Information received by the Board produced evidence that Respondent may be subject to discipline pursuant to Section 301.452(b)(10),(12)&(14), Texas Occupations Code.

Respondent waived notice and hearing and agreed to the entry of this Agreed Order approved by Kristin K. Benton, DNP, RN, Executive Director, on March 16, 2026.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Prior to the institution of Agency proceedings, notice of the matters specified below in these Findings of Fact was served on Respondent and Respondent was given an opportunity to show compliance with all requirements of the law for retention of the license(s).
- 2. Respondent waived notice and hearing, and agreed to the entry of this Agreed Order.
- 3. Respondent's license to practice as a professional nurse in the State of Texas is in current status.
- 4. Respondent received an Associate Degree in Nursing from Charity Delgado College, New Orleans, Louisiana, on December 18, 1997. Respondent was licensed to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas on November 6, 2001.

6. On or about November 2, 2001, Respondent was issued an Agreed Order through an Order of the Board. A copy of the November 2, 2001, Order is attached and incorporated herein by reference as part of this Agreed Order.
7. On or about July 31, 2002, Respondent was issued the sanction of Remedial Education through an Order of the Board. On or about May 12, 2003, Respondent successfully completed the terms of the Order. A copy of the July 31, 2002, Order is attached and incorporated herein by reference as part of this Agreed Order.
8. On or about June 12, 2012, Respondent's license(s) to practice nursing in the State of Texas was/were Suspended with the Suspension stayed and Respondent was placed on probation through an Order of the Board. On or about May 28, 2014, Respondent successfully completed the terms of the Order. A copy of the June 12, 2012, Order is attached and incorporated herein by reference as part of this Agreed Order.
9. On or about May 10, 2022, Respondent was issued the sanction of Warning with Stipulations through an Order of the Board. On or about May 3, 2023, Respondent successfully completed the terms of the Order. A copy of the May 10, 2022, Order is attached and incorporated herein by reference as part of this Agreed Order.
10. At the time of the incident, Respondent was employed as a Registered Nurse with Devotion Hospice, Conroe, Texas, and had been in that position for ten (10) months.
11. On or about March 15, 2024, while employed as a Registered Nurse with Devotion Hospice, Conroe, Texas, Respondent lacked fitness to practice professional nursing, in that she was noted to have garbled, slurred, unintelligible speech and exhibited nonsensical communication. During her scheduled nursing shift, Respondent was arrested by the Conroe Police Department, Conroe, Texas, for DRIVING WHILE INTOXICATED, a class B misdemeanor offense, and POSS CS PG 3 <28G, a class A misdemeanor offense.

These matters are still pending. Respondent's condition could have affected her ability to recognize subtle signs, symptoms or changes in patients' conditions, and could have affected her ability to make rational, accurate, and appropriate assessments, judgments, and decisions regarding patient care, thereby placing the patients in potential danger.

12. In response to Finding of Fact Number Eleven (11), Respondent states on March 14, 2024, she was arrested for suspicion of driving under the influence (DUI). Respondent states prior to this incident, she was experiencing struggles in her personal life and on the date in question, she went to her home, took medications that she states she has no memory taking. Respondent states she takes full responsibility for her actions and states she has moved out to Florida to recover. Respondent states she has been working with Montgomery County serving her probation remotely.
13. Formal Charges were filed on November 21, 2024.
14. Respondent by her signature expresses her desire to voluntarily surrender the license(s).

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Sections 301.451-301.555, the Board has jurisdiction over this matter.
2. Notice was served in accordance with law.
3. The evidence received is sufficient to prove violation(s) of 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.11(1)(A),(1)(B)&(1)(T) and 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(1)(A),(1)(B),(1)(E),(4)&(5).
4. The evidence received is sufficient cause pursuant to Section 301.452(b)(10),(12)&(14), Texas Occupations Code, to take disciplinary action against Registered Nurse License Number 682403, heretofore issued to AMANDA JAIN MOSSMAN-BONNETTE.
5. Pursuant to Section 301.463(d), Texas Occupations Code, this Agreed Order is a settlement agreement under Rule 408, Texas Rules of Evidence, in civil or criminal litigation.

TERMS OF ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED and ORDERED that the VOLUNTARY SURRENDER of Registered Nurse License Number 682403 is accepted by the Texas Board of Nursing. In connection with this acceptance, the Board imposes the following conditions:

1. RESPONDENT SHALL NOT practice professional/registered nursing, use the title "registered nurse" or the abbreviation "RN" or wear any insignia identifying herself/himself as a registered nurse or use any designation which, directly or indirectly, would lead any person to believe that RESPONDENT is a registered nurse during the period in which the license is surrendered.

2. RESPONDENT SHALL NOT petition for reinstatement of licensure until:
 - A. At least one (1) year has elapsed from the date of this Order; and
 - B. RESPONDENT has objective, verifiable proof of twelve (12) consecutive months of sobriety immediately preceding the petition.

3. Upon petitioning for reinstatement, RESPONDENT SHALL satisfy all then existing requirements for relicensure.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that this Order SHALL be applicable to Respondent's nurse licensure compact privileges, if any, to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

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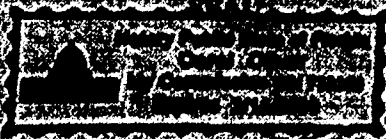



On this day the Texas Board of Nursing, hereinafter referred to as the Board, considered the matter of AMANDA JAIN MOSSMAN-BONNETTE, Registered Nurse License Number 682403, hereinafter referred to as Respondent.

Information received by the Board produced evidence that Respondent may have violated Section 301.452(b)(8)&(10), Texas Occupations Code. Respondent waived informal proceedings, notice and hearing, and agreed to the entry of this Order offered on April 4, 2012, by Katherine A. Thomas, MN, RN, FAAN, Executive Director, subject to ratification by the Board.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Prior to the institution of Agency proceedings, notice of the matters specified below in these Findings of Fact was served on Respondent and Respondent was given an opportunity to show compliance with all requirements of the law for retention of the license(s).
2. Respondent waived representation by counsel, informal proceedings, notice and hearing, and agreed to the entry of this Order.
3. Respondent maintains a license to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas, which is in delinquent status.
4. Respondent received an Associate Degree in Nursing from Charity Delgado College, New Orleans, Louisiana, on February 10, 1998. Respondent was licensed to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas on November 6, 2001.
5. Respondent's nursing employment history is unknown.
6. On or about November 14, 2011, Respondent's license to practice professional nursing in the State of Arizona was issued a CONSENT AGREEMENT AND ORDER by the Arizona

State Board of Nursing, Phoenix, Arizona. A copy of the Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order dated November 14, 2011, is attached and incorporated by reference as part of this Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Sections 301.451-301.555, the Board has jurisdiction over this matter.
2. Notice was served in accordance with law.
3. The evidence received is sufficient to prove violation of Section 301.452(b)(8)&(10), Texas Occupations Code.
4. The evidence received is sufficient cause pursuant to Section 301.452(b), Texas Occupations Code, to take disciplinary action against Registered License Number 682403, heretofore issued to AMANDA JAIN MOSSMAN-BONNETTE, including revocation of Respondent's license(s) to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE AGREED and ORDERED, subject to ratification by the Texas Board of Nursing, that Registered Nurse License Number 682403, previously issued to AMANDA JAIN MOSSMAN-BONNETTE, to practice professional nursing in Texas is hereby SUSPENDED for a period of one (1) year, with the suspension STAYED and Respondent is hereby placed on PROBATION for one (1) year with the following agreed terms of probation:

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that, while under the terms of this Order, this Order SHALL apply to any and all future licenses issued to Respondent to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that this Order SHALL be applicable to Respondent's nurse licensure compact privileges, if any, to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that while Respondent's license(s) is/are

encumbered by this order the Respondent may not work outside the State of Texas pursuant to a nurse licensure compact privilege without the written permission of the Texas Board of Nursing and the Board of Nursing in the party state where Respondent wishes to work.

(1) RESPONDENT SHALL comply in all respects with the Nursing Practice Act, Texas Occupations Code, §§301.001 *et seq.*, the Rules and Regulations Relating to Nurse Education, Licensure and Practice, 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §211.1 *et seq.* and this Order.

(2) RESPONDENT SHALL, within one (1) year of the entry of this Order, successfully complete a course in Texas nursing jurisprudence and ethics. RESPONDENT SHALL obtain Board approval of the course prior to enrollment only if the course is not being offered by a pre-approved provider. Home study courses and video programs will not be approved. In order for the course to be approved, the target audience shall include nurses. It shall be a minimum of six (6) hours in length. The course's content shall include the Nursing Practice Act, standards of practice, documentation of care, principles of nursing ethics, confidentiality, professional boundaries, and the Board's Disciplinary Sanction Policies regarding: Sexual Misconduct; Fraud, Theft and Deception; Nurses with Substance Abuse, Misuse, Substance Dependency, or other Substance Use Disorder; and Lying and Falsification. Courses focusing on malpractice issues will not be accepted. RESPONDENT SHALL CAUSE the sponsoring institution to submit a Verification of Course Completion form, provided by the Board, to the Office of the Board to verify RESPONDENT'S successful completion of the course. This course shall be taken in addition to any other courses stipulated in this Order, if any, and in addition to any continuing education requirements the Board has for relicensure. *Board-approved courses may be found at the following Board website address:* <http://www.bon.texas.gov/disciplinaryaction/stipscourses.html>

IT IS FURTHER AGREED, SHOULD RESPONDENT PRACTICE AS A NURSE IN THE STATE OF TEXAS, RESPONDENT WILL PROVIDE DIRECT PATIENT CARE AND PRACTICE IN A HOSPITAL, NURSING HOME, OR OTHER CLINICAL SETTING AND RESPONDENT MUST WORK IN SUCH SETTING A MINIMUM OF SIXTY-FOUR (64) HOURS PER MONTH UNDER THE FOLLOWING PROBATION CONDITIONS FOR ONE (1) YEAR(S) OF EMPLOYMENT. THE LENGTH OF THE PROBATIONARY PERIOD WILL BE EXTENDED UNTIL SUCH TWELVE (12) MONTHS HAVE ELAPSED. PERIODS OF UNEMPLOYMENT OR OF EMPLOYMENT THAT DO NOT REQUIRE THE USE OF A REGISTERED NURSE (RN) OR A VOCATIONAL NURSE (LVN) LICENSE, AS APPROPRIATE, WILL NOT APPLY TO THIS STIPULATION PERIOD:

(3) RESPONDENT SHALL fully comply with all the terms and conditions of the Order of the Board issued to AMANDA JAIN MOSSMAN-BONNETTE on November 14, 2011, by the Arizona Board of Nursing. RESPONDENT SHALL CAUSE the Arizona Board of Nursing to submit quarterly reports, on forms provided by the Texas Board, that AMANDA JAIN MOSSMAN-BONNETTE is in compliance with the Order of the Board, and RESPONDENT SHALL cause the Arizona Board of Nursing to submit written verification of Respondent's successful completion of that Order. Evidence of compliance/completion with the terms of the Order of the Arizona State Board of Nursing will be accepted as evidence of compliance/completion of the terms of this Order issued by the Texas Board of Nursing.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that if during the period of probation, an additional allegation, accusation, or petition is reported or filed against the Respondent's license(s), the probationary period shall not expire and shall automatically be extended until the allegation, accusation, or petition has been acted upon by the Board.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED, that upon full compliance with the terms of this Order, all encumbrances will be removed from RESPONDENT'S license(s) to practice nursing in the State of Texas and RESPONDENT shall be eligible for nurse licensure compact privileges, if any.



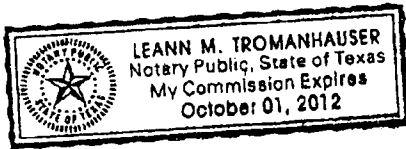

CONSENT AGREEMENT

A complaint charging Amanda Jain Mossman-Bonnette ("Respondent") with violation of the Nurse Practice Act has been received by the Arizona State Board of Nursing ("Board"). In the interest of a prompt and speedy settlement of the above-captioned matter, consistent with the public interest, statutory requirements and the responsibilities of the Board, and pursuant to A.R.S. § 41-1092.07(F)(5), the undersigned parties enter into this Consent Agreement as a final disposition of this matter.

Based on the evidence before it, the Board makes the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent holds Board issued registered nurse license no. RN149990.
2. On or about May 2, 2008, the Board received a complaint from Tucson Heart Hospital in Tucson, Arizona alleging that Respondent had excessive narcotic removals for patients J.S. and J.W.F. from 7:00 p.m. on May 1, 2008 through 7:00 a.m. on May 2, 2008. Although Respondent documented administering narcotics for pain to both patients between 7:00 p.m. on May 1, 2008 and 7:00 a.m. on May 2, 2008, patient J.S. reported he did not receive pain medications during that period of time, and patient J.W.F. did not receive any narcotics from

other nurses after 7:00 a.m. on May 2, 2008. Based upon the complaint, the Board opened an investigation.

3. From on or about January 11, 2008 to in or about June 2010, Respondent was employed as a registered nurse by Arcadia Healthcoare, a staffing agency in Tucson, Arizona. Respondent worked at the Tucson Heart Hospital in Tucson, Arizona through Arcadia Healthcare.

4. Respondent was assigned to care for patient J.S. from 7:00 p.m. on May 1, 2008 to 7:00 a.m. on May 2, 2008. According to the Progress Notes, patient J.S. had severe heartburn and right lower quadrant abdominal and incisional pain throughout the shift. On April, 29, 2008, patient J.S. was ordered Morphine 2 mg to 4 mg IV (intravenous) every hour as needed.

5. From 7:00 p.m. on May 1, 2008 to 7:00 a.m. on May 2, 2008, Respondent documented administering Lortab 5 mg and Morphine Sulfate to patient J.S. according to the level of pain and reassessment of pain as documented in the Pain Flow Sheet. Respondent documented administering Lortab 5 mg at 9:45 p.m., which was removed from the Omnicell at 9:41 p.m. Respondent documented administering 2 mg Morphine Sulfate at 9:13 p.m., which was removed at 9:13 p.m. According to the Omnicell record, Respondent removed two 2 mg Morphine Sulfate at 9:59 p.m. and administered 4 mg Morphine Sulfate at 10:25 p.m. Although the Omnicell record shows Respondent removed Lortab 5 mg at 10:52 p.m. and two 2 mg Morphine Sulfate at 11:34 p.m. on May 1, 2008, there is no documentation in the Pain Flow Sheet that either Lortab or Morphine Sulfate was administered at or about the time the medications were removed from the Omnicell. Respondent removed two 2 mg Morphine Sulfate at 1:07 a.m., 2:47 a.m. and 3:48 a.m. on May 2, 2008 and documented administering them at 1:15 a.m., 3:00 a.m. and 4:00 a.m., respectively.

6. From 7:00 p.m. on May 1, 2008 to 7:00 a.m. on May 2, 2008, Respondent was assigned to care for post operative patient J.W.F., who was intubated. Patient J.W. F. was ordered Morphine Sulphate 2 mg to 4 mg IV (intravenous) every hour as needed. Respondent removed two 2 mg Morphine Sulfate and documented in the Pain Flow Sheet the administration of 4 mg Morphine Sulfate at or about every hour between 8:00 p.m. May 1, 2008 through 6:00 a.m. on May 2, 2009. At 9:13 p.m., Respondent removed a 2 mg dose and documented administering the 4mg dose at 9:00 p.m. Patient J.W.F. did not receive Morphine Sulphate after 7:00 a.m. on May 2, 2008.

7. On May 2, 2008, at the end of Respondent's shift, the narcotic count was correct.

8. On May 2, 2008, Respondent was required to have a for-cause drug screen by her employer Arcadia Healthcare, which was negative.

9. On or about September 18, 2009, the Board received a second complaint from Arcadia Healthcare in Tucson, Arizona alleging that the Northwest Medical Center where Respondent was assigned to work reported that Respondent had unusual patterns of narcotic administration. A review of the Accudose narcotic report and medical records for patients assigned to Respondent revealed narcotic discrepancies in six of ten medical records.

10. On or about July 25, 2009, Respondent removed 2 mg Dilaudid for patient D.E.B. four times between 7:18 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. and documented the administration of 1 mg Dilaudid four times between 7:20 a.m. and 3:20 p.m. The Acudose System reflects 4 mg Dilaudid was witnessed as wasted by another nurse; however, the Acudose record shows there was a delay in the wastage of the Dilaudid. In addition, Respondent administered the 9:55 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. Dilaudid doses two and half hours after the previous dose rather than every three hours as ordered.

11. From 7:00 p.m. July 27, 2009 to 7:00 a.m. July 28, 2009, Respondent removed a total of 14 mg Dilaudid for patient E.M.M. and documented a total of 10 mg administered resulting in 4 mg Dilaudid unaccounted for.

12. On or about August 8, 2009, Respondent removed a total of 6 mg Dilaudid for patient M.G.R. The Acudose report shows 3 mg Dilaudid was witnessed as wasted and Respondent documented administering 1 mg Dilaudid resulting in 2 mg Dilaudid unaccounted for. Although Respondent documented the administration of Ativan 0.5 mg by intravenous push in the Nursing Progress notes at 10:05 p.m., she documented the administration of the Ativan in the Medication Administration Record at 10:35 a.m.

13. On or about August 18, 2009, Respondent failed to document administering two Vicodin to patient R.E.H. that she removed at 8:47 p.m.

14. From 7:00 p.m. on August 19, 2009 to 7:00 a.m. on August 20, 2009, Respondent removed and documented the administration of 28 mg Morphine Sulfate and six tablets of Percocet for patient J.L.R. During the following three shifts, nurses assigned to care for patient J.L.R. in total administered three Percocet tablets and two doses of 2 mg Morphine Sulfate.

15. On or about August 18, 2009, Respondent administered Percocet orally 35 minutes after administering Morphine IV to patient J.L.R., who had adequate pain control from the Morphine, and which is not standard nursing practice. Respondent then repeated the administration of Percocet 35 minutes later.

16. On or about August 21, 2009 and on or about August 22, 2009, Respondent removed two Vicodin each shift for patient N.M.D., but documented the administration of one Vicodin on each shift resulting in one Vicodin unaccounted for on each shift.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Pursuant to A.R.S. §§ 32-1606, 32-1663 and 32-1664, the Board has subject matter and personal jurisdiction in this matter.

The conduct and circumstances described in the Findings of Fact constitute violations of A.R.S. § 32-1663(D) as defined in § 32-1601(16)(d) and (j) (effective May 9, 2002); 32-1601(18)(d) and (j) (effective September 30, 2009); A.A.C. R4-19-403(B)(9) and (31) (effective November 12, 2005); and A.A.C. R4-19-403(1), (7), (9) and (31) (effective January 31, 2009).

The conduct and circumstances described in the Findings of Fact constitute sufficient cause pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-1664(N) to revoke, suspend or take other disciplinary action against Respondent's license to practice as a registered nurse in the State of Arizona.

Respondent admits the Board's Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law.

In lieu of a formal hearing on these issues, Respondent agrees to issuance of the attached Order and waives all rights to a hearing, rehearing, appeal or judicial review relating to the Order except in the limited circumstance(s) specified in Paragraph 16 of this Order. Respondent further waives any and all claims or causes of action, whether known or unknown, that Respondent may have against the State of Arizona, the Board, its members, offices, employees and/or agents arising out of this matter.

Respondent understands that all investigative materials prepared or received by the Board concerning these violations and all notices and pleadings relating thereto may be retained in the Board's file concerning this matter.

Respondent understands that the admissions in the Findings of Fact are conclusive evidence of a violation of the Nurse Practice Act and may be used for purposes of determining sanctions in any future disciplinary matter.

Respondent understands the right to consult legal counsel prior to entering into this Consent Agreement and such consultation has either been obtained or is waived.

Respondent understands that this Consent Agreement is effective upon its acceptance by the Board and by Respondent as evidenced by the respective signatures thereto. Respondent's signature obtained via facsimile shall have the same effect as an original signature. Once signed by Respondent, the Agreement cannot be withdrawn without the Board's approval or by stipulation between Respondent and the Board's designee. The effective date of this Order is the date the Consent Agreement is signed by the Board and by Respondent. If the Consent Agreement is signed on different dates, the later date is the effective date.

ORDER

In view of the above Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and the consent of Respondent, the Board hereby issues the following Order:

- A. Respondent's consent to the terms and conditions of the Order and waiver of public hearing is accepted.
- B. Respondent's license is placed on probation for twelve months. Prior to termination of probation, Respondent shall work as a registered nurse for a minimum of twelve months (not less than sixteen hours a week).
- C. This Order becomes effective upon the Board and Respondent's acceptance of the Consent Agreement. The effective date of this Order is the date the Consent Agreement is signed by the Board and by Respondent. If the Consent agreement is signed on different dates, the later is the effective date. Probation is to commence the effective date of this Order.
- D. If Respondent is noncompliant with any of the terms of the Order, Respondent's noncompliance shall be reviewed by the Board for consideration of possible further discipline on Respondent's nursing license.
- E. If Respondent is convicted of a felony, Respondent's license shall be automatically revoked for a period of five years. Respondent waives any and all rights to a hearing, rehearing or judicial review of any revocation imposed pursuant to this paragraph.
- F. Probation is subject to the following terms and conditions:

TERMS OF PROBATION

1. **Stamping of License**

Within seven days of the effective date of this Order, Respondent shall submit her license to be stamped "PROBATION." While this Order is in effect, if the Board issues any

certificates or licenses authorized by statute, except a nursing assistant certificate, such certificate or license shall also be stamped "probation." Respondent is not eligible for a multistate "Compact" license, however, with written permission from the Texas Board of Nursing, Respondent may practice nursing in the State of Texas utilizing her Arizona nursing license.

2. Drug Testing

Within seven days of the effective date of this Order, Respondent shall enroll in a program that meets Board criteria for random drug testing. Random drug testing shall be done at a minimum of once per month for the first six months of probation, and may be required more frequently as requested by the Board or its designee. Respondent shall notify the drug testing laboratory and the Board, in writing, of unavailability to test before the anticipated absence. If Respondent is unable to submit a specimen on a date requested due to illness, Respondent must provide in writing within seven days of the missed specimen, documentation from a medical provider who has personally seen Respondent on the day of the requested drug test confirming that Respondent was not physically able to report to the laboratory for drug testing. In addition, any occurrence of the following conditions constitutes noncompliance: a positive drug test showing evidence of any drug other than an authorized drug; submission of a specimen where the integrity has been compromised, as indicated by the presence of adulterants; failure to submit to a drug test on a day when a drug test has been requested by either the Board, its designee, or the laboratory; and submission of a urine sample that is below the acceptable volume or temperature to be tested. A positive drug test showing evidence of any drug other than an authorized drug shall result in immediate notification of Respondent's employer by the Board.

3. Abstain From Unauthorized Drug Use/Proof of Prescription

Respondent shall abstain completely from the personal use or possession of controlled substances, as defined in the State Controlled Substances Act, and dangerous drugs as defined by law, or any drugs requiring a prescription.

Orders prohibiting Respondent from personal use or possession of controlled substances or dangerous drugs do not apply to medications lawfully prescribed to Respondent for a bona fide illness or condition by a medical provider. During the duration of this Order, Respondent shall select one medical provider to coordinate her health care needs and to be aware of all prescriptions utilized by Respondent. Respondent shall immediately submit to that provider a copy of this Consent Agreement and Order to include the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and shall execute all release of information form(s) as required by the Board or its designee. The medical provider shall, within one week of the effective date of the consent agreement, inform the Board, in writing, of knowledge of Respondent's Order and provide a list of medications prescribed for Respondent. DURING THE DURATION OF THE CONSENT AGREEMENT, RESPONDENT SHALL CAUSE ALL PROVIDERS TO NOTIFY THE BOARD OF ANY ADDITIONAL MEDICATIONS ORDERED BY THE PROVIDER. THE NOTIFICATION SHALL BE MADE IN WRITING WITHIN ONE WEEK OF THE PROVIDER'S ISSUANCE OF THE PRESCRIPTION.

If Respondent has a lawful prescription for a narcotic or mood-altering drug, Respondent shall cause her prescribing provider to submit monthly reports to the Board by the 30th day of each month regarding the continued need for the prescribed narcotic or mood-altering medications. The Board or its designee may, at any time, request the provider to document the

continued need for prescribed medications. Respondent shall keep a written record of medications taken, including over-the-counter drugs, and produce such record upon request by the Board or its designee.

4. Notification of Practice Settings

Any setting in which Respondent is currently employed which requires nursing licensure, shall be provided with a copy of the entire Order within three days of the effective date of this Order. Any setting in which Respondent accepts new employment, which requires nursing licensure, shall be provided with a copy of the entire Order on or before the date of hire. Within seven days of the effective date of this Order, or within seventy-two hours of Respondent's date of new hire, Respondent shall cause her immediate supervisor to inform the Board, in writing and on employer letterhead, acknowledgment of the supervisor's receipt of a copy of this Consent Agreement and Order and the employer's ability to comply with the conditions of probation.

In the event Respondent is attending a nursing program, Respondent shall provide a copy of the entire Consent Agreement and Order to the Program Director. Respondent shall cause the Program Director to inform the Board, in writing and on school letterhead, acknowledgment of the program's receipt of a copy of the Consent Agreement and Order and the program's ability to comply with the conditions of probation during clinical experiences.

5. Quarterly Reports

Within seven days of each assigned quarterly reporting due date, if Respondent is working in any position which requires nursing licensure Respondent shall cause every employer Respondent has worked for during the quarter to provide to the Board, in writing, employer evaluations on the Board-approved form. The first report is due on the first assigned quarterly

report due date after the effective date of the Order. Receipt of notice of an unsatisfactory employer evaluation, verbal or written warning, counseling or disciplinary action any of which pertain to patient care practice issues, or termination from a place of employment shall be considered as noncompliance with the terms of the Order. In the event Respondent is not working in a position which requires nursing licensure, or attending school during any quarter or portion thereof, Respondent shall provide to the Board, in writing, a self-report describing other employment or activities on the Board-approved form. Failure to provide employer evaluations/or self-reports within seven days of the reporting date shall be considered as noncompliance with the terms of the Order.

6. Practice Under On-Site Supervision

Respondent shall practice as a nurse only under the on-site supervision of a registered nurse in good standing with the Board. *On-site supervision is defined as having a registered nurse in present in the building while Respondent is on duty.* The supervising nurse shall have read this Consent Agreement and Order to include the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and Order, and shall provide input on Respondent's employer evaluations to the Board. The supervising nurse shall be primarily one person, who may periodically delegate to other qualified personnel, who shall also have read this Consent Agreement and Order to include Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law. In the event that the assigned supervising nurse is no longer responsible for the supervision required by this paragraph, Respondent shall cause her new supervising nurse to inform the Board, in writing and on employer letterhead, acknowledgment of the new supervisor's receipt of a copy of this Consent Agreement and Order to include the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and the new

supervising nurse's agreement to comply with the conditions of probation within ten days of assignment of a new supervising nurse.

7. Acceptable Hours of Work

Respondent can work any shift. Respondent may work three 12-hour shifts in one seven day period and four 12-hour shifts in the other seven-day period, but Respondent may not work more than three consecutive 12-hour shifts during this probationary period. Respondent shall not work two consecutive eight hour shifts within a twenty-four hour period or be scheduled to work sixteen hours within a twenty-four hour period.

8. Registry Work Prohibited

Respondent may not work for a nurse's registry, home health, traveling nurse agency, any other temporary employing agencies, float pool, or position that requires on-call status.

9. Out-of-State Practice/Residence

Respondent has permission to complete this Order in the State of Texas. Before any other out-of-state practice or residence can be credited toward fulfillment of these terms and conditions of this agreement, it must first be approved by the Board. If Respondent fails to receive such approval, none of the time spent out-of-state will be credited to the fulfillment of the terms and conditions of this Order.

10. Release of Information Forms

Respondent shall sign all release of information forms as required by the Board or its designee and return them to the Board within ten days of the Board's written request. Failure to provide for the release of information, as required by this paragraph constitutes non-compliance with this Order.

11. Interview With the Board or Its Designee

Respondent shall appear in person or if residing out of state telephonically for interviews with the Board or its designee upon request at various intervals and with reasonable notice.

12. Renewal of License

In the event Respondent's registered nurse license is scheduled to expire while this Order is in effect, Respondent shall apply for renewal of the license, pay the applicable fee, and otherwise maintain qualification to practice nursing in Arizona.

13. Change of Employment/Personal Address/Telephone Number

Respondent shall notify the Board, in writing, within seven days of any change in nursing employment, personal address or telephone number. Changes in nursing employment include the acceptance, resignation or termination or employment.

14. Obey All Laws

Respondent shall obey all laws/rules governing the practice of nursing in this state and obey all federal, state and local criminal laws. Respondent shall report to the Board, within 10 days, any misdemeanor or felony arrest or conviction.

15. Costs

Respondent shall bear all costs of complying with this Order.

16. Violation of Probation

If Respondent is noncompliant with this Order in any respect, the Board or its designee may notify Respondent's employer of the noncompliance. Additionally, the Board may revoke probation and take further disciplinary action for noncompliance with this Order after affording Respondent notice and the opportunity to be heard. If a complaint or petition to revoke

probation is filed against Respondent during probation, the Board shall have continuing jurisdiction until the matter is final, and the period of probation shall be extended until the matter is final.

17. Voluntary Surrender of License

Respondent may, at any time this Order is in effect, voluntarily request surrender of her license.

18. Completion of Probation

Respondent is not eligible for early termination of this Order. Upon successful completion of the terms of probation, Respondent shall request formal review by the Board, and after formal review by the Board, Respondent's nursing license may be fully restored by the appropriate Board action if compliance with this Order has been demonstrated.

On the date entered below, the Board of Nurse Examiners for the State of Texas hereinafter referred to as the Board, considered the Temporary License/Endorsement Application and supporting documents filed by AMANDA JAIN MOSSMAN-BONNETTE, hereinafter referred to as APPLICANT, together with any documents and information gathered by staff and APPLICANT's Certificate contained herein. Information received by the Board produced evidence that APPLICANT may have violated 301.452(b)(8), Texas Occupations Code.

APPLICANT waived representation by counsel, notice and hearing, and agreed to the entry of this Order offered on August 31, 2001, by Katherine A. Thomas, MN, RN, Executive Director.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. On or about August 7, 2001, Applicant submitted a Temporary License/Endorsement Application requesting a determination of eligibility for licensure in compliance with 301.260 *et seq.*, Texas Occupations Code.
2. Applicant waived representation, notice, administrative hearing, and judicial review.
3. Applicant graduated with an Associate Degree in Nursing from Charity School of Nursing, New Orleans, Louisiana, on December 1997.
4. Applicant completed the application for licensure by endorsement and answered "yes" to Question Number Ten (10), which reads as follows: "Have you ever had disciplinary action taken against your license by any licensing/certifying authority in any country, state, province or territory?"

5. On May 16, 2000, Applicant's license to practice professional nursing was placed on probation for one (1) year by the Louisiana State Board of Nursing, Metairie, Louisiana. A copy of the May 16, 2000, Order of the Board is attached and incorporated by reference as part of this Order.
6. On or about May 16, 2001, Applicant fulfilled the provisions of the sanction placed on Applicant's license by the Louisiana State Board of Nursing on May 16, 2000.
7. Applicant presented evidence of current fitness to practice professional nursing.
8. The safety of patients and the public requires that all persons licensed to practice nursing be fit, sober, and able to consistently practice nursing in autonomous roles under demanding and stressful conditions.
9. The Executive Director considered evidence of Applicant's substance abuse and subsequent rehabilitation as provided in §213.29, 22 Texas Administrative Code.
10. Licensure of Applicant poses no direct threat to the health and safety of patients or the public provided Applicant complies with the stipulations outlined in this Order.
11. The Executive Director's review of the grounds for potential ineligibility has been made on the basis of the information provided by Applicant.
12. The Board has determined that the Applicant for licensure who has not been fit and sober for a period of at least five (5) continuous years [sixty (60) continuous months], poses a direct threat to the health and safety of patients and the public and should not be issued an unencumbered license.
13. Applicant has sworn that, with the exception of matters disclosed in connection with the Temporary License/Endorsement Application, her past behavior conforms to the Board's professional character requirements. Applicant presented no evidence of behavior which is inconsistent with the Board's character requirements in 22 Texas Administrative Code §213.27.
14. On August 13, 2001, the Executive Director considered evidence of Applicant's past behavior in light of the character factors set out in 22 Texas Administrative Code §213.27 and determined that Applicant currently demonstrates the criteria required for good professional character.
15. In consideration of Applicant's past conduct and subsequent evidence of rehabilitation, the Executive Director finds that Applicant should be declared conditionally eligible for licensure as a Registered Nurse in Texas.

16. The Board may license an individual with prior behaviors inconsistent with the Board's character requirements if, upon evaluation of the factors in 22 Texas Administrative Code §213.27, the Board is satisfied that the individual is able to consistently conform her conduct to the requirements of the Nursing Practice Act, the Board's Rules and Regulations, and generally accepted standards of nursing practice.
17. Applicant's compliance with the terms of a Board approved peer assistance program should be sufficient to protect patients and the public.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Board of Nurse Examiners has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to Section 301.453 *et seq.*, Texas Occupations Code.
2. Applicant has submitted an application in compliance with Section 301.260 *et seq.*, Texas Occupations Code.
3. Applicant shall immediately notify the Board of any fact or event that could constitute a ground of ineligibility for licensure under Section 301.452 *et seq.*, Texas Occupations Code.
4. The Board of Nurse Examiners may license an individual who has a history of substance abuse, after consideration of the criteria set out in 22 Texas Administrative Code §213.29, the Board determines the Applicant does not currently pose a direct threat to the health and safety of patients or the public.
5. The Board may license an individual with prior behaviors inconsistent with the Board's character requirements if, upon evaluation of the factors in 22 Texas Administrative Code §213.27, the Board is satisfied that the individual is able to consistently conform her conduct to the requirements of the Nursing Practice Act, the Board's Rules and Regulations, and generally accepted standards of nursing practice.
6. The Board may, in its discretion, order a Applicant, upon initial licensure as a registered nurse, to participate in a peer assistance program approved by the Board if the nurse would otherwise have been eligible for referral to peer assistance pursuant to Section 301.410, Texas Occupations Code.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE AGREED that the application of AMANDA JAIN MOSSMAN-BONNETTE, APPLICANT, is hereby conditionally GRANTED and shall be subject to conditions.

(1) APPLICANT shall obtain and read the Texas Nursing Practice Act, and the Rules and Regulations Relating to Professional Nurse Education, Licensure and Practice.

(2) IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that APPLICANT SHALL comply in all respects with the Nursing Practice Act, Revised Civil Statutes of Texas as amended, Texas Occupations Code §§301.001 *et seq.*, the Rules and Regulations Relating to Professional Nurse Education, Licensure and Practice, 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §211.01 *et seq.*, and this Order.

(3) IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that this Order SHALL be applicable to APPLICANT's multistate licensure privilege, if any, to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas.

(4) IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that while APPLICANT's license is encumbered by this Order the APPLICANT may not work outside the State of Texas pursuant to a multistate licensure privilege without the written permission of the State of Texas and the Board of Nursing in the party state where APPLICANT wishes to work.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that APPLICANT, upon initial licensure, SHALL comply with the following conditions for such a time as is required for APPLICANT to successfully complete the Texas Peer Assistance Program for Nurses (TPAPN):

(1) APPLICANT SHALL apply to and be accepted into the TPAPN.

(2) Upon acceptance into the TPAPN, APPLICANT SHALL waive confidentiality and provide a copy of the executed TPAPN contract to the Board of Nurse Examiners.

(3) Upon verification by the Board of APPLICANT's acceptance into TPAPN and APPLICANT's payment of the necessary fees, APPLICANT SHALL be issued a license to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas.

(4) APPLICANT SHALL comply with all requirements of the TPAPN contract during its term.

(5) APPLICANT SHALL CAUSE the TPAPN to notify the Board of Nurse Examiners of any violation of the TPAPN contract.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED, SHOULD APPLICANT fail to comply with this Order or the terms of the participation agreement with the TPAPN, such noncompliance will result in further disciplinary action including revocation of APPLICANT's license to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas.

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APPLICANT'S CERTIFICATION

I am the Applicant in this matter. I have fully and truthfully disclosed all relevant information in conformity with Rule 213.29 at Texas Administrative Code. I certify that my past behavior, except as disclosed in my Temporary License/Endorsement Application, has been in conformity with the Board's professional character rule. I have provided the Board with complete and accurate documentation of my past behavior in violation of the penal law of any jurisdiction which was disposed of through any procedure short of conviction, such as: conditional discharge, deferred adjudication or dismissal. I have no criminal prosecution pending in any jurisdiction.

I understand that if I fail to comply with all terms and conditions of this Order, I will be subject to investigation and disciplinary sanction, including revocation of my license to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas, as a consequence of my noncompliance.

I understand that I can be represented by an attorney in this matter. I waive representation, notice, administrative hearing, and judicial review of this Order and request that the Executive Director of the Board of Nurse Examiners enter this Order.

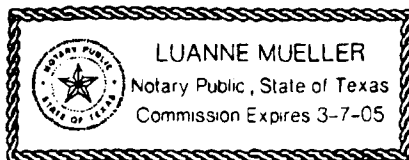

CONSENT ORDER

TERMS AGREED TO BY LICENSEE

I, **Amanda M. Bonnette**, voluntarily agree to sign and have witnessed terms of agreement for the purpose of avoiding formal administrative proceedings with the Louisiana State Board of Nursing.

I, **Amanda M. Bonnette**, do say that I freely, knowingly and voluntarily enter into this agreement. I understand that I have a right to a hearing in this matter and I freely waive such right. I understand that I have a right to legal counsel prior to entering into this agreement. I acknowledge that the Louisiana State Board of Nursing makes the following FINDINGS OF FACT:

1. That on February 23, 1998, Respondent was licensed by examination to practice as a registered nurse in Louisiana.
2. That on November 25, 1999, while employed as a registered nurse at Lakeland Medical Center, New Orleans, LA, Respondent, reported a narcotics discrepancy when she discovered that 12 Xanax were missing from a medication drawer on the unit. All staff on duty at that time were requested to submit to a drug screen. Respondent submitted to a drug screen which tested positive for THC and cocaine.
3. That on November 26, 1999, Respondent went to her Nurse Manager and stated that she felt her drug screen would be positive because she had recently smoked marijuana.
4. That on December 2, 1999, Respondent met in conference with the Consultant for Impaired Professionals to discuss the Recovering Nurse Program. She denied having a drug problem and denied chemical dependency. She declined entry into the program.
5. That on December 12, 1999, Respondent resigned from employment at Lakeland Medical Center in lieu of termination.
6. That on May 3, 2000, Respondent met in conference with Board staff to discuss these allegations.

To facilitate submission of this Consent Order, I do not offer any defense to the **FINDINGS OF FACT**. I agree that the Board has jurisdiction of this matter pursuant to L.R.S. 37:911 et seq. I admit to the findings of fact and I further agree that there is sufficient evidence upon which to predicate a finding of violation of the provisions of L.R.S. 37:921. I agree that the Board may treat the allegations of fact and law as true, which finding shall have the same force and effect as if evidence and argument were presented in support of the allegations and, based thereon, the Board found the allegations to be true. I specifically waive my right to contest these findings in any subsequent proceedings before the Board. I understand that this Consent Order shall constitute a public record and is disciplinary action by the Board. I understand that this will be reported as **Positive Drug Screen**.

In order to avoid further administrative proceedings, I, **Amanda M. Bonnette**, hereby consent to accept and abide by the following **ORDER** of the Board: That Respondent's license be suspended, with a stay of the suspension, and probated for a minimum of twelve (12) months contingent upon adherence to the following stipulations. She shall:

1. Within three (3) days upon signing this Order, send 2000 RN license to the Board office so that the license can be marked "probated".
2. Within sixty (60) days, submit to a comprehensive psychiatric, psychological and substance abuse evaluation by a psychiatrist, clinical psychologist and addictionist who have been approved by the Board; Shall authorize and cause a written report of the said evaluation to be submitted to the Board; Shall include the entire evaluation report including diagnosis, course of treatment, prescribed or recommended treatment, prognosis, and professional opinion as to whether registrant is capable of practicing nursing with reasonable skill and safety to patients.
3. Shall submit a photocopy of all pages of this agreement to the evaluators referenced in the above stipulation.
4. Immediately submit to all treatment, therapy and recommendations of the therapist, physician or treatment team, and cause to have submitted evidence of continued compliance with all recommendations by the respective professional. This stipulation shall continue until the registrant is fully discharged by the respective professionals and until approved by the Board staff.

5. If the evaluations give any treatment recommendations or findings to warrant concern for patient safety, shall meet with Board or Board staff. Must demonstrate, to the satisfaction of the Board, that she poses no danger to the practice of nursing or to the public and that she can safely and competently perform the duties of a registered nurse. If the Board approves licensure, a period of probation, along with supportive conditions or stipulations, will be required to ensure that patients and the public are protected.
6. If found to be chemically dependent, immediately sign an agreement with the Recovering Nurse Program, and cause to have submitted evidence of compliance with all program requirements.
7. Have supervised random drug and alcohol screens done monthly through an approved LSBN laboratory. Additional screenings may be requested by Board staff. Written reports of same shall be submitted to the Board.
8. Shall remain free of alcohol and all unprescribed mood altering substances. Any mood altering, addictive, or dependency-inducing substances must be currently prescribed for a bona-fide medical condition by a physician knowledgeable about the individual's history and the information underlying the Board's concerns. All prescribed drugs must be verified in writing to the Board on a specified form by the individual and the prescribing physicians within five (5) days of this date, and within five (5) dates of any new prescriptions. The Board reserves the right to have a LSBN recognized addictionist review and approve the prescriptions for continued nursing practice.
9. Immediately inform all nursing employers of these disciplinary measures and of the probationary status of her license. Shall cause all employers to submit, in writing to the Board, that they have reviewed this Order. Have all immediate nursing supervisors submit a performance evaluation report quarterly. Quarterly reports are due on or before the first day of January, April, July, and October.
10. Work in a restrictive environment as a member of a treatment team rather than alone or with a few employees. Not be employed in agency/staffing/pool, home health service, or nursing homes. Additionally not be employed in any unsupervised setting. Must be supervised by another registered nurse.
11. Immediately, and within 72 hours, inform the Board in writing of any change in her address.

6. On or about May 16, 2000, Respondent's license to practice professional nursing was placed on probation for one (1) year by the Louisiana State Board of Nursing, Metairie, Louisiana. A copy of the May 16, 2000, Order of the Board is attached and incorporated by reference as part of this Order.
7. On or about September 25, 2000, Respondent submitted to a psychological evaluation performed by Dean A. Hickman, M.D. The evaluator concluded that, "Based on the information available to me at this time, I feel that Ms. Bonnette can return to her nursing duties and practice in a safe and competent fashion. I support the Consent Order, which includes random drug screening through May 2001 and also support the ban on alcohol and all unprescribed mood-altering substances and medication notification through May 2001."
8. On or about May 16, 2001, Respondent successfully completed her probation as ordered by the Louisiana State Board of Nursing.
9. On or about August 7, 2001, Respondent submitted a Temporary License/Endorsement Application requesting a determination of eligibility for licensure in compliance with 301.260 *et seq.*, Texas Occupations Code.
10. On or about November 2, 2001, Respondent was issued an Eligibility Agreed Order by the Board of Nurse Examiners for the State of Texas, granting her licensure to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas, with the condition that she apply to and be accepted into the Texas Peer Assistance Program for Nurses (TPAPN). A copy of the November 2, 2001, Order of the Board is attached and incorporated by reference as a part of this order.

11. On or about December 27, 2001, Respondent attempted to apply with TPAPN and submitted to a chemical dependency evaluation performed by W. Larry Kellen, MA, LCDC. The evaluator concluded that Respondent was not chemically dependent, therefore she would not be appropriate for the TPAPN.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Sections 301.451-301.555, the Board has jurisdiction over this matter.
2. Notice was served in accordance with law.
3. The evidence received is sufficient to prove violation of Section 301.452(b)(8), Texas Occupations Code.
4. The evidence received is sufficient cause pursuant to Section 301.452(b), Texas Occupations Code, to take disciplinary action against License Number 682403, heretofore issued to AMANDA JAIN MOSSMAN-BONNETTE, including revocation of Respondent's professional license to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE AGREED and ORDERED, subject to ratification by the Board of Nurse Examiners, that RESPONDENT SHALL receive the sanction of Remedial Education, and RESPONDENT SHALL comply in all respects with the Nursing Practice Act, Revised Civil Statutes of Texas as amended, Texas Occupations Code, §§301.001 *et seq.*, the Rules and Regulations Relating to Professional Nurse Education, Licensure and Practice, 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §211.01 *et seq.* and this Order.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that this Order SHALL be applicable to Respondent's multistate licensure privilege, if any, to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that while Respondent's license is encumbered by this Order, Respondent may not work outside the State of Texas pursuant to a multistate licensure privilege without the written permission of the State of Texas and the Board of

Nursing in the party state where Respondent wishes to work.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED that:

(1) RESPONDENT SHALL deliver the wallet-size license issued to AMANDA JAIN MOSSMAN-BONNETTE to the office of the Board of Nurse Examiners within ten (10) days of the date of ratification of this Order for appropriate notation.

(2) RESPONDENT SHALL, within one (1) year of entry of this Order, successfully complete a course in nursing jurisprudence. RESPONDENT SHALL obtain Board approval of the course prior to enrollment. Home study courses and video programs will not be approved. In order for the course to be approved, the target audience shall include Registered Nurses. It shall be a minimum of six (6) contact hours in length. The course's content shall include the Nursing Practice Act, standards of practice, and documentation of care. Courses focusing on malpractice issues will not be accepted. RESPONDENT SHALL CAUSE the sponsoring institution to submit a *Verification of Course Completion form, provided by the Board, to the Office of the Board to verify* RESPONDENT's successful completion of the course. This course shall be taken in addition to any other courses stipulated in this Order, if any, and in addition to any continuing education requirements the Board has for relicensure.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED, that upon full compliance with the terms of this Order, RESPONDENT SHALL be issued an unencumbered license and multistate licensure privileges, if any, to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas.

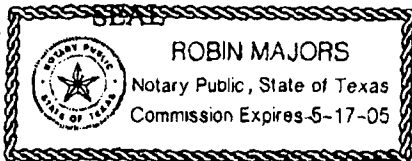



On this day the Texas Board of Nursing, hereinafter referred to as the Board, considered the matter of AMANDA JAIN MOSSMAN-BONNETTE, Registered Nurse License Number 682403, hereinafter referred to as Respondent.

Information received by the Board produced evidence that Respondent may be subject to discipline pursuant to Section 301.452(b)(10)&(13)(effective through 8/31/2021), Texas Occupations Code.

Respondent waived notice and hearing and agreed to the entry of this Agreed Order approved by Katherine A. Thomas, MN, RN, FAAN, Executive Director, on April 8, 2022.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Prior to the institution of Agency proceedings, notice of the matters specified below in these Findings of Fact was served on Respondent and Respondent was given an opportunity to show compliance with all requirements of the law for retention of the license(s).
2. Respondent waived notice and hearing, and agreed to the entry of this Agreed Order.
3. Respondent's license to practice as a professional nurse in the State of Texas is in current status.
4. Respondent received an Associate Degree in Nursing from Charity Delgado College, New Orleans, Louisiana, on December 18, 1997. Respondent was licensed to practice professional nursing in the State of Louisiana on February 23, 1998, and was licensed to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas on November 6, 2001.

6. On or about November 2, 2001, Respondent was issued an Eligibility Agreed Order through an Order of the Board. A copy of the November 2, 2001, Order is attached and incorporated herein by reference as part of this Agreed Order.
7. On or about July 31, 2002, Respondent was issued the sanction of Remedial Education through an Order of the Board. On or about May 12, 2003, Respondent successfully completed the terms of the Order. A copy of the July 31, 2002, Order is attached and incorporated herein by reference as part of this Agreed Order.
8. On or about June 12, 2012, Respondent's license to practice nursing in the State of Texas was Suspended with the Suspension stayed and Respondent was placed on probation through an Order of the Board. On or about May 28, 2014, Respondent successfully completed the terms of the Order. A copy of the June 12, 2012, Order is attached and incorporated herein by reference as part of this Agreed Order.
9. At the time of the incident, Respondent was employed as a Registered Nurse with CHI St. Luke's Health - The Woodlands Hospital, The Woodlands, and had been in that position for two (2) years and eleven (11) months.
10. On or about July 12, 2020, through July 13, 2020, while employed as a Registered Nurse with CHI St. Luke's Health - The Woodlands Hospital, The Woodlands, Texas, Respondent failed to assess and/or document the vital signs, including the oxygen saturation level, of Patient Number 05101524, or ensure that the vital signs were taken by the patient care assistant and entered into the medical record. Vital signs were documented in the medical record at approximately midnight including an abnormal blood pressure of 177/101mmHg, and no further vital signs were documented during the shift. Additionally, continuous pulse oximeter monitoring was not implemented, as ordered. Further, Respondent failed to clarify an as-needed order for hydralazine, which was in place with no parameters, in response to the patient's high blood pressure, or document instructions or verbal orders given regarding use of this medication. Respondent's conduct resulted in an incomplete medical record, and exposed the patient to a risk of harm from undetected and untreated fluctuations in cardiac or respiratory status.
11. In response to the incident in Finding of Fact Number Ten (10), Respondent states that she contacted the nurse practitioner about this patient because he was agitated, and had an elevated blood pressure reading of 177/101. Respondent states that the nurse practitioner ordered a one-time injection of Ativan, which caused the patient's blood pressure to drop to 155/80. Respondent states that the nurse practitioner anticipated this and ordered that the current as-needed blood pressure medications were not to be given unless the patient's systolic blood pressure exceeded 160. Respondent states that pulse oximeters were in short supply and she could not find any on the units, so she notified her charge nurse and supervisor but they were unable to help. Respondent states that she secured a Dinamap with a pulse oximeter which she placed on the patient's index finger; like the telemetry leads, the patient repeatedly took this off and it had to be reapplied. Respondent states that after the Ativan, the patient's vital signs stayed within parameters for the rest of her shift. Respondent adds that she was continuously in and out of the patient's room and he was not in distress at any point during her shift. Respondent adds that she entered several notes and

spent two hours after her shift finishing her notes, and she distinctly remembers that her documented included notes about the patient's blood pressure normalizing, being unable to find a pulse oximeter and reporting this to her supervisors, and notes about her regular monitoring of the patient including his vital signs. Respondent states that she doesn't know why the aide didn't document vitals at 0400 but Respondent says she would have documented it in her own notes.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Sections 301.451-301.555, the Board has jurisdiction over this matter.
2. Notice was served in accordance with law.
1. The evidence received is sufficient to prove violation(s) of 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.11(1)(A),(1)(B),(1)(D)&(1)(M) and 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(1)(A),(1)(B)&(4).
3. The evidence received is sufficient cause pursuant to Section 301.452(b)(10)&(13)(effective through 8/31/2021), Texas Occupations Code, to take disciplinary action against Registered Nurse License Number 682403, heretofore issued to AMANDA JAIN MOSSMAN-BONNETTE.
4. Pursuant to Section 301.463(d), Texas Occupations Code, this Agreed Order is a settlement agreement under Rule 408, Texas Rules of Evidence, in civil or criminal litigation.

TERMS OF ORDER

I. SANCTION AND APPLICABILITY

IT IS THEREFORE AGREED and ORDERED that RESPONDENT SHALL receive the sanction of **WARNING WITH STIPULATIONS** in accordance with the terms of this Order.

- A. This Order SHALL apply to any and all future licenses issued to RESPONDENT to practice nursing in the State of Texas.
- B. This Order SHALL be applicable to RESPONDENT'S nurse licensure compact privileges, if any, to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

- C. As a result of this Order, RESPONDENT'S license(s) will be designated "single state" as applicable and RESPONDENT may not work outside the State of Texas in another nurse licensure compact party state using a Texas compact license.

II. COMPLIANCE WITH LAW

While under the terms of this Order, RESPONDENT agrees to comply in all respects with the Nursing Practice Act, Texas Occupations Code, §§301.001 *et seq.*, the Rules and Regulations Relating to Nursing Education, Licensure and Practice, 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §§211.1 *et seq.*, and this Agreed Order.

III. UNDERSTANDING BOARD ORDERS

Within thirty (30) days of entry of this Order, RESPONDENT must successfully complete the Board's online course, "Understanding Board Orders", which can be accessed on the Board's website from the "Discipline & Complaints" drop-down menu or directly at: <http://www.bon.texas.gov/UnderstandingBoardOrders/index.asp>. Upon successful completion, RESPONDENT must submit the course verification at the conclusion of the course, which automatically transmits the verification to the Board.

IV. REMEDIAL EDUCATION COURSE(S)

In addition to any continuing education requirements the Board may require for licensure renewal, RESPONDENT SHALL successfully complete the following remedial education course(s) within one (1) year of the effective date of this Order, unless otherwise specifically indicated:

- A. A Board-approved course in Texas nursing jurisprudence and ethics that shall be a minimum of six (6) hours in length. The course's content shall include the Nursing Practice Act, standards of practice, documentation of care, principles of nursing ethics, confidentiality, professional boundaries, and the Board's Disciplinary Sanction Policies regarding: Sexual Misconduct; Fraud, Theft, and Deception; Nurses with Substance Abuse, Misuse, Substance Dependency, or other Substance Use Disorder; and Lying and Falsification. Courses focusing on malpractice issues will not be accepted. Home study and video programs will not be approved.

- B. **A Board-approved course in nursing documentation** that shall be a minimum of six (6) hours in length. The course's content shall include: nursing standards related to accurate and complete documentation; legal guidelines for recording; methods and processes of recording; methods of alternative record-keeping; and computerized documentation. Home study courses and video programs will not be approved.
- C. **The course "Sharpening Critical Thinking Skills,"** a 3.6 contact hour online program provided by the National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) Learning Extension.

In order to receive credit for completion of this/these course(s), RESPONDENT SHALL CAUSE the instructor to submit a Verification of Course Completion form or SHALL submit the continuing education certificate, as applicable, to the attention of Monitoring at the Board's office. RESPONDENT SHALL first obtain Board approval of any course prior to enrollment if the course is not being offered by a pre-approved provider. *Information about Board-approved courses and Verification of Course Completion forms are available from the Board at www.bon.texas.gov/compliance.*

V. **EMPLOYMENT REQUIREMENTS**

In order to complete the terms of this Order, RESPONDENT must work as a nurse in the State of Texas, providing direct patient care in a clinical healthcare setting, for a minimum of sixty-four (64) hours per month for four (4) quarterly periods [one (1) year] of employment. This requirement will not be satisfied until four (4) quarterly periods of employment as a nurse have elapsed. Periods of unemployment or of employment that do not require the use of a registered nurse (RN) or a vocational nurse (LVN) license, as appropriate, will not apply to this period and will not count towards completion of this requirement.

- A. **Notifying Present and Future Employers:** RESPONDENT SHALL notify each present employer in nursing and present each with a complete copy of this Order, including all attachments, if any, within five (5) days of receipt of this Order. While under the terms of this Order, RESPONDENT SHALL notify all future employers in nursing and present each with a complete copy of this Order, including all attachments, if any, prior to accepting an offer of employment.
- B. **Notification of Employment Forms:** RESPONDENT SHALL CAUSE each present employer in nursing to submit the Board's "Notification of Employment" form to the Board's office within ten (10) days of receipt of this Order.

RESPONDENT SHALL CAUSE each future employer to submit the Board's "Notification of Employment form" to the Board's office within five (5) days of employment as a nurse.

- C. **Incident Reporting:** While employed as a Registered Nurse Case Manager with Amen Hospice, Spring, Texas, RESPONDENT SHALL CAUSE each employer to immediately submit any and all incident, counseling, variance, unusual occurrence, and medication or other error reports involving RESPONDENT, as well as documentation of any internal investigations regarding action by RESPONDENT, to the attention of Monitoring at the Board's office.

- D. **Indirect Supervision:** Should Respondent's employment as a Registered Nurse Case Manager with Amen Hospice, Spring, Texas, cease or change, the following terms shall apply for the remainder of the Order: RESPONDENT SHALL be supervised by a Registered Nurse, if licensed as a Registered Nurse, or by a Licensed Vocational Nurse or a Registered Nurse, if licensed as a Licensed Vocational Nurse, **who is on the premises.** The supervising nurse is not required to be on the same unit or ward as RESPONDENT, but should be on the facility grounds and readily available to provide assistance and intervention if necessary. The supervising nurse shall have a minimum of two (2) years of experience in the same or similar practice setting to which the RESPONDENT is currently working. RESPONDENT SHALL work only regularly assigned, identified and predetermined unit(s). RESPONDENT SHALL NOT be employed by a nurse registry, temporary nurse employment agency, hospice, or home health agency. RESPONDENT SHALL NOT be self-employed or contract for services. Multiple employers are prohibited.

- E. **Nursing Performance Evaluations:** RESPONDENT SHALL CAUSE each employer to submit, on forms provided to the RESPONDENT by the Board, periodic reports as to RESPONDENT'S capability to practice nursing. These reports shall be completed by the individual who supervises the RESPONDENT and these reports shall be submitted by the supervising individual to the office of the Board at the end of each three (3) month quarterly period for four (4) quarters [one (1) year] of employment as a nurse.

VI. RESTORATION OF UNENCUMBERED LICENSE(S)

Upon full compliance with the terms of this Agreed Order, all encumbrances will be removed from RESPONDENT'S license(s) and/or privilege(s) to practice nursing in the State of Texas and, subject to meeting all existing eligibility requirements in Texas Occupations Code Chapter 304, Article III, RESPONDENT may be eligible for nurse licensure compact privileges, if any.


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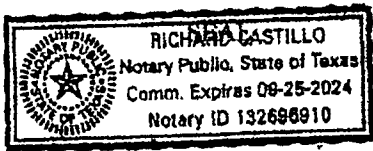
