We previously provided you with notice that an investigation was being initiated into the following alleged violations of the Nursing Practice Act and/or the Board's Rules and Regulations Relating to Nurse Education, Licensure, and Practice:

- On or about March 15, 2024, and June 15, 2024, you failed to ensure your probation officer submitted quarterly probation reports to the Board's office as required by the Order issued on July 25, 2019.
- On or about May 17, 2024, your probation granted under Cause No. 27481 was revoked for FIVE COUNTS OF DRIVING WHILE INTOXICATED W/CHILD UNDER 15 YOA, all State Jail felony offenses committed on August 12, 2017, and sentenced to confinement in the Institutional Division of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice for a period of twelve (12) months.

We have received information confirming you were physically incarcerated in the Institutional Division of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice beginning approximately July 2, 2024, based on your conviction of FIVE COUNTS OF DRIVING WHILE INTOXICATED W/CHILD UNDER 15 YOA, all State Jail felony offenses, in the 6th District Court, Lamar County, Texas, under Cause No. 27481.

Therefore, pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Chapter 53.021(b), Permanent Vocational Nurse License Number 326486 was revoked, by operation of law, on July 2, 2024, the date that your incarceration commenced.

You are entitled to a formal Complaint, Notice of Hearing, and a hearing in which you may present evidence to show that you are not physically incarcerated or have not been physically incarcerated due to your felony conviction(s) or felony probation revocation. You are also entitled to representation by an attorney if you desire. In the event you are not physically incarcerated or have not been physically incarcerated, your written request for a hearing before the State Office of Administrative Hearings must be received in this office within twenty (20) days of receipt of this letter.

Please be advised that you may not practice as a nurse or engage in any activities that require a license issued by this Board. Should you desire to return to the practice of nursing in Texas, you may contact our office to request a reinstatement petition.

However, you will not be eligible for reinstatement until: at least one (1) year has elapsed from the effective date of your revocation, and you are released from imprisonment. Any reinstatement will then be subject to the regulations in effect at that time.
