Occupations Code.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. Pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Sections 301.451-301.555, the Board has jurisdiction over this matter.
- 2. On or about March 30, 2020, Applicant submitted the Application requesting a determination of eligibility for licensure renewal.
- 3. Applicant's history reflects conduct which may constitute grounds for denial of license renewal under Section 301.452(b)(12), Texas Occupations Code.
- 4. The Board may probate the denial of a license renewal under conditions for a specified term pursuant to Section 301.453, Texas Occupations Code.
- 5. The Board may license an individual who has a history of substance use disorder after consideration of the criteria set out in 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §213.29 if the Board determines the individual does not pose a direct threat to the health and safety of patients or the public.
- 6. The Board may license an individual upon evaluation of the factors in 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §213.27, and pursuant to 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §213.33, if the Board is satisfied that the individual is able to consistently conform her conduct to the requirements of the Nursing Practice Act, the Board's Rules and Regulations, and generally accepted standards of nursing practice.
- 7. The Board may, in its discretion, order a nurse to participate in a peer assistance program approved by the Board if the nurse would otherwise have been eligible for referral to peer assistance pursuant to Section 301.410, Texas Occupations Code.
- 8. This Order is conditioned upon the accuracy and completeness of Applicant's disclosures. Any subsequently discovered discrepancies will result in investigation and possible disciplinary action, up to revocation of Applicant's license(s).
- 9. Pursuant to Section 301.463(d), Texas Occupations Code, this Agreed Order is a settlement agreement under Rule 408. Texas Rules of Evidence, in civil or criminal litigation.

TERMS OF ORDER

I. RENEWAL OF LICENSURE AND APPLICABILITY

IT IS THEREFORE AGREED and ORDERED, subject to ratification by the Texas Board of Nursing, that the Application of HALLEY ELIZABETH WALLACE for Renewal of License to practice nursing in the State of Texas be **GRANTED** according to the terms of this Order.

- A. This Order SHALL apply to any and all future licenses issued to APPLICANT to practice nursing in the State of Texas.
- B. This Order SHALL be applicable to APPLICANT'S nurse licensure compact privileges, if any, to practice nursing in the State of Texas.
- C. As a result of this Order, APPLICANT'S license(s) will be designated "single state" and APPLICANT may not work outside the State of Texas in another nurse licensure compact party state using a Texas compact license.

II. COMPLIANCE WITH LAW

While under the terms of this Order, APPLICANT agrees to comply in all respects with the Nursing Practice Act, Texas Occupations Code, §§301.001 et seq., the Rules and Regulations Relating to Nursing Education, Licensure and Practice, 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §§211.1 et seq., and this Agreed Order.

III. PEER ASSISTANCE PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that APPLICANT SHALL comply with the following conditions for such a time as is required for APPLICANT to successfully complete the Texas Peer Assistance Program for Nurses (TPAPN):

A. Within forty-five (45) days following the date of renewal, APPLICANT SHALL apply to TPAPN.

- B. Within ninety (90) days following the date of renewal, APPLICANT SHALL sign and execute the TPAPN participation agreement and complete the enrollment process, which SHALL include payment of a non-refundable participation fee payable to TPAPN in the amount of five hundred dollars (\$500.00), if licensed as a registered nurse, or in the amount of three hundred fifty dollars (\$350.00), if licensed as a vocational nurse.
- C. Upon acceptance into the TPAPN, APPLICANT SHALL waive confidentiality and provide a copy of the executed TPAPN participation agreement to the Texas Board of Nursing.
- D. APPLICANT SHALL <u>comply</u> with all <u>requirements</u> of the <u>TPAPN</u> <u>participation agreement</u> during its term and SHALL keep all applicable license(s) to practice nursing in the State of Texas in current status.
- E. APPLICANT SHALL CAUSE the TPAPN to notify the Texas Board of Nursing of any violation of the TPAPN participation agreement.

IV. REMEDIAL EDUCATION COURSE(S)

In addition to any continuing education requirements the Board may require for licensure renewal, APPLICANT SHALL successfully complete the following remedial education course(s) within one (1) year of the effective date of this Order, unless otherwise specifically indicated:

A Board-approved course in Texas nursing jurisprudence and ethics that shall be a minimum of six (6) hours in length. The course's content shall include the Nursing Practice Act, standards of practice, documentation of care, principles of nursing ethics, confidentiality, professional boundaries, and the Board's Disciplinary Sanction Policies regarding: Sexual Misconduct; Fraud, Theft, and Deception; Nurses with Substance Abuse, Misuse, Substance Dependency, or other Substance Use Disorder; and Lying and Falsification. Courses focusing on malpractice issues will not be accepted. Home study and video programs will not be approved.

In order to receive credit for completion of this/these course(s), APPLICANT SHALL CAUSE the instructor to submit a Verification of Course Completion form or SHALL submit the continuing education certificate, as applicable, to the attention of Monitoring at the Board's office. APPLICANT SHALL first obtain Board approval of any course prior to enrollment if the course is <u>not</u> being offered by a pre-approved provider. *Information*

about Board-approved courses and Verification of Course Completion forms are available from the Board at www.bon.texas.gov/compliance.

V. CONFIDENTIALITY REQUIREMENTS

While APPLICANT remains in compliance with the terms of this Order, this Order shall remain confidential in accordance with the authority outlined in Section 301.466(d), Texas Occupations Code. However, should APPLICANT fail to successfully complete the terms of this Order or should APPLICANT commit a subsequent violation of the Nursing Practice Act or Board Rules, this Order shall be treated as prior disciplinary action and will become public information.

VI. EFFECT OF NONCOMPLIANCE

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SHOULD APPLICANT fail to comply with this Order or the terms of the participation agreement with the TPAPN, such noncompliance will result in further disciplinary action including TEMPORARY SUSPENSION pursuant to Section 301.4551, Texas Occupations Code, or REVOCATION of APPLICANT'S license(s) and/or nurse licensure compact privileges, if any, to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

VII. RESTORATION OF UNENCUMBERED LICENSE(S)

Upon full compliance with the terms of this Agreed Order, all encumbrances will be removed from APPLICANT'S license(s) and/or privilege(s) to practice nursing in the State of Texas and, subject to meeting all existing eligibility requirements in Texas Occupations Code Chapter 304, Article III, APPLICANT may be eligible for nurse licensure compact privileges, if any.

APPLICANT'S CERTIFICATION

I understand this Order is conditioned upon the accuracy and completeness of my application and disclosures. I further understand that subsequently discovered discrepancies in my application and/or disclosures will result in investigation and possible disciplinary action, up to revocation of my license(s).

I have reviewed this Order. I understand that I have the right to legal counsel prior to signing this Order. By my signature on this Order, I agree to the Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, Order, and any conditions of said Order.

I do acknowledge possessing a diagnosis that deems me eligible to participate in the Texas Peer Assistance Program for Nurses. I waive judicial review of this Order. I understand that this Order is subject to ratification by the Board. When this Order is ratified, the terms of this Order become effective, and a copy will be mailed to me. I agree to inform the Board of any other fact or event that could constitute a ground for denial of licensure prior to reinstating my license(s) to practice nursing in the state of Texas. I understand that if I fail to comply with all terms and conditions of this Order, I will be subject to investigation and disciplinary sanction, including TEMPORARY SUSPENSION pursuant to Section 301.4551, Texas Occupations Code, and/or REVOCATION of my license(s) and/or nurse licensure compact privileges, if any, to practice nursing in the State of Texas, as a consequence of my noncompliance.
