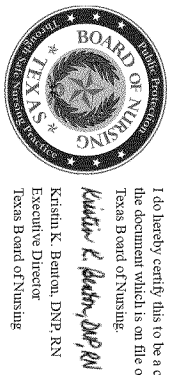

Dear Mr. Gloria:

Information has been received by this office alleging that you represented yourself as a registered nurse in Texas. Specifically:

- You, Dazael Gloria secured employment and practiced as a Registered Nurse (RN) with Reliant Pediatric Therapy Services, Katy, Texas, from August 30, 2022, through October 14, 2022, by using the license number, social security number, date of birth and presented other forms of identification belonging to another nurse with a different first name but same last name. During this time, you, Dazael Gloria provided direct patient care to pediatric patients and represented yourself as a Registered Nurse to staff, patients, families and the public while using the credentials “RN” on medical records.
- You, Dazael Gloria secured employment and practiced as a Registered Nurse (RN) with Special Kids Care, Houston, Texas, from August 24, 2023, through October 23, 2023, by using the license number, social security number, date of birth and presented other forms of identification belonging to another nurse with a different first name but same last name. During this time, you, Dazael Gloria provided direct patient care to pediatric patients and represented yourself as a Registered Nurse to staff, patients, families and the public while using the credentials “RN” on medical and business records.

This office shows no record of a Texas nursing license being issued to you under your current name or Social Security Number. Further, we find no record of you having a current nurse licensure compact privilege to practice nursing in Texas.

You are hereby directed to **CEASE and DESIST** from representing yourself as a nurse and/or from the practice of nursing in Texas. Authorization for this Cease and Desist demand may be found in the Texas Nursing Practice Act, TEX. OCC. CODE, §301.251(a), which states:

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(a) A person may not practice or offer to practice professional or vocational nursing in this state unless the person is licensed as provided by this chapter.

Further, TEX. OCC. CODE §301.251(b)&(d) state:

(b) Unless the person holds a license under this chapter, a person may not use, in connection with the person's name:

(1) the title "Registered Nurse," "Professional Nurse," "Licensed Vocational Nurse," "Vocational Nurse," "Licensed Practical Nurse," "Practical Nurse," or "Graduate Nurse";

(2) the abbreviation "RN," "LVN," "VN," "LPN," or "PN"; or

(3) any other designation tending to imply that the person is a licensed registered nurse or vocational nurse.

(d) Unless the person holds a license under this chapter, a person may not use, in connection with the person's name:

(1) the title "nurse"; or

(2) any designation tending to imply that the person is licensed to provide nursing care.

You are advised that a person commits an offense of at least a Class A misdemeanor for a violation of TEX. OCC. CODE §301.251. In some cases, a felony of the third degree may be charged. Under the authority of TEX. OCC. CODE §301.471, this matter may be reported to a local law enforcement agency or the attorney general for prosecution.

If you possess a valid Texas nursing license or a current nurse license compact privilege to practice nursing in Texas and feel our records are in error, please provide this office with accurate information regarding your licensure status in the State of Texas and/or any other state in the Nurse Licensure Compact that would authorize your practice as a nurse in Texas.

Pursuant to TEX. OCC. CODE §301.471, you have the right to a public hearing before an Administrative Law Judge with the State Office of Administrative Hearings. To request a hearing, please submit a written request to the attention of the Office of General Counsel, 1801 Congress Avenue, Suite 10-200, Austin, Texas, 78701. Your written request for a hearing must be received in our office **before the 11th day after the date this cease and desist demand is served on you, or you will not be entitled to receive a hearing on this matter.**
